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<u>AUTHORIZATION AND SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR</u> 2022-2026 TRANSPORATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM

Relating to the County of Iowa's participation in the Wisconsin Department of Transportation 2022-2026 Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP).

WHEREAS, Federal monies are available under the 2022-2026 Transportation Alternatives Program to be used for the construction, planning, and design of on-road and off-road trail facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists, and other non-motorized forms of transportation.

WHEREAS, after due consideration, the lowa County Board has recommended that an application be submitted to the State of Wisconsin for the following project.

CTH T Roadway and Shared-Use Access Path to Birch Lake Community Park, Barneveld, WI and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the lowa County Highway Department to prepare the application to provide federal funding for the cost for design and construction of improvements to CTH T in the Village of Barneveld for providing a shared use path facility (bike-ped path) to the Birch Lake Park and Community Park. The project will also provide roadway improvements to CTH T; and

WHEREAS, the lowa County Highway Department will provide temporary payment for 100% of the cost for the project until it is completed. At that time reimbursement of approximately 60% of the cost, as per an approved agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. The remainder of the cost will be divided proportionally per facilities owned with the Village of Barneveld and Iowa County; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Highway Department will maintain the on-street portions and the Village of Barneveld will provide all maintenance of the path / sidewalk facility, lighting, and crosswalk components after construction, and

WHEREAS, the project will require land acquisitions for highway easement the costs for said acquisitions will be 100% funded by the lowa County Highway Department. The acquisition process will follow all federal requirements; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that design will take place in the years of 2022 and 2023 and construction will commence between the years 2023 - 2024; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Board of Iowa does APPROVE and SUPPORT the project and AUTHORIZE the Highway Commissioner to prepare and file an application for participation in the 2022-2026 Transportation Alternatives Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to sign all necessary documents on behalf of the County; and shall submit a copy of this resolution to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Multi-modal Coordinator for consideration with the TAP grant application.

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Ordinance No. 600.18B

IOWA COUNTY ALL-TERRAIN and UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTE ORDINANCE

SECTION 1.0: INTRODUCTION

1.1 NAME

This Ordinance shall be called the lowa County All-Terrain and Utility-Terrain Vehicle Route Ordinance.

1.2 INTENT

Following due consideration of the recreational and economic value to connect trail opportunities and weighted against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created pursuant to County Board authority under Wis. Stat. ss. 59.02, 23.33(4)(d)3.b., 23.33(11)(a) and (am), and 23.33(8)(b) as amended.

1.3 DEFINITIONS

- A. <u>All-Terrain Vehicle ("ATV")</u> has the meaning specified within Wis. Stat. ss. 340.01 (2g).
- B. <u>ATV/UTV Route</u> shall mean a highway or sidewalk designated for use by all-terrain and utility-terrain vehicle operators by the governmental entity having jurisdiction.
- C. <u>Utility-Terrain Vehicle ("UTV")</u> has the meaning specified within Wis. Stat. ss. 23.33 (1), (ng).

1.4 SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that lowa County would have passed the other provisions of this Ordinance irrespective of whether one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons and circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

1.5 SAVING CLAUSE

This Ordinance shall in no way be deemed to supplant or otherwise invalidate any provision of state statutes relating to the subject matter hereof. Any person entrusted with the enforcement of this Ordinance may; in the exercise of his or her discretion, proceed under applicable state statutes.

SECTION 2.0: ATV/UTV ROUTES AND OPERATION

2.1 RULES OF OPERATION

- A. All ATV/UTVs shall operate only on the paved portion of the roadway. Operation on the gravel shoulders, grassy in-slope, ditches, or other highway right-of-way area is prohibited and illegal.
- B. No ATV/UTV shall be operated at a speed greater than 30 miles per hour (MPH), or the posted speed limit, whichever is lower.
- C. No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route between the hours of 1:00 AM and 5:00 AM daily.
- D. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride in single file on the extreme right hand side of the paved portion of the highway except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway which is safe given prevailing conditions.
- E. All ATV/UTV operators shall have their headlight and taillight illuminated, while operating on a county highway.

F. All operators

- a. of ATV's and UTV's must be 16 years of age or older.
- Of ATV's, who are at least 16 years of age and who are born on or after January 1, 1988 shall possess a valid state-issued ATV/UTV Safety Certificate.
- c. of UTV's who are at least 16 years of age and who are born on or after January
 1, 1988 must possess a valid state-issued Safety Certificate.
- d. of ATV/UTV's and any passengers under 18 years old shall wear protective headgear while operating on route-designated county highways.
- G. Mandatory Use of Seatbelts during operation of a UTV. ALL occupants riding in, or operating a UTV, shall be required to wear a seatbelt when travelling on any trail or route within Iowa County.
- H. Possession of Open Intoxicants in an ATV or UTV while in operation. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess any bottle or receptacle containing alcohol beverages if the bottle or receptacle has been opened, the seal has been broken, or the contents of the receptacle have been partially removed, while operating or as a passenger on an ATV or UTV on any road or road route in lowa County.
- ATV/UTV operation shall be subject to all provisions of WI Stats. S. 23.33, which is adopted as a part of this ordinance by reference.

2.2 SIGNAGE OF ATV ROUTES

A. Routes shall be marked with uniform all-terrain vehicle route signs in accordance with

s. NR 64.12(7), Wisconsin Administrative Code. No person may do any of the following in regard to signs marking ATV/UTV routes:

- Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign.
- 2) Possess any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard of the type established by the department for the warning, instruction or information of the public, unless he or she obtained the uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard in a lawful manner. Possession of a uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.
- B. Every area authorized as being closed to an all-terrain vehicle/utility-terrain vehicle shall be designated by a No all-terrain vehicle/utility-terrain vehicle pictogram sign having a reflectorized black all-terrain vehicle symbol, a red circle with a red line through it, and on a reflectorized white background with a minimum size of 12 inches by 12 inches or a green reflectorized background with a minimum sign size of 24 inches by 18 inches with a white message stating END ATV/UTV ROUTE and a white atv/utv pictogram; where appropriate, placed at the location of the end of an ATV/UTV route or at the closest side road intersection, and such location as to notify the ATV/UTV operators to not drive beyond that point.

G.

- <u>D.C.</u> All required designated route signs shall be paid for by an ATV/UTV club, with approval, installation, and maintenance of the signs by the lowa County Highway Department.
- E.D. The quantity and location of signage shall be reviewed and approved by the Iowa County Highway Commissioner, where appropriate, placed at the beginning of an all-terrain vehicle route within the county and at such locations and intervals deemed necessary to enable the ATV/UTV operators to follow the route.
- F.E. No sign may be mounted on any existing County sign post or telephone post/pole. Posts shall be suitably sized for mounting the necessary amount of signs at the location
- G.F. No person shall operate an ATV/UTV contrary to any authorized and official posted sign.

2.3 DESIGNATION OF ROUTES

All requests for new or revised ATV/UTV route designations shall first be submitted to the lowa County Traffic Safety Commission for review at its November quarterly meeting. The lowa County Traffic Safety Commission shall review such requests for County Trunk Highway (CTH) route designations and make a recommendation to the lowa County Public Works Committee. The Public Works Committee shall review designation of ATV/UTV routes, including appropriate criteria for making a designation, and make a recommendation to the lowa County Board of Supervisors. County highways designated as ATV/UTV routes

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shall be approved by the lowa County Board of Supervisors by amendment of Sec. 2.3 of this Ordinance.

A copy of ATV/UTV routes, along with a map showing their location, shall be kept on file at the Highway Department. The Iowa County Highway Department shall file ATV/UTV routes adopted by this Ordinance with the Department of Natural Resources Conservation Warden for Iowa County and with the Madison, Wisconsin, Office of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

The lowa County Highway Commissioner shall have the authority to temporarily close, suspend operation on, or terminate any ATV/UTV route enacted by this Ordinance for a period up to ninety (90) days due to hazard, safety, construction, or emergency conditions on any highway segment by placement of signage at the locations of the closure. The Highway Commissioner may also for a period of up to (90) ninety days, have the authority to designate any of the above closed segments to be opened for use and utilized for an alternate route. Alternates or closures for duration of greater than ninety (90) days shall be reviewed by the Public Works Committee.

- A. All Iowa County Trunk Highways shall be considered as ATV/UTV routes except as noted in Subsection B herein and posted as otherwise.
- B. The following sections of Iowa County Trunk Highways shall be PROHIBITED from ATV/UTV route usage and will be signed CLOSED to ATV/UTV traffic:
 - a. CTH A from the intersection of Heins Road easterly to USH 151.
 - b. CTH A in the Township of Moscow from Brue Road easterly to Dane County.
 - c. CTH B from Sunny Slope Road westerly to STH 39.
 - d. CTH BH within and from Blackhawk Lake County Park westerly to STH-80 the end of the horizontal curve 1,000 Ft north/east of Fire Number #1907 at the Carter/Bettner Field Entrance.
 - e. CTH C from Fire #6279 driveway at the Spring Valley Inn easterly to and including the STH 14 intersection.
 - f. CTH C from High Point Road westerly to STH 23.
 - g. CTH C from STH 23 westerly to STH 130 in the Townships of Clyde and Wyoming.
 - h. CTH CH from County Farm Road northerly to STH 18.
 - i. CTH D from Sunny Ridge Road southerly to STH 39.
 - j. CTH DD from Pleasant View Road westerly to STH 39.
 - k. CTH E from Cave Road westerly to STH 39.
 - 1. CTH F from CTH A southerly to the Village of Blanchardville limits.
 - m. CTH F from Prairie Grove Road northerly to Dane County.
 - n. CTH H from Twin Court northerly to CTH Y / Dugway Road.
 - CTH H from Fire #7195 Pappas' Trading Post driveway northerly to and including the STH 14 intersection.
 - p. CTH HHH from Strutt Road southeasterly to USH 18/151.
 - q. CTH I in the Township of Clyde from CTH P (South) easterly to STH 130.
 - r. CTH II in the Township of Clyde from Adams Hill Road northerly to CTH I.
 - s. CTH K from Jones Street northerly to USH 18/151.
 - t. CTH K from CTH ID southerly to USH 18/151.
 - u. CTH K from CTH HH north to Mounds Park Road.

The penalty for violating any provision of § 2.2 of this ordinance or §§ 2.3(A) (1) or (2), (D), or (E) shall result in a forfeiture of not more than \$250.00, plus court costs.

SECTION 4.0: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance and subsequent amendments to it shall be effective on the date after publication. Ordinance No. 600.18B was adopted by the lowa County Board of Supervisors on July 16, 2013, and amended at the following sessions of the County Board: April 21, 2015; April 19, 2016; December 20, 2016; December 19, 2017; March 20, 2018; March 19, 2019; December 17, 2019; March 17,2020; March 16, 2021; December XX, 2021.

Storti - resides along one of the highway improvement projects (CTH N) and the department acquired property for right of way, which may be perceived as being a conflict of interest.

Motion from the committee; that the Public Works Committee was notified of and reviewed a Potential Conflict of Interest concern regarding the acquisition of right of way along the CTH N CDBG Close project CL-PF-20-18 from a County Board Supervisor - Sue and Mark Storti - and finds: due to the method of setting a blanket acquisition price for right of way across the county for all highway projects performed during the timeframe; due to timing of the various reviews and approvals by action of the Public Works Committee (of which Sup Storti is a member of); due to the timing of the plan revisions for CTH N resulting in acquisition of right of way at this parcel; and due to the the nominal amount (\$250) of acquisition from the Stortis at this location; it is the opinion of the Public Works Committee that No Conflict of Interest has occurred which may be considered to be in violation of the County Ethics Policy or any State or Federal ethics rules. Corp Counsel and the County Board Chair to notify the State DOA in writing of this determination.

If it is determined there are objections to the process of acquisition of right of way from Sup Storti; Motion to refer the matter to the County Ethics Committee and Corp Counsel for further consideration and review.

- 1 The meeting was called to order at 6:02 P.M. by Chair Sup. Gollon.
- Roll Call. Present: Chair Gollon, Supervisor Butteris, Deal, Masters, and Storti; Others Physically Present: Administrator Bierke, Commissioner Hardy. Others Present via Zoom: None.

Due to questions surrounding the date and time for the next meeting; the Chair asked the committee to consider consent agenda items individually. Masters moved to approve the agenda for tonight's meeting, seconded by Deal. Approved unanimously. Storti moved to approve the minutes or the May 4th meeting, seconded by Butteris. Approved unanimously. Discussion of the date and time for the next meeting being either Monday June 28th or Thursday July 1st. Discussion of the dates being the 28th or 1st amongst committee members. Administrator Bierke asked to be excused as he had a conflict for both meeting dates. Chair established by unanimous consent the next meeting will be on Monday June 28th at 6:00PM, and Administrator Bierke is excused from the meeting.

Comments from the public or committee. Sup. Storti questioned the driveway issue on CTH BB and if what resolved. Hardy commented he had discussed with Corp Counsel and the CTH BB issue was resolved. In addition, the Highway Access Ordinance would be on the next meeting agenda for discussion of revisions.

Revised CTH F – STH 78 to STH 39 Right of Way Relocation Order and Plat. Hardy advised the committee the right of way plat for the CTH F project north portion required revision by the engineer. WisDOT performed a review of the recorded plat and requested some changes to parcel identification numbers due to a conflict with the plat for the southern portion of the project. In lieu of re-drafting the whole plat; Hardy stated he had the engineers change the project number on the plat and re-record. Hardy stated he cannot begin right of way acquisitions until the right of way relocation order and plat are filed with the clerk's office; and the revision is holding up the project currently. Discussion of right of way acquisitions and types of acquiring properties. Chair questioned if the Department sells property back to landowners. Hardy commented if opportunities exist during acquisitions they are discussed, but sometimes not possible. Discussion of Fee Simple, Warranty Deed, and (Permanent, Limited, and Temporary) Easement type of acquisitions. Discussion of Department rights based on each of the acquisition types. Motion by Storti, seconded by Deal to refile the plat and relocation order with the revised project number with the County Clerk. Motion carried unanimously.

Right of way acquisition and vacant parcel sales. Hardy provided a copy of the vacant sales report from the Planning and Zoning department for years 2019-2020 in the Towns of Dodgeville and Moscow. He stated typically the department would set base land offering prices based off of the vacant land sales averages in the township where the project was to be located. As a result of a parcel (Lot 1 Erickson parcel) requiring a mandatory appraisal process with eminent domain; an appraisal was required and was performed which set the base vacant and sale offer at \$10,000/acre. Hardy stated typically the department would set the offering price based on the vacant land sales information, which is \$8200/acre for CTH F and \$9200/acre for CTH II. Committee discussed in fairness to all residents; the vacant

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parcel sales offer for right of way for both the CTH F and CTH II projects should be the same and based on the appraisal for the CTH F acquisition. Motion by Masters, seconded by Deal to set the offering price for vacant land acquisitions for projects at \$10,000/acre. Motion carried unanimously.

Revision to Policy #1116 Encroachments, Work in Right of Way, and Revocable Occupancy Permits to

Revision to Policy #1116 Encroachments, Work in Right of Way, and Revocable Occupancy Permits to address Livestock (cattle) crossings. Hardy stated he had revised the policy based on last month's discussion and review by corp counsel. The policy was revised to include explanations for installation of livestock crossings: at-grade crossings, below-grade crossings, and removal of old, unused, or unsafe crossings by the Department. Question regarding liability for crossings, who could install them, and if landowners have any cost responsibility for removal of the old ones? Hardy commented the liability is with proper design and installation to begin with regarding meeting setbacks and proper slopes and protections within the clear zone and varies by highway classification. Discussion of the private utility agreement which established liability protections and insurance requirements. Removal of old structures are by the department when identified for removal, and typically a smaller drainage pipe is required at the location. So costs for removals of old pipes if not being replaced are not borne by the landowner. Costs for new structures are borne by the landowner through a private utility agreement. Landowners can perform their own installs or hire the work done through a work-in-right-of-way permit and private utility crossing agreement, which provide the requirements for the installation. In addition, the policy was revised to clarify he process for requests for signage by the public. Motion to approve by Storti and seconded by Butteris. Motion carried unanimously.

Revision to the ATV/UTV Ordinance to clarify references to fines and penalties. Hardy stated the Sheriff's Office, Highway Department, and the County WDNR warden had reviewed the ordinance and raised some questions regarding the verbiage for fees and penalties. As a result, corp counsel reviewed the ordinance and made some proposed revisions to clarify which portions of the ordinance were subject to the fines and penalties in the ordinance as some violations were already covered by state statute. Hardy reviewed those provisions with the committee. In addition, hardy stated he was reviewing the ordinance and recommends some amendments to Section 2.3 Designation of Routes for clarity:

A. In Section 2.3B. As a result of WisDOT declining the request to open a portion of STH 191 between CTH BB and Spring Road; add verbiage between c. and d. to close or prohibit atv/utv use of CTH BB between Hands Hill Road and STH 191.

- B. In subsection k change the reference to "Cave Road to Lost Grove Road" and change westerly to easaterly.
- C. In subsection vv, change "Korbeck Road" to "Korback Road".
- D. In Section 2.3C; as a result of the WisDOT decision to deny the request for a route on STH 191 between CTH BB and Spring Road; remove the verbiage adopting such a route in subsection iv.

Motion to approve as amended by Deal, seconded by Butteris. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion of 2022-26 Capital Road and Bridge Project backlog. Hardy provided a listing of projects backlogged for improvement and a listing of 2022 – 26 projects in contract agreement for improvement. Committee discussed project types, costs for improvements, roadway classifications and types of grants different roads are eligible for based on current programs. Discussion of projects which require design engineering services and those which don't. Discussion of an option to offer county roads back to the townships when it makes sense for low volume or low use local roads. Discussion of offering those roads to the towns at replacement – when new; or reprioritizing other roads for improvement first. Discussed process of determining which roads to improve first and what criterion are used. Hardy commented similar to the CTH N CDBG-Close grant for 2021; sometimes the decision is made by the program rules for the funding mechanism, and not necessarily the Worst First philosophy. Discussion of GTA and other cost share programs and funding. Chair commented to committee to review the

Hardy referred to the survey map on page 7 of the agenda packet which outlines the area along the property where there is a gap in the right of way. According to an old 5 street plat from the 1800's the way it sits now is dedicated to be a street. In 1911 BUS Hwy 23 was purchased by the county. At this time Hardy is working with the City of Mineral Point and additional information from WisDOT and Kwik Trip. Kwik Trip is requesting a quitclaim deed. Review and Approve revised Relocation Order and Right of Way Plat for CTH II Bridge and Approaches. Motion to approve by Sup. Butteris, seconded by Masters. Discussion of the relocation order and right of way plat. Hardy referred to the triangle parcel shown on page 12 of the agenda packet. The deeds were recorded when family bought the property back in 1951. When the surveyor went through that area was flagged. There was 2 square feet of right of way which was removed and revised for acquisition. The county has no financial obligation. Highway Commissioner's Report: Hardy provided the following information. The Highway department's asphalt paver is undergoing a major repair. The paver was purchased in 1999 for \$243,294. The estimated replacement value is around \$300,000 to \$350,000. The cost of repairs to date is around \$22,000 with an estimated additional repair cost of \$33,000. At this time we are sorting out what work will be done and requesting estimates. The work can be 10 funded from operations due to selling and being reimbursed for an attenuator to the state. All of the repairs are general maintenance items. Sealcoat road list for 2021 is CTH A (CTH F to Dane County), CTH H (Ridgeway to CTH K), CTH K (STH 39 Hollandale to Lafayette County CTH F), CTH O (Bus 151 to Lafayette County), and CTH Z (STH 191 to CTH YZ).

- A large culvert on CTH NN is planned to be removed and replaced as part of the paving project.
- Work has begun on the 50 foot deep culvert on CTH N, which is about ¾'s of a mile north of the CTH NN intersection. Also, the large concrete box culvert on the north end of the job, which is about ¼ mile south of Wisconsin Avenue intersection will require additional right of way. Committee reviewed and approved the right of way and relocation order for acquisitions. Expected completion date is end of the week.
- There is a total of 26 parcels for the CTH F projects. At this time 14 of the parcels are ironed out and Hardy has been able to meet with all but 2 property owners. We are working with utility companies and ATC to deal with utility poles. We are waiting to hear back from ATC about some utility poles. This project is expected to go to bid in February 2022.
- The Iowa County 2021-2026 state road construction map was discussed.
- Sup. Meyers moved to adjourn the meeting. Sup. Deal seconded the motion. Carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:45 P.M.



Subject: Conflict of Interest Review for Iowa County Project # CDBG-CL-PF-18

Dear Mr. Hardy,

- 1. In my capacity as the Iowa County Corporation Counsel, I have completed the legal review of the potential Conflict of Interest encountered with a property easement acquired for the 2021 Iowa County Highway Improvement Project titled, "Project # CDBG-CL-PF-18 (COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CLOSE) CTH N (CTH NN STH 133 Intersection), Town of Pulaski," with advertisement date of June 14, 2021, and bid deadline date of June 30, 2021, issued by the Iowa County Highway Department. I am of the opinion that no Conflict of Interest exists with the acquisition of the property easements acquired for the project and the solicitation, contract award, and all other administrative and substantive matters related to the award of this acquisition were legally sufficient and complied with all relevant and appropriate statutes, regulations and policies pertaining to the award of the contract. My comments follow.
- 2. It should be noted that this potential Conflict of Interest was not related to the award of the contract for this project, but rather in relation to the acquisition of a property easement acquired in support of the project. Specifically, a property easement obtained from Iowa County Supervisor Ms. Susan M. Storti, and her spouse, Mr. Mark P. Storti. Ms. Storti is a committee member of the Iowa County Public Works Committee, which has oversight and authority over the Iowa County Highway Department. On June 1, 2021, Ms. Storti and her colleagues on the Public Works Committee established the fair market value rate to be paid to Iowa County property owners for easements acquired for highway projects. At that time, it was not expected or anticipated that any highway projects would affect or impact Ms. Storti's property. Specifically, it was not expected nor anticipated that the subject project was going to require the acquisition of any easements in order to complete.
- 3. However, when the final engineering plans were returned to the Highway Department on approximately July 7, 2021, it was determined that the project would require an easement across the Storti's property as well as that of a neighboring landowner. The Highway Department used their normal process for acquiring highway easements from the Storti's as well as their neighbor. The highway easement for the Storti's property was for an easement to access .017 acres (720)



square feet) at a cost of \$250.00 for the County, the minimum payment the County offered landowners for the acquisition of an easement.

- 4. I have reviewed this matter with respect to the Federal government Conflict of Interest laws, rules, and regulations, as well as the state and local Conflict of Interest laws, rules, regulations, and ordinance. At the time Ms. Storti participated in the Public Works Committee vote to establish the fair market value rate of payment for acquiring highway easements, she had no conflict of interest. Specifically, it was not expected or anticipated that any easements would be required for the subject project. Furthermore, Ms. Storti did not have a Conflict of Interest at any time during the acquisition of the highway easement for this project. Ms. Storti did not personally benefit from the fair market value rate established by the Public Works Committee. The Highway Department followed their standard procedures that they use for obtaining highway easements from private landowners. The acquisition of the highway easement across the Storti's property was paid at the County's minimum rate of payment which was independent, and in this case, higher than the rate established by the Public Works Committee. Furthermore, neither Ms. Storti, nor any Public Works Committee members or Highway Department Staff, had any influence or guidance for the engineering firm to include an easement across the Storti's property in the final engineering plans. This was an independent decision by the engineering firm.
- 5. In summary, the awarding of the contracts under this project was legally sufficient. No Conflict of Interest exists with the contract award, the Public Works Committee establishment of the fair market value rate for property easements, or the acquisition of the highway easements for this project. No additional action is required by Ms. Storti, the Highway Department, the Public Works Committee, or the County Board to address this matter. I recommend forwarding this legal opinion to the appropriate point of contact with the Department of Administration Office administering the subject grant.

Land Conservation Department 4th Quarter update

- Groundwater study: no news yet. It will likely be early 2022 before we get a final report. We'll work with the other Counties and research team to plan for public presentations and press, including County Board presentations.
- Birch Lake Dam: The Friends of Birch Lake dredging project is complete and the water level is being returned to normal. We were unable to complete the valve replacement and other repairs due to contractor issues and supply delays. NRCS continues to assist with a new plan to complete the valve repair next year. Land Con. will re-apply for DNR funding and re-bid the project in early 2022

• Cost-share projects:

- Construction is still ongoing for some manure storage closures and stream crossings. If weather cooperates, we will only have a few projects to extend into 2022, which is a goal we've been working toward to reduce the risk of DATCP grant reductions for underspending.
- o In our initial year of offering cost-share for cover crops and no-till we funded about 320 acres for \$7,750 of payments. Landon already has a waiting list for 2022 that will use up our available funding (\$22,500).
- MDV and Targeted Runoff Management (TRM) grant projects are moving forward, although more slowly due to the eligibility limitations and administrative requirements. We continue outreach and partnership efforts to find landowners who are both willing and eligible for these funds.

New grants:

- In 2022 we'll begin a precision agriculture incentive pilot project, funded by a \$22,500 DATCP Innovation Grant, with a goal of engaging 20-30 farmers over 2 years. Farmers will receive \$5/ac to work with conservation staff to look at yield maps and budgets to find any unprofitable areas within their fields (ex: poor soil, too wet, shaded, etc). An additional \$25/acre will be offered if those unprofitable areas are planted to perennial vegetation. This project will benefit both conservation and farm profitability in Iowa County.
- We will hear in February if we are awarded a DNR Surface Water grant to work with UW-Platteville and Extension to measure and compare phosphorus losses on ag fields vs streambanks. In our TRM watershed area we suspect streambank erosion may be a significant source of phosphorus.



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WISCONSIN COUNTY HIGHWAY ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION AS ADOPTED ON JANUARY 16, 2013

ARTICLE I – NAME AND TYPE

Section 1 - Name: The name of the Association shall be the "Wisconsin County Highway Association Inc.," a not for profit corporation.

Section 2 – Affiliation: The Wisconsin County Highway Association, hereinafter referred to as the Association, shall be in cooperation with the Wisconsin Counties Association.

Section 3 – Address: The Association's principal office shall be located at 22 East Mifflin Street, Suite 900, Madison, WI 53703, but meetings may be held at any other place designated by the Board of Directors or Executive Committee.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE AND POLICY DETERMINATION

Section 1 – **General:** The Association is a *not for profit corporation*, non-partisan association of county governments in the state of Wisconsin organized for the purpose of protecting and furthering the common interests of county governments in performing the governmental function of constructing and maintaining highways. The Association's policies shall be determined by the Board of Directors and by the vote of the Member Counties of the Association at annual or special Association meetings.

Section 2 – Specific: The association is organized for the following purposes:

- A. To solve problems common to county governments relating to the construction and maintenance of highways.
- B. To allow the Member Counties of the Association to receive the benefits of improved service and reduced costs through cooperative efforts, such as publishing a magazine, holding Association meetings, and conducting educational and training services for county highway commissioners and committee members.
- C. To provide information to the state Legislature for the development of sound legislation affecting county highways.
- D. To promote harmonious relations between its Member Counties and other public officials and the people they represent.



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E. To create and develop county highway construction and maintenance standards and specifications that will serve the needs of modern transportation.

- F. To formulate and recommend changes in county highway policies as occasion requires to improve administration methods in carrying out the provisions of the law.
- G. To provide advice to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation on administration of the state highway maintenance program consistent with the intent of Section 84.07(1), Wisconsin Statutes.
- H. To serve as the initial point of contact for a county highway department concerned with existing Wisconsin Department of Transportation policy, issues or matters of mutual concern.
- I. To represent all county highway departments for negotiation of rates and terms of state payments for county labor, equipment, materials and other costs required for maintenance of state highways consistent with the intent of Section 84.07(2), Wisconsin Statutes.
- J. To complete the annual negotiations with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation on rates and terms of payments for maintenance of state highways by August 1st preceding the effective year.
- K. To encourage Individual Members to perform the duties of county government office (Commissioners and Committee members) in a manner that will reflect a sense of responsibility as administrative officers in the public interest and to participate in matters of civic betterment and welfare.
- L. To transact and carry on any business as may be necessary for the betterment and welfare of the Association, and to call and hold meetings at such times as may be deemed necessary to obtain the expressed opinions and judgment of its members in establishing and carrying out the policies of the Association.
- M. To enter into contracts necessary or incidental to the carrying out of the business and purposes stated.

Section 3 – Cooperation with Wisconsin Counties Association: The Association shall cooperate with the Wisconsin Counties Association (WCA) for the purposes of professional enrichment, information sharing and enlargement of the issue orientation of elected policy makers. The Association shall provide advice to the WCA Board of Directors in the development of WCA policy.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Section 1 – County: Any county of the state of Wisconsin which is a member of the WCA may become a Member County of the Association upon payment in full of annual dues. The Association dues shall be established by action of the Board of Directors for each ensuing year, subject to majority approval by vote of the Member Counties at the annual summer conference of the Association. Association dues shall be paid by each Member County not later than January 31 of each year.

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Section 2 - Individual: Individual membership in the Association shall be limited to those persons who are either a highway commissioner elected or appointed under Section 83.01, Wisconsin Statutes, or a highway committee member elected or appointed under Section 83.015, Wisconsin Statutes, in a Member County of the Association.

Section 3- Associate Member: Associate membership in the association shall be limited to agencies, businesses, and individuals who share an interest of our goals and missions in promoting transportation. Associate members, shall not have voting rights in any association business, except that the two (2) associate members elected to serve on the Association's Conference Coordinating Committee shall have voting rights for issues affecting said committee. Association dues shall be paid by each member not later than February 1 of each year based upon a fee schedule determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 4 – Technical Members: Technical membership in the Association is limited to those individuals who are employed by County Highway Departments in the areas of engineering; business management; fleet management or operations management. Voting rights for these individuals shall be as determined in the WCHA Bylaws unless otherwise defined in the WCHA Constitution.

Section 5- Executive Director: The Executive Director shall be a non-voting member of the association. There will be no dues associated with this membership.

Section 6 - Honorary Members: Past Chairs and Past Presidents of the Association shall retain honorary membership status and shall have voting rights on the CHAPPs Committee after leaving County government.

ARTICLE IV – DIVISIONS AND DISTRICTS

Section 1 – Divisions: The Association shall be divided into divisions for Association purposes.

- Commissioners: Individual membership in the Commissioners Division shall be limited to A. persons holding the office of county highway commissioner or the individual serving in the comparable position as designated under Wisconsin Statute Chapter 83.
- Committee members: Individual membership in the Committee members Division shall be B. limited to those persons who are highway committee members or the individual serving in the comparable position as designated under Wisconsin Statute Chapter 83.

Section 2 - Districts: The State of Wisconsin shall be divided into Districts for Association purposes. The Association shall allocate each county into a district as designated by the Wisconsin County Highway Association Board of Directors, and as follows:

<u>ARTICLE V – ASSOCIATION FUNDS</u>

Section 1 – Funds: The funds of the Association shall be used only for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Association incurred in carrying on the affairs of the Association. The funds may include, but are not limited to: Association dues, conference and training fees, and the sale of publications, materials and services. If any assets of the Association are to be distributed during the existence of the Association or upon its dissolution, the assets must be distributed only to Member Counties. No part of the Association's earnings may inure to the benefit of any private interest.

Section 2 – Depository: The Executive Committee shall designate the depository of Association funds.

Section 3 – Annual Report: The Treasurer shall prepare a general written income and expense statement for the preceding year ending December 31 which shall be published and made available at the annual winter conference.

Section 4- Annual audit: The Treasurer shall do or cause to have done an annual review of the association funds with an independent reviewer approved by the Board of Directors for the year ending December 31 and completed by March 1st of the next year.

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<u>ARTICLE VI – REGULAR MEETINGS</u>

Section 1 – Annual Winter Road School: An Association regular meeting shall be held in Wisconsin in conjunction with a winter road school scheduled for that purpose during the month of January and held at the place and time approved by the Executive Committee.

Section 2 – Annual Summer Road School: An Association regular meeting shall be held in Wisconsin in conjunction with a summer road school scheduled for that purpose during the month of June and held at the place and time approved by the Executive Committee.

Section 3 – Division Meetings: Commissioner Division and Committee members Division regular meeting may be held in conjunction with the winter and summer road schools at the call of the presiding officer, as specified in Article X, Sections 7 and 9.

<u> ARTICLE VII – SPECIAL MEETINGS</u>

Special meetings of the Association may be held at any time and any place within the state of Wisconsin upon call of the President of the Association or the Executive Committee or by a two-thirds majority of the Board of Directors, and it shall be the duty of the President to call such special meetings at any time upon request in writing signed by twenty or more Individual Members. Such meetings may also be decided upon as to time and place at the regular annual meeting.

<u> ARTICLE VIII – QUORUM AND VOTING RIGHTS</u>

Section 1 – Quorum: A majority of the Member Counties entitled to vote at an Association meeting shall constitute a quorum necessary for the transaction of business. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Association unless a quorum shall be present.

Section 2 – Voting Rights: Each Member County shall have one vote at regular and special Association meetings of the Member Counties which shall be cast by the official representative of the county. A majority of the votes entitled to be cast by the Member Counties present in person at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be necessary for the adoption of any matter voted on by the Member Counties. Individual Members shall not have any voting rights at any meeting of the Member Counties.

Section 3 – Official Representative: The official representative of the Member County shall be the Chair of the County Highway Committee. The Chair of the County Highway Committee may designate an alternate official representative by written notice to the Secretary of the Association prior to the beginning of the meeting at which the alternate is to vote. In the Chair's absence, a present or virtually present representative of the Member County may cast a vote for the county.

Section 4 – Official Division Representatives: The official committee member division representative shall be the Chair of the County Highway Committee. The official commissioner division representative shall be the County Highway Commissioner or the individual serving in the comparable position as designated under Wisconsin Statute Chapter 83. Each County Member shall be entitled to one vote at any Division meeting. Alternates may be designated by the Chair of the County Highway Committee by written notice to the Secretary prior to the beginning of the meeting at which the alternate is to vote.

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ARTICLE IX – ORDER OF BUSINESS AND PROCEDURE

Section 1 - Order of Business: The regular order of business for the annual and special meetings of the Association, unless directed otherwise by a majority of those present, shall be as follows:

- 1. Call to order by the President.
- 2. Roll call of Member Counties by county.
- 3. Minutes of last meeting.
- 4. Approval of the agenda.
- 5. Report of the Board of Directors.
- 6. Report of the resolutions committee.
- New business.
- 8. Election of officers.

Section 2 – Procedure: The procedure of all meetings shall conform to Roberts' Rules of Order. The manner of voting at regular and special meetings shall be by voice vote unless a roll call is requested.

ARTICLE X – OFFICERS, ELECTION, DUTIES AND TERMS

Section 1 – Officers: The officers of the Association shall consist of a Board of Directors Chair, Vice-Chair, Past President, Past Chair, President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2 – Elections: All officers except the Treasurer shall be elected at an Association regular meeting by a majority of Member Counties. The term of office for all new officers shall commence the day following the end of the regular meeting at which they are elected. Persons elected shall remain in office throughout their term and thereafter until their successors are elected. Each officer shall be an Individual member of the Association. If any officer ceases to be a County Highway Commissioner, or the individual serving in the comparable position as designated under Wisconsin Statute Chapter 83, or County Highway Committee member, his or her office becomes vacant. All vacancies shall be filled within thirty (30) days by appointment by Executive Committee from the Board's membership.

Section 3 – Board of Directors Chair, Vice-Chair, and Past Chair: These offices shall be progressive offices held by a highway committee member. The Vice-Chair shall be elected every year at the summer regular meeting for a *three (3) year term*. After serving one year, the Vice-Chair shall become the Board Chair, and after one year as Board Chair shall become the Past Chair.

Section 4 – Past President, President and Secretary: These offices shall be progressive offices held by highway commissioners or the individual serving in the comparable position as designated under Wisconsin Statute Chapter 83. The Secretary shall be elected every two (2) years, the even years, at the winter regular meeting for a six (6) year term. After serving two (2) years, the Secretary shall become the

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President. After serving two (2) years as President, the President shall become Past President for a two (2) year term.

Section 5 – Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be highway commissioner, or the individual serving in the comparable position as designated under Wisconsin Statute Chapter 83, elected for a two (2) year term by the Board of Directors from Individual membership and may serve no more than three (3) full and consecutive terms as Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be elected at the Board's August biennial organization meeting pursuant to Article XI, Section 4.B. The term of office for Treasurer shall commence on January 1 of every odd year.

Section 6 – Terms: Except for the office of Treasurer, and except where a person has filled a vacancy for the remainder of an unexpired term by appointment of the Board of Directors, no officer shall be elected for a consecutive term.

Section 7 – Board of Directors Chair: The Board Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, and in case of a vacancy in the office of President, or in the absence or disability of the President, perform all duties of the President until that position is filled by the Board of Directors. The Board Chair in cooperation with the President shall serve as a team in performing these duties to promote the traditional committee member and commissioner relationship in the Association. The Board Chair shall also serve as President of the Committee members Division and shall preside over all meetings of that Division and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by that Division.

Section 8 – Board Vice-Chair: The Vice-Chair shall, in case of a vacancy in the office of Board Chair, or in the absence or disability of the Board Chair, perform all duties of the Board Chair until that position is filled by the Board of Directors. The Board Vice-Chair shall also serve as Secretary of the Committee members Division by preparing minutes for all Committee members Division meetings and conducting its correspondence. Such Committee members Division records and correspondence shall be forwarded to the Association Secretary.

Section 9 – President: The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association and the Executive Committee, be the Chief Executive Officer of the Association, perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors, sign all documents requiring the signature of the Chief Executive Officer of the Association and shall appoint committees as are established by the Constitution and Bylaws or the Board of Directors. The President may sign checks and orders. The President in cooperation with the Board Chair shall serve as a team in performing these duties to promote the traditional commissioner and committee member relationship in the Association. The President shall also serve as President of the Commissioners Division and shall preside over all meetings of the Division and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by that Division. The Past President shall aid the President in all duties to ensure a uniform transition and promote continuance of the Association issues, in addition the Past President shall be the Executive Committee representative on the conference Coordinating Committee and representative in relation to all Association Conference planning. The President shall appoint a Past President of the Association as the NACE Wisconsin Director.

Section 10 – Secretary: The Secretary or designee shall keep a record of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association. The Secretary shall conduct, or cause to have done, the correspondence of the Association, mail all notices required by the Constitution and Bylaws, and shall perform such other duties as the Board of Directors shall from time to time prescribe. The Secretary, or designee, shall keep all official records of the Association for a period of Seven (7) calendar years and shall deliver possession and/or control of such records and properties to his or her successor in office. The Secretary may appoint

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an Individual Member of the Association as Recording Secretary to assist in carrying out these duties. The Secretary shall also serve as Secretary of the Commissioners Division and shall assist, as needed, the Vice-Chair of the Committee members Division.

Section 11 – Treasurer: The Treasurer shall safely keep all monies and funds of the Association and may sign checks and orders, and shall deliver all the books, funds and properties in his or her possession or under his or her control as Treasurer to his or her successor in office, or to such other person as the Executive Committee from time to time orders or directs. The Treasurer shall exercise the responsibilities pursuant to Article V of the Constitution. The Treasurer may appoint an Individual Member of the Association as Assistant Treasurer to assist in carrying out these duties. The Treasurer shall notify the Board of Directors whenever an expenditure line item in the annual Association budget is exceeded. The Treasurer may appoint the Assistant Treasurer or other designee to assist in the management of finances associated with the WCHA's Road School; the Superintendents' and Foremen's Road School; or other specific special events sanctioned by the WCHA. The Treasurer shall maintain a line item account within the WCHA budget for the Superintendents' and Foremen's Road School from which all income and disbursements for the event will be accounted for.

Section 12 – Nominations: The Executive Committee shall serve as the Nominating Committee for the Association Officers. The Executive Committee shall determine the candidate's willingness to serve a full term prior to making the nomination. The Executive Committee shall accept recommendations in writing no later than 60 days prior to the election.

Section 13 – Election: The Executive Committee shall submit its nominations for Association Officers to the Board of Directors for approval by majority vote prior to the regular Association meeting. In addition to the nominations submitted to the Association, additional nominations may be made from the floor with the consent of the nominee.

- A. Vice-Chair Election: A Board of Directors Vice-Chair shall be elected for a three (3) year term as an Association Officer at every year's summer regular meeting.
- B. Secretary Election: A Secretary shall be elected for a six (6) year term as an Association Officer at the even year winter regular meeting.
- C. Treasurer Election: A Treasurer shall be elected for a two (2) year term at the even year Board of Directors August Meeting.

ARTICLE XI – BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1 – Make-up and Powers: The Association powers, objectives and business shall be exercised, conducted and controlled by a Board of Directors consisting of the elected officers of the Association and Directors from divisions and districts as specified in the Article. The Board shall consist of no less than sixteen (16) members and no more than twenty four (24,), with a balance to be achieved between the number of commissioners and committee representatives. The Board may adopt Bylaws to implement the powers delegated to the Board by the Constitution.

Two representatives of the Superintendents' and Foremen's Leadership Development Group shall serve on the Board of Directors. One representative shall have voting rights on any issue pertaining to Article XVI of the By-laws. The other representative will be a non-voting member. The Superintendents' and

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Foremen's Leadership Development Group representative to the Board shall only count as part of a quorum when issues related to Article XVI of the By-laws are being discussed or acted upon. One representative from the Associate Members shall sit on the Board of Directors in a non-voting advisory capacity. This representative shall be elected by the Associate members and shall serve under the same term constraints as are identified for other members of the Board of Directors.

Section 2 – Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of the Association shall consist of the elected officers of the Association. The President of the Association shall be the Chair of the Executive Committee. The Treasurer shall be an ex officio member of the Executive Committee without voting rights. The Executive Committee shall exercise all the powers of the Board of Directors as may be lawfully delegated, in writing in the Bylaws, by the Board when the Board is not in session.

- A. Duties so delegated in the Bylaws shall be specified and/or reviewed from time to time as deemed necessary by the Board, but at least once every two (2) years, at the biennial organization meeting pursuant to Section 4.B of this Article.
- B. Every member of the Executive Committee shall be entitled to one vote at meetings of the Executive Committee and all matters shall be decided by majority vote of the Executive Committee members present and voting at a meeting at which a quorum is present. A majority of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3 – District Directors: One (1) highway commissioner and one (1) highway committee member shall be elected to serve as a District Director by the Individual Members of each Division within a particular district, unless represented on the Board of Directors by a duly elected officer of the Association.

- A. Elections: Directors shall serve for a period of two (2) years and may serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms. The highway commissioner shall be elected during the Odd years and the highway committee member shall be elected during the even years. Such election shall be held at least one month prior to the annual winter meeting of the Association and as soon after County Board Elections as the District provides, and the term shall take effect immediately upon election. Each Director shall serve until his or her successor is elected or appointed.
- B. Vacancy: A vacancy on the Board of Directors shall occur if a Director has three consecutive, unexcused absences from properly called and noticed meetings of the Board of Directors. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of a Director's term by means of the same process as election. In the event there is no election of a Director from a District as provided herein, the President shall appoint a Director or Directors.
- C. Each district may send an alternate director, in their respective official capacity, from the district in the event the seated director cannot be present. (i.e. a different Highway Commissioner from the district shall represent the absent Highway Commissioner or a different Highway Committee member from the district shall represent the absent Highway Committee member) The alternate shall have voting rights for the district in all association business in the absence of the seated director and must notify the Executive Director or the president in advance of the meeting.

Section 4 – Regular Meetings: Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such time and place as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine adequate. Notice of all meetings shall be given to all Directors.

- A. Regular Association Meetings: The Board of Directors may hold meetings preceding the regular winter and summer meetings of the Association pursuant to Article VI.
- B. Biennial Organization Meeting: An organization meeting of the Board of Directors should be held at least once every two (2) years, the even years, at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors scheduled during the month of August. The purpose of this meeting shall be to review the Bylaws, evaluate the committee structure, elect the Treasurer and conduct other business.

Section 5 – Special Meetings: Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the President at any time by notice to all Directors indicating the place and subject matter of the meeting. A special meeting may also be called by written notice signed by a majority of the Board of Directors, which is mailed to each member of the Board indicating the time, place and subject matter of the meeting. The written notice signed by a majority of the Board of Directors must be given not less than seven (7) days prior to the special meeting.

Section 6 – Quorum: A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at each meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XII – COMMITTEES AND DISTRICT ORGANIZATIONS

Section 1 – Committees: The Board of Directors shall appoint steering and other committees as deemed necessary or useful to the conduct of Association business. Such committees shall be created and operate in accordance with Bylaws adopted by the Board of Directors. In addition, the Board of Directors may, by resolution, appoint special committees as deemed necessary or useful to the conduct of Association business.

Section 2 – District Committees: The Association encourages district committees for purposes of professional enrichment, information sharing and enlargement of the issue orientation of commissioners and committee members. District committees shall provide advice to the Board of Directors in the development of policy and shall support only those positions consistent with Board of Directors policies. Such Committees shall be created and operate in accordance with Bylaws adopted by the Board of Directors.

Section 3 – Standing Committees: Association standing committees shall serve the Association in program areas of continuous concern to county highway departments. The following standing committees shall be created and operate in accordance with Bylaws adopted by the Board of Directors.

- A. Machinery Management
- B. Bridge
- C. Legislative
- D. Audit
- E. Conference Coordinating

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- F. Utility
- G. Level of Service (LOS)
- H. Safety & Training
- I. Technical Advisory
- J. CHAPPS (County Highway Association Past Presidents)
- K. Superintendents' and Foremen's Leadership Development Group
- Work Zone Safety L.

Section 4 - Department of Transportation Committees: The Association encourages participation in Department of Transportation committees and in particular advisory committees for cooperative management of the state highway maintenance program which correspond to Association committees. Such committees shall be created and operate in accordance with Bylaws adopted by the Board of Directors.

<u>ARTICLE XIII – AMENDMENTS OF THE CONSTITUTION</u>

Section 1 - Proposed Amendments: Amendments may be proposed by a Member County or by the Board of Directors. Proposed amendments shall be submitted to the President 60 days prior to a regular winter or summer meeting of the Association at which such amendments are to be considered. Amendments shall be referred to the Board of Directors which shall hold an announced meeting to review, discuss and make its recommendation to the Association.

The Secretary shall publish and mail (a) an amendment notice, (b) the proposed amendments and (c) the Board's recommendation to each Individual Member in the commissioner Division at least 30 days prior to the Association meeting at which the amendments are to be considered.

Section 2 - Amendment Approvals: The Constitution may be amended at any regular winter or summer meeting of the Association upon a majority vote of the Member Counties present and voting, but no such amendment shall be voted upon unless prior notice stating the contents of the amendment and the Board's recommendation has been mailed to each Individual Member in the commissioner Division pursuant to Section 1 of this Article.


<u> ARTICLE XIV – DISSOLUTION</u>

The Association may be dissolved by a majority vote of the Member Counties present and voting at any regular or special meeting of the Association at which a quorum is present. Upon dissolution of the Association, any excess funds shall be distributed to the Member Counties as determined by the Board of Directors.

<u> ARTICLE XV – EFFECTIVE DATE</u>

This Constitution shall take effect the day following its adoption and shall act to supersede and repeal the Constitution and Bylaws of the Wisconsin County Highway Commissioner and Committee members Association in effect at that time.
