COVID 19 Case Update

lowa County – The Iowa County Health Department announces that a sixth lab confirmed case of COVID 19 has been identified in an Iowa County resident. This recent case is an individual between the ages of 45 and 65 who is isolated at home. Iowa County Health Department has contact with all confirmed cases and reaches out to those who may have had close contact to each confirmed case. The Health Department assists in actively monitoring their health while they are under quarantine.

Remember that lab confirmed cases only tell part of the story. While positive cases help to represent the disease spread in a community, they do not account for all possible cases. Community spread is considered statewide in Wisconsin, meaning any public interactions put you at greater risk of exposure and getting sick. It is critical that residents understand that if you leave your home you should assume you will come in contact with COVID 19.

Yesterday, Governor Evers directed Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) Secretary-designee Andrea Palm to extend the Safer at Home order from April 24, 2020 to 8 a.m. Tuesday, May 26, 2020, or until a superseding order is issued. The Safer at Home extension includes a few changes-- some allow more businesses and activities to open up, while other changes help make businesses safer for employees and customers. This extension allows time to increase testing capacity, reduces the risk of overwhelming our healthcare system, and minimizes the chance of a second wave of the virus.

There is no effective medicine to treat COVID-19 and no vaccine. We have to work together through interventions like Safer at Home and physical distancing to slow the spread. We know this is challenging. We know this is disruptive. But we need to stick with it a little longer. Safer at Home saves lives.
