#### COVID 19 Update: Cases Continue to Increase

*lowa County* – The Health Department announces three additional cases of COVID 19 bringing the case count in lowa County to 50. Our three recent cases include two individuals between the ages of 26-35 and one person between the ages of 36-45 years. Health Department has contact with all confirmed cases and reaches out to those who may have had close contact to each confirmed case. The Health Department assists in actively monitoring their health while they are under quarantine.

The numbers of individuals testing negative to date is 3,374 and of the fifty positive cases, forty-one are recovered, meaning there are nine active cases. Cases have occurred in multiple zip codes across the county. lowa County status remains at a HIGH activity level along with 59 other Wisconsin counties. Regions and counties are classified as high, medium, or low activity levels for disease spread by combining case burden and trajectory indicators. If you are high risk (60 years and older or have a chronic medical condition or compromised immune status) please take extra precautions to reduce your exposure.

The Health Department strongly recommends residents wear a cloth face covering when out among people. Wearing a cloth face covering is an important step we can all take to protect others from our germs. It is an act of kindness to your neighbors and is strongly recommended. Consider your personal responsibility to not unknowingly spread infection to someone else.
