Description of right-of-way to be abandoned:

A portion of Eaton Street, platted as part of Eaton's Addition. (Exhibit A, Eaton's Addition Plat Map).

Reason for abandonment:

Eaton's Addition was platted in 1860. The plat included the dedication of Eaton Street. Eaton Street was never constructed and the area platted as the street was never used as a public right-of-way. STH 23/Dodge Street was constructed to the southeast of Eaton Street, running parallel to the location platted for Eaton Street. Eaton Street has never been used as a public right-of-way and the City has expended no funds on Eaton Street.

Pursuant to Wis. Sat. § 82.19(2)(a), a street ceases to be public street 4 years from the date on which it was laid out, except the parts that have been opened, traveled, or worked within that time. Pursuant to Wis. Sat. § 82.19(2)(b)(2), a street that has been entirely abandoned as a route of vehicular travel, and on which no highway funds have been expended for 5 years, shall be considered discontinued.

Since Eaton Street was never constructed or used as a public route of travel and since Eaton Street has been entirely abandoned as a route of vehicular travel and no highway funds have

been expended on it, it is considered discontinued under the law. Kwik Trip request that the City recognize this discontinuance as it relates to area of Eaton Street between 620 Dodge Street and 662 Dodge Street and that the real property has reverted to the surrounding landowners.

Proposed use of abandoned right-of-way:

Kwik Trip proposes that Eaton Street between 620 Dodge Street and 662 Dodge Street be recognized as abandoned by the City and reverted to the surrounding landowners and the State to ensure the appropriate right-of-way for STH 23/Dodge Street.

Kwik Trip has an agreement to purchase the real property located at 622 Dodge Street (Lot 1, CSM 1168) from the Jeffrey J. and Brenda S. Basting Revocable Trust. The full legal description is attached as **Exhibit B**. Point Foods is currently located on this property. The land reverted to 622 Dodge Street is indicated on the survey attached as **Exhibit C**. The area reverted to 622 Dodge Street consist of 0.42 acres. The remainder reverted to the State to ensure a right-of-way 49.5 feet from the center line of STH 23/Dodge Street.

Patrick C. Ford owns 662 Dodge Street (Lot 2, CSM 1168). The full legal description is attached as Exhibit D. Ford Appliance is located on this Property. The land reverted to 662 Dodge Street is indicated on the survey attached as Exhibit E. The area reverted to 662 Dodge Street consists of 0.22 acres. The remainder reverted to the State to ensure a right-of-way 49.5 feet from the center line of STH 23/Dodge Street.






Resolution No. 1-322

U.S. HIGHWAY 18/151 DODGEVILLE - VERONA CORRIDOR ROAD AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS in DANE AND IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) conducted a Limited Access Study (ACCESS) for the USH 18/151 corridor from Dodgeville, Wisconsin to Verona, Wisconsin between 2002 and 2006; and,

WHEREAS, WisDOT developed the Limited Access Study into an Environmental Study from 2006 until 2014 and included public involvement meetings, local public official's meetings, and public hearings with extensive planning efforts across both Dane and Iowa Counties; culminating in an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and a Federal Highway Administration Finding Of No Significant Impact (EA-FONSI) in 2014; and,

WHEREAS, the Limited Access Study, Environmental Document, and Environmental Impact Statement Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) proposed the elimination of ALL public (existing local roads) and private (driveways) at-grade direct access points onto USH 18/151 in order to "provide safe travel without unreasonable indirection" and to "ensure adequate response time for emergency services"; And,

WHEREAS, WisDOT completed both the USH 18/151Freeway Conversion Plan and the Limited Access Study Environmental Assessment {EA} such that the EA-FONSI is fully compliant with the National Environmental Protection Act {NEPA}; and

WHEREAS, WisDOT intended for and the Federal Highway Administration {FHWA} approved of the conclusions of all of this design work, engineering studies, and impact statements allowing them to serve as the environmental document of record for the design and construction of the various Preferred Alternatives; and,

WHEREAS, due to project size and complexity, the proposed project was divided into six (6) main segments geographically based on land use, economic development, emerging safety concerns, and operational issues and concluded with recommendations for development of a Preferred Alternative selection for each individual segment; and,

WHEREAS, each of the six {6) Preferred Alternatives identified over/under passes and interchanges for local roads in order to make safety and other improvements to USH 18/151and to maintain connectivity and redundancy along the corridor; and,

WHEREAS, for long-term corridor transportation preservation as part of the backbone system and for land-use transportation planning and coordination, each of the six {6} Preferred Alternatives led to independent conditions and condusions for each location based on safety concerns and the nature of other accessibility or lack thereof; And,

WHEREAS, WisDOT is now proposing to abandon that previous public process, engineering, and significant financial investment to develop R-cut of J-Turn intersection safety projects via the use of Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) dollars in a piecemeal intersection by intersection fashion (negating the priorities of economics, accessibility, safety, and mobility); and,

WHEREAS, the HSIP proposed R-cut and J-turn alternatives may be viewed by WisDOT as a low-cost design alternative; the R-cut and J-turn design can complicate and confuse traffic patterns especially during peak hour volumes which result in increased crash incident frequency; And,

WHEREAS, the Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) volume along USH 18/151 varies between 16,700 and 19,100 vehicles for Iowa County and between 19,800 and 27,400 vehicles for Dane County and correlates to one vehicle every four seconds (or less) which can be significantly higher than that during peak hour traffic; And,

WHEREAS, R-cut and J-turn intersections require right-hand to left-hand turn lane movements and vehicles driving 65 miles per hour (covering 95.3 feet per second) may result in insufficient queue times and queue lengths for vehicles attempting to accelerate and decelerate between vehicles to navigate those intersection types; And,

WHEREAS, the piecemeal (one intersection at a time) HSIP alternative does not address overall safety in the corridor as drivers would still have access options and alternatives that will be the same or lessthan the existing safety level of the corridor;

NOW THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED**; the lowa County Board of Supervisors is concerned that the installation of spot location R-Cut of J-Turn alternatives for the various side road intersection s does not meet the original Limited Access Study, Environmental Study, Environmental Impact Statement, AND Environmental Assessment Finding of No Significant Impact as the Preferred Alternative agreed upon solution; and

BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED, the R-Cut and J-Turn alternatives may not attain the HSIP goals of enhancing driver safety of decreasing overall crashes, or by resolving driver conflicts in decision making, or by reducing frequency and magnitude of crashes within the corridor; And,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Limited Access Study identified six segments for improvement based on existing accesses, rural road accesses, and topography which would provide continuity for rural road users; And,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, R-Cut and J-Turn intersections do NOT agree with Comprehensive plans for the townships and villages within the County between Dodgeville and Verona corridor; and the HSIP proposed at -grade intersections do NOT promote localized economic development opportunity and do NOT promote unimpeded free movement of goods and services through communities; And

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Limited Access Study's originally proposed Six Segment Preferred Alternative interchanges support local infrastructure and better serve the constituents, residents, taxpayers, and corridor users by creating safer connectivity throughout the area versus the one by one intersection approach; And

BE IT RESOLVED, lowa County prefers implementation of the public vetted six segment Preferred Alternative improvements initially identified in the Limited Access St udy, Environmental Study Impact Statement, and the FHWA approved of Environmental Assessment - Finding Of No Significant Impact and is NOT in favor of the current intersection by intersection analysis alternatives (HSIP R-Cut and J-Turn at-grade intersections) WisDOT is currently evaluating; And,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the County Clerk shall send a copy of this Resolution to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Southwest Region District Director Brett Wallace, the State Secretary of the Department of Transportation Craig Thompson, State Assembly Representatives: Todd Novak, Sondy Pope, and Travis Tranel along with State Senators: Jon Erpenbach and Howard Marklein.

Ordinance No. <u>800.06</u>

ANNUAL COUNTY VEHICLE REGISTRATION FEE IOWA COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

IOWA County, Wisconsin

The Board of Supervisors of IOWA County does ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, building and maintaining highways and bridges are essential to sustaining the quality of Wisconsin's highway infrastructure, which is vital to the state, counties and municipalities to support commerce, tourism and the safe transportation of people and goods; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County property tax appropriation and other revenues have declined over the last 15 years while increases in the cost of materials needed to maintain the county highway maintenance goals and programs have more than doubled; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes § 341.35 gives a county the authority to enact an ordinance imposing an annual flat registration fee on all motor vehicles registered in this state which are customarily kept in the county; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stats. § 341.35 defines "motor vehicle" as an automobile, or motor truck registered under Wis. Stats. § 341.25(1)(c) at a gross weight of not more than 8,000 pounds; and

WHEREAS, a \$20.00 annual county vehicle registration fee would become a designated revenue source for the core service of highway construction improvements in Iowa County that comes directly from the users of highways; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation collects the fee and remits the moneys collected to the county less an administrative fee, currently \$0.10 per motor vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors directs these annual fees to be in addition to other fund sources currently being utilized by the Iowa County Highway Department; and

WHEREAS, the County Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this Ordinance to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin department of Transportation requires a minimum of ninety (90) days notice prior to the first date of the month the Ordinance is to be made effective,

THEREFORE, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors hereby creates an Annual County Vehicle Registration Fee of the Iowa County Code of Ordinances, to be made effective on February 1, 2015

This ordinance shall be review in eight years, October 2022.

Resolution No. 5-0819

RESOLUTION DIRECTING SPECIFIC FUNDING FOR HIGHWAY RECONSTRUCTION

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board is challenged with a back log of needed highway improvements throughout Iowa County; and

WHEREAS, a new County Highway is expected to last 25 to 30 years before major repairs or reconstruction is needed, however in Iowa County the road reconstruction schedule is nearing a 120 year replacement; and

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board would like to address this backlog of needed road reconstruction projects and appropriate additional tax dollars to the County Highway budget; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Public Service Commission has approved a solar installation in Iowa County which will bring additional revenue to Iowa County; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Public Service Commission has approved a high voltage power line, which will bring additional revenue in a single lump sum to Iowa County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the lowa County Board of Supervisors instructs that 80% of all new utility revenue be directed to road reconstruction until the year 2025.

Resolution No. 2-322

RESOLUTION DIRECTING SPECIFIC FUNDING FOR HIGHWAY ROAD AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Board of Supervisors passed Resolution #5-0819 on August 20, 2019; And,

WHEREAS, Resolution #5-0819 designated all future new utility fee revenues be directed toward road reconstruction until the year 2025; And,

WHEREAS, the intent was to designate up to five (5) years of new utility revenue to highway improvements during the timeframe of adoption; And,

WHEREAS, since its' adoption no new utility fee revenues have been received by the County; And,

WHEREAS, the County is anticipating new utility revenues from potential utility projects in the County; And,

WHEREAS, the needs initially referred to and identified within the original Resolution #05-0819 still exist; And,

WHEREAS, the Biennial Surface Transportation Program and Local Roads Improvement Programs are the predominant programs for funding of highway improvements and both are grant based programs with a local cost share component requirement; And,

WHEREAS, in addition to the annual Surface Transportation Program; the recently passed Federal Bi-partisan Infra-structure Investment Bill is allocating an additional annual amount of \$200 million dollars per year for each of the next five years in grant opportunities to local governmental agencies, also with a local cost share component; And,

WHEREAS, the Public Works Committee initially proposed the Resolution with an anticipation of receiving five (5) years of revenue to use for local cost share match for grant dollars; And,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; the Iowa County Board of Supervisors instructs that 80% of all new utility revenue be directed to road and bridge improvements until the year 2028.

WHEREAS, in 1999 the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) partnered with the American Association of State and Highway officials (AASHTO) and more recently with the American Traffic Safety Services Association (ATSSA) to create the National work Zone Safety Awareness Week campaign, held annually in April prior to the construction season for much of the nation; and,

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin County Highway Association is asking all seventy-two (72) counties in the state to unite and kick-off "WorkZone Safety Awareness Week" with a resolution and campaign to raise awareness for its' workers and those of various highway contractors performing work for the counties; and,

WHEREAS, between 2016 and 2021 there were 59 fatalities recorded as a result of more than 13,000 work zone crashes and injuring more than 5,000 people; and,

WHEREAS, construction and maintenance activities on our streets and highways periodically require that work zones be established; and,

WHEREAS, there has been an average of 2,677 work zone crashes in Wisconsin in each of the last five years; and,

WHEREAS, in 2020, Wisconsin suffered from 1,700 crashes in road construction and maintenance zones, resulting in over 665 injuries and 17 fatalities; and,

WHEREAS, through their enforcement activities and other participation, the Iowa County Sheriff's Office, Wisconsin State Patrol and the Iowa County Highway Department will work to make "Work Zone Safety Awareness Week" a success; and,

WHEREAS, the County Sheriff's Office committed in 2022 to conduct enforcement activities and work jointly with the County Highway Department to make "Work Zone Safety Awareness Week" a success in Iowa County; and,

WHEREAS, the Iowa County Highway Department and Sheriff's Office have employees whose daily duties are to work within work zones and traffic; and,

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has designated April 11 through April 15, 2022 as National Work Zone Safety Awareness Week with this year's theme "Work

Zones are a Sign to Slow Down", which focuses on awareness to all drivers in work zones of their speed and proximity to workers.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Iowa County Board of Supervisors that the week of April 11^{th} through April 15^{th} , 2022 be designated as "Work Zone Safety Awareness Week" in Iowa County.

Compensatory Time: Going from 40 hour Comp Time Bank (every pay period) to 60 hour Comp Time Bank paid out quarterly for overs over 60. Also including language that allows no carry over Comp Time Hours under the ETF rule.

Increasing Longevity by .25%: After five (5) years - 1.25% to 1.50% After ten (10) years - 1.75% to 2% After fifteen (15) years: 2.25% to 2.5% After twenty (20) years: 2.75% to 3%

2022 Wages: January 2, 2022 - 2% Across the Board (ATB) July 2, 2022 - 2% - ATB

2023 Wages: January 1, 2023- 2% ATB July 1, 2023 - 2% ATB
