- Whether to allow plumbing in accessory structures

The consensus was to have Director Godfrey request input from the towns on these issues and to ask if there are other issues that should be considered. Chair Peterson suggested providing at least 2 months for the input, so the matter will be a discussion item on the August agenda at the earliest.

# 2. Comments

1. The A-1 district has a minimum lot size of 40 acres, so the proposed lot requires rezoning in order to be legally created.

- 2. If approved, the AR-1 lot would allow one single-family residence, accessory structures and limited ag uses, but no livestock type animal units due to being under 5 acres.
- 3. The associated certified survey map has not yet been submitted for formal review. The proposed lot will have a 66-foot wide easement to Farmers Ridge Rd.
- 4. Per Section 11.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered when deciding a zoning change:
  - 1) The petition is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan and the comprehensive plan of any Town affected by said petition.
  - 2) Adequate public facilities and services (including sewage and waste disposal, water, gas, electricity, schools, police and fire protection, and roads and transportation, as applicable) will be available as required by the petition while maintaining adequate levels of service to existing development.
  - 3) Provisions of public facilities to accommodate the petition will not place an unreasonable burden on the ability of affected local units of government to provide the.
  - 4) The petition will not result in significant adverse impacts upon surrounding properties or the natural environment, including air, water, noise, stormwater management, soils, wildlife and vegetation.
  - 5) The land associated with the petition is suitable for the proposed development and said development will not cause unreasonable soil erosion or have an unreasonable adverse effect on rare or irreplaceable natural areas.
  - 6) The petition will not be used to legitimize a nonconforming use or structure.
  - 7) The petition is the minimum action necessary to accomplish the intent of the petition, and an administrative adjustment, variance, or Conditional Use Permit could not be used to achieve the same result.
  - 8) The petition will not result in illegal "spot zoning" (i.e. use is inconsistent with surrounding properties and serves only a private, rather than public interest).

Town Recommendation: The Town of Highland is recommending approval Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends approval with the condition that the associated certified survey map is duly recorded with the Register of Deeds within 6 months of the County Board approval.

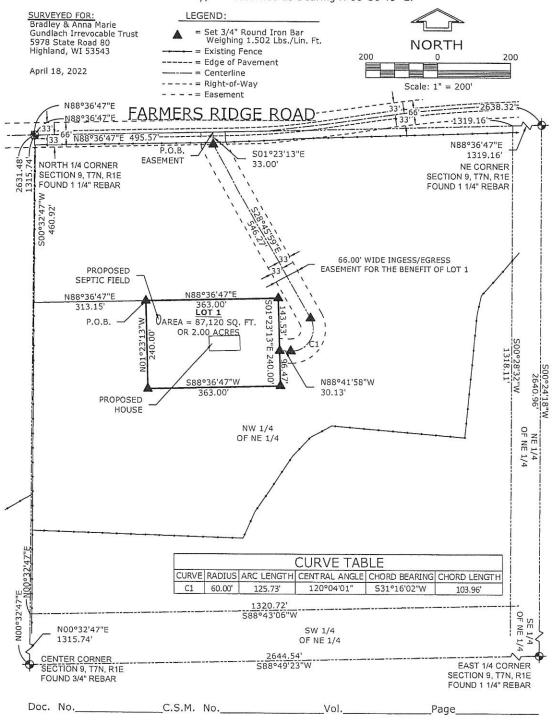

- operating characteristics (hours of operation, traffic generation, lighting, noise, odor, dust and other external impacts).
- 3) There are no significant anticipated measurable adverse impacts to the surrounding legal uses and environment resulting from the proposed conditional use.
- 4) Any adverse impacts resulting from the use will be mitigated or offset to the maximum practical extent.
- 5) Public safety, transportation, services and utility facilities exist or will be available to serve the subject property while maintaining sufficient levels of service for existing development.
- 6) Adequate assurances by the applicant of continuing maintenance are provided.
- 7) The proposed use is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan

Subject: The WDNR has approved a dam failure analysis of the Warzyn Dam located across Urnus Creek in the SE/NW of S8-T5N-R5E in the Town of Moscow. The analysis shows the final hazard rating to be High Hazard due to there currently being no floodplain zoning below the dam.

Chapter 87.30 WI Statues and chapter NR116.05 WI Adm Code requires the county to incorporate this study into the county's floodplain ordinance so that the area within the hydraulic shadow identified by the study would be regulated as the floodway portion of the floodplain. This would create floodplain regulation where there currently is none. (general floodplain designation is made by FEMA along waterways and does not include downstream of Warzyn Dam)

The period of time for an appeal of the study expired July 23, 2022. By State law, the county has six months from that date to incorporate the study into its floodplain ordinance.

Once incorporated into the ordinance, any development within the hydraulic shadow area must comply with floodway zoning standards outlined in the ordinance. This includes a prohibition of most buildings/structures and standards for grading/filling.

Currently, there are no structures or buildings in the hydraulic shadow.

On May 11, 2022, the Department of Natural Resources (Department) approved the dam failure analysis for the Warzyn Dam, located across the Urnus Creek, in the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 18, Township 05N, Range 05E, Iowa County, Wisconsin. Based on the results of the approved study the dam was assigned a final hazard rating of High Hazard.

The areas of potential dam failure inundation (hydraulic shadow) are adequately reflected on a map. This information is provided in the following enclosure:

 Map dated April 29, 2022 and titled "Warzyn Dam, Dam Failure Analysis, Hydraulic Shadow Floodway".

Under the requirements of chapter 87.30, Wisconsin Statutes and chapter NR 116.05, Wisconsin Administrative Code, the materials submitted with this letter need to be reviewed and any comments on technical aspects of the study shall be provided to the Department within **thirty (30) days** from the date this decision was delivered. After the 30-day review and comment period, the above referenced materials shall be formally adopted into the floodplain zoning ordinance within **six (6) months**.

To add the dam failure analysis into the ordinance amendment, the above sentence needs to be included in the official map section at a minimum. However, I suggest using the following language:

Warzyn Dam failure analysis approved by the Department of Natural Resources on May 11, 2022, including:

1. Map dated April 29, 2022 and titled "Warzyn Dam, Dam Failure Analysis, Hydraulic Shadow Floodway"

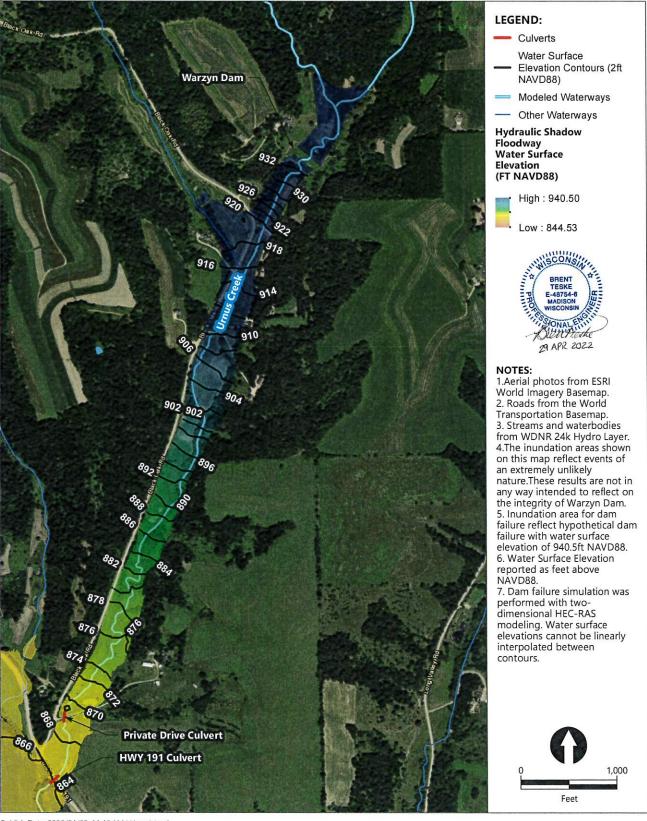

Dear Mr. Peterson,

We are sending you this approval of the dam failure analysis and setting the hazard rating for the Warzyn Dam. The hazard rating is being set as High Hazard due only to the lack of adequate floodplain zoning within the dam failure floodplain (hydraulic shadow) downstream of the dam.

As a dam having an assigned High Hazard rating, the Warzyn Dam must be capable of passing the 1000-year flood without overtopping.

Flood routing was not provided by your consultant as part of the dam failure analysis; thus, it is unclear if the dam is able to safely pass the required 1000-year or the 100-year floods without overtopping through its spillways as defined by Chapter NR 333 Wisconsin Administrative Code.

As a result of the study lowa County will have to adopt hydraulic shadow zoning downstream of the dam. The hydraulic shadow inundation area identified in the study must also be used in the development of the Emergency Action Plan (EAP) for your dam. Michael J. Stone, P. E. in our Fitchburg office will be assisting you in the adoption process and the development of the EAP.

Please note that currently there are no dwellings or critical infrastructure within the dam failure floodplain and once the required hydraulic shadow zoning has been adopted, you can request (in writing) that we lower the hazard rating to Low Hazard. If at the time of your request there is still no development in the hydraulic shadow, we will assign a new hazard rating of Low Hazard.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Department of Natural Resources (Department) has examined the dam failure analysis, for the Warzyn Dam, across Urnus Creek, in the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 18, Township 05N, Range 05E, Iowa County, Wisconsin.
- 2. The Warzyn Dam is owned and operated by Mr. Bret D Peterson.
- 3. The dam failure analysis developed by Anchor QEA, LLC is based on the 2-dimential flow computational algorithm and reasonably conservative estimates of the 100-year flood flow on Urnus Creek and dam breach parameters. The final version was submitted to the Department on April 29, 2022, under the professional seal of Mr. Brent Teske, P. E.
- 4. Anchor QEA, LLC has determined that a rating of High Hazard would be appropriate for the dam and the area downstream of the dam.
- 5. Downstream of the Warzyn Dam and within the dam failure floodplain (hydraulic shadow) there are no dwellings and the only critical infrastructure that potentially could be inundated is STH 191.
- 6. The current Flood Insurance Study (FIS) zoning in place downstream from the Warzyn Dam is not adequate in providing sufficient protection of life, health, and property.
- 7. Design flood routing was not provided by your consultant as part of the dam failure analysis, thus it is unclear if the dam can safely pass the required 1000-year flood without overtopping through its spillway as defined by NR 333, for a high hazard dam. It is also unclear if the dam has sufficient capacity for a low hazard dam.
- 8. The analysis was performed in compliance with Wisconsin Administrative Codes NR 333, and NR 116.
- 9. The hazard rating meets the standards of Section NR 333.06, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The review has been conducted in accordance with Chapter 31, Wisconsin Statutes, and Chapters NR 333 and NR 116, Wisconsin Administrative Codes.
- 2. The Department has authority under Chapter 31, Wisconsin Statutes, and Chapter NR 333, Wisconsin Administrative Code, to assign a hazard rating.

## ASSIGNMENT OF THE HAZARD RATING

- 1. The hazard rating of High Hazard is hereby assigned to the dam.
- 2. Your consultant has provided the hereby approved study narrative report in electronic format to Michael J. Stone, P. E. in our Fitchburg office. Hydraulic shadow map of the approved analysis will be sent to the Iowa County by Michael J. Stone, P. E. with the official letter requesting to adopt the study into the floodplain zoning ordinance.
- 3. Warzyn Dam capacity calculations must be developed and submitted to the Department for review and approval by 10/11/2022.
- 4. If necessary, the dam must be upgraded to pass the required flows within 10 years of the date of this approval letter.

- 5. An Emergency Action Plan (EAP) based on the approved dam failure analysis is required for your dam. Please submit an EAP to Michael J. Stone, P. E. for review and approval by 10/11/2022.
- 6. The Warzyn Dam inspections schedule has been adjusted based on the assigned hazard rating. Please refer to the Inspection Schedule below for your next required "By Owner" inspection. You will need to hire a Professional Engineer to conduct the inspection and submit report to the Department at that time.

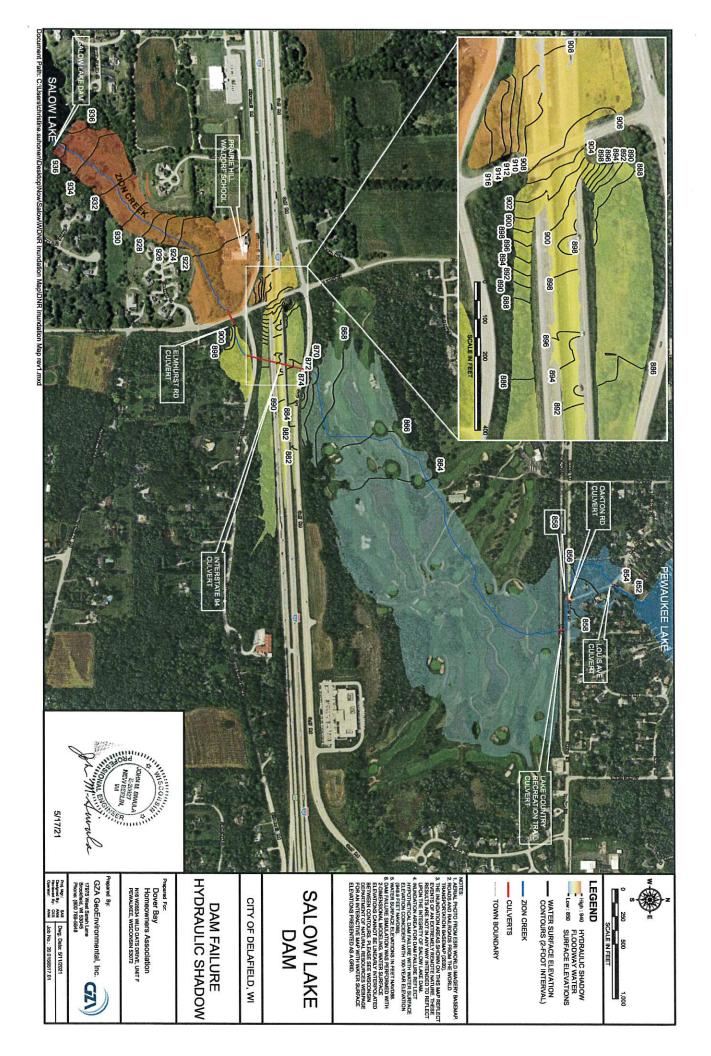

# 2. Comments

- 1. In the A-1 district, a cemetery may be requested by CUP provided:
  - a) A cemetery that contains or proposes to contain more than one burial site must be platted in compliance with Chapter 157 WI Statutes, or as subsequently renumbered. (Ch. 157 exempts platting for a cemetery owned)

- by a religious entity)
- b) An affidavit or similar document recorded with the Iowa County Register of Deeds to inform of a granted conditional use permit for a single burial site cemetery shall be a required condition to any approved conditional use permit. (Not applicable to this request)
- c) Any new mausoleum or crematory shall be conditioned with a minimum setback distance to all property lines and existing legal land uses that is reasonable to minimize potential conflict.
- d) Adequate organizational structure and funding for care shall be maintained, absent a written agreement of the Town or Towns in which the cemetery is located, to provide for perpetual care.
- 2. This matter began in January 2020 when the office was informed that at least two individuals had been buried at the site. In the time since, the applicants have been working with the Town of Mifflin to address the standards listed above and to acquire or gain approval to cross the railroad property for an access to Turnbull Rd.
- 3. The applicants have provided a legal description of 1.14 acres that would encompass the cemetery, but it includes land owned by the railroad.
- **4.** Per Section 4.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered for a CUP:
  - 1) The proposed use complies with all applicable provisions of this Ordinance.
  - 2) The proposed use is compatible with adjacent legal uses in terms of scale, site design, operating characteristics (hours of operation, traffic generation, lighting, noise, odor, dust and other external impacts).
  - 3) There are no significant anticipated measurable adverse impacts to the surrounding legal uses and environment resulting from the proposed conditional use.
  - Any adverse impacts resulting from the use will be mitigated or offset to the maximum practical extent.
  - 5) Public safety, transportation, services and utility facilities exist or will be available to serve the subject property while maintaining sufficient levels of service for existing development.
  - 6) Adequate assurances by the applicant of continuing maintenance are provided.
  - 7) The proposed use is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan

**Town Recommendation**: The Town of Mifflin has not provided a formal recommendation and has been invited to attend this hearing.

A: A portion of the parcel is intended for use as a burial ground, with plans of continuing its use as a burial ground.

Q: How do you feel the proposed use complies with all applicable provisions of this Ordinance? A: An adequate organizational structure and funding for care of the maintenance of the cemetery has been established and will be maintained over time.

Q: How do you feel the proposed use is compatible with adjacent legal uses in terms of scale, site design, operating characteristics (hours of operation, traffic generation, lighting, noise, odor, dust, and other external impacts)?

A: The cemetery's scale is only a portion of the parcel, and will not expand beyond the parcel's boundaries; the site design will be innocuous in that it will neither materially affect the aesthetics of the area nor be an apparent, standing structure; it will require very minimal maintenance; and will not meaningfully increase potential sources of clutter to the area (i.e., no increased traffic, noise, odor, dust, etc.).

A: The use of a portion of the parcel as a burial ground will in no way impair the principal, functional goals of the County (e.g., providing utilities, maintaining roads, and other support services), per the Executive Summary of Section H of the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan. Additionally, it will help fulfill the Town of Mifflin's specific Town Land Use Policies within

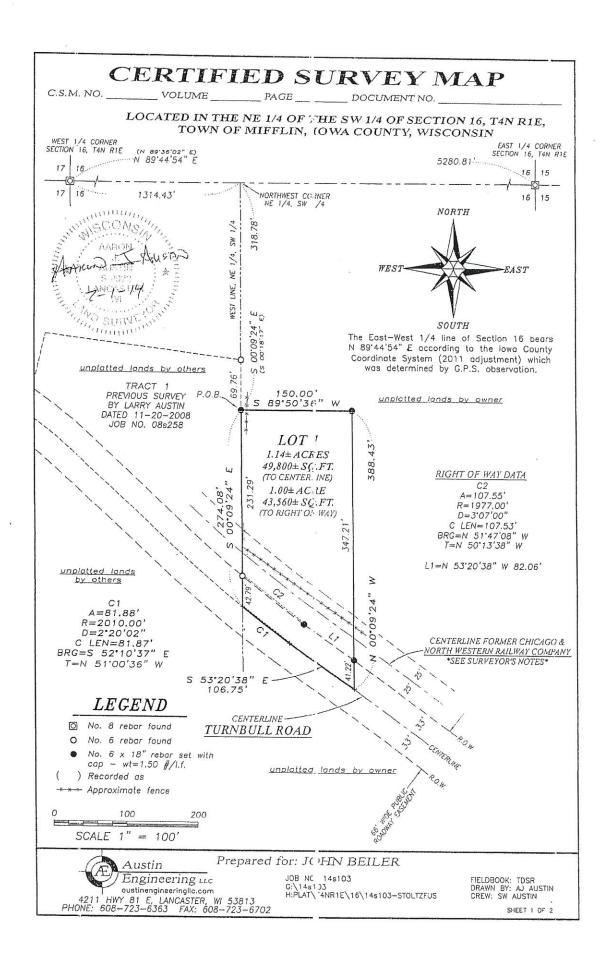

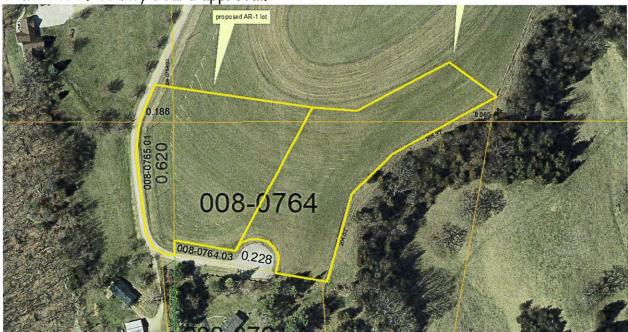


### 2. Comments

- 1. The acreages per lot have changed from the notice due to a correction in the proposed survey. The overall acreage has not changed.
- 2. The A-1 district has a minimum 40-acre lot size, so the proposed lots require rezoning in order to be legally created.

- 3. If approved, each lot would be allowed one single family residence, accessory structures and limited ag uses, but no livestock type animal units due to each lot being less than 5 acres.
- 4. The associated certified survey map has not yet been submitted for formal review.
- 5. Per Section 11.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered when deciding a zoning change:
- 1. The petition is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan and the comprehensive plan of any Town affected by said petition.
- Adequate public facilities and services (including sewage and waste disposal, water, gas, electricity, schools, police and fire protection, and roads and transportation, as applicable) will be available as required by the petition while maintaining adequate levels of service to existing development.

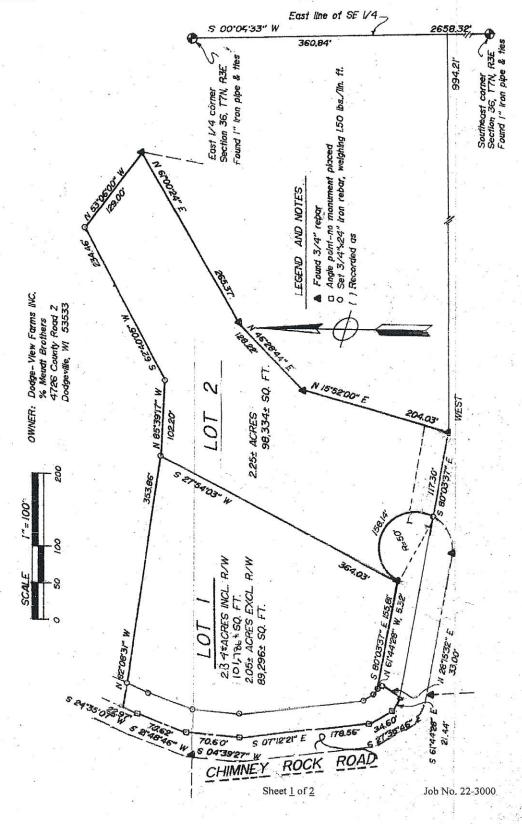

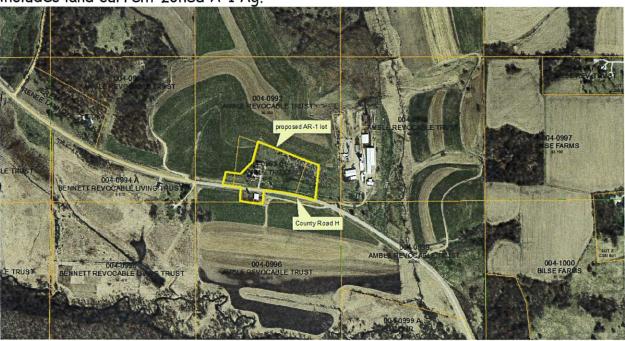

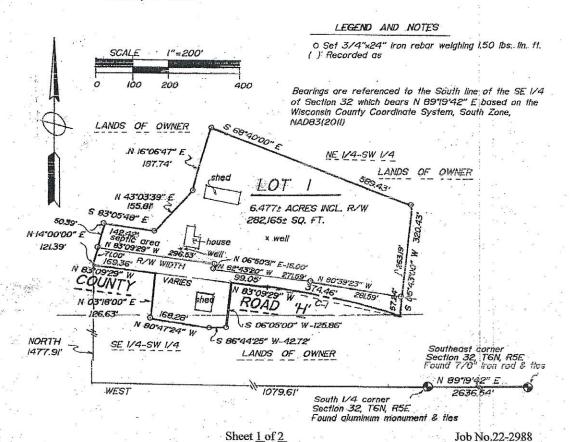

# 8.1 Introduction, Overview, and Existing Land Cover

This element of the Comprehensive Plan contains existing conditions, goals, objectives, policies, and recommendations to guide the future development and redevelopment of public and private property in Brigham. This chapter also explains future land use designations and describes these uses on the Future Land Use Map (located in the appendix See Appendix A – Map 8.4: Future Land Use).

The analysis and consideration of land use issues is among the most critical components of the Town of Brigham Comprehensive Plan. This element was prepared pursuant to Section 66.1001 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

#### 8.1.1 Land Cover

A majority of the land cover in Brigham is forest or grassland, together consisting of 78.7% of land cover. The northern half of the town is mostly forest, and the southern half is mostly a mix of grassland and agricultural land cover. Agriculture covers 18.4% of land in the Town of Brigham (See Appendix A – Map 8.1: Existing Land Cover).

# 8.2 Existing Land Use

#### 8.2.1 Existing Land Use

The majority land use for the Town of Brigham is Agriculture and Rural Density-Based Residential, representing 29,996 acres or 73.77% of land area. There are also large areas (7,311 acres) of conservation lands and lands that are prohibitive to development such as floodplains and wetlands. Approximately 299 acres of commercial areas are interspersed throughout the town, although most commercial land use is adjacent to the Village of Barneveld and the US Highway 18/151 corridor. Potential residential areas in the town are represented on the Existing Land Use Map by areas that have had Certified Survey Maps. These lands account for approximately 3,057 acres, or 7.52% of land area in Brigham (See Chart 8.2.1 below and Appendix A – Map 8.2: Existing Land Use).

Additionally, the town included existing commercial zoned parcels in the Future Land Use map (Map 8.4) to represent a commitment to the existing businesses in the town.

#### 8.2.2 Net Residential Density

The majority of existing land use identifies Agriculture and Rural Density-Based Residential as the prominent land use. As the name of the land use implies, this Comprehensive Plan recommends a density-based approach to residential development. It is recommended that a 20-acre density be utilized in areas identified for Agriculture and Rural Density-Based Residential.

#### 8.2.3 Land Use Trends

The American Community Survey estimated that the town gained 67 housing units between 2010 and 2017. Due to the small population of Brigham, it is likely that this data has some error. A more accurate indicator may be the Wisconsin DOA's *New Residential Building Permit Survey 2010-2017*, which identified 26 building permits that were issued for new residential construction between 2010 and 2017.<sup>28</sup> Most residential units are 1-unit detached. Single-family units remained the dominant housing with over 95% of the total housing units. The number of mobile homes and 2-unit structures was estimated to have increased slightly. The increase in mobile home and 2-unit structures may likely be to error in the estimate or the reclassification of the "category" other.

The following land use issues have been identified and will influence the way the Town of Brigham develops over the next 20 years:

- Between 2010 and 2017, Brigham issued 26 building permits for new residential construction.
- In 2016 and 2017, over 190 acres were converted out of Exclusive Agricultural zoning.
   During that time, 10 new residential buildings were permitted. These statistics were among the highest for all towns in lowa County.<sup>30</sup>
- Physical constraints for future development include steep slopes, wetlands, and floodplains in the town.

#### 8.2.4 Recent Building and Zoning Permits

Brigham has experienced a relatively stable level of new construction since 2012. The following tables show the number of building permits for new residential buildings in 2016 and 2017, and the net new construction since 2012.

#### 8.2.5 Land Divisions

This plan recommends that the town allow 2-acre minimum lot sizes. There are no special provisions for clustered or conservation-style subdivisions within the subdivision code. The town will look to change their current land division ordinance to be consistent with the recommendations in this plan.

#### 8.2.6 Equalized Values

According to the Wisconsin Department of Revenue, in 2018, the equalized value for all property in the town was \$125,118,900. This represents a 15.7% increase in all property equalized value from 2010 (\$108,119,000).

# 8.3 Opportunities for Redevelopment

As with most rural communities without a traditional central business district, there are few opportunities for redevelopment in the traditional sense. However, the quarry located off Reeson Road has been identified as suitable for short-term reclamation and possibly reserved for recreation or other non-intensive uses.

#### 8.4 Land Use Conflicts

A One potential future conflict is the growth of residential development near active agricultural operations. Another potential future conflict is the growth of commercial or industrial development near existing residential development or near active agricultural operations with livestock. A related conflict is the level of services that new residential development will expect from the town, which historically offered a basic level of services consistent with low density and rural development patterns.

There is some need for land conservation entities operating in the town to educate landowners about their activities, plans, and status. Many residents have different opinions about how these organizations operate, and some public education may ease tensions or clarify issues.

# 8.5 Land Use Projections

The Wisconsin Department of Administration DOA projects household growth in the Town of Brigham to increase over the next 20 years. If these estimates hold, Brigham can expect nearly 223 new housing units by year 2040.

With an increase in households, the town can expect increase demand for residential land use. The projected housing demand is shown in Table 8.5.1.

Any non-residential growth would likely be limited to areas surrounding future interchanges, and the planning process will further identify feasibility and public support for such growth. These projections will be updated at that time.

It is likely that most non-residential uses will continue to develop in the Village of Barneveld. Agricultural land is the likely candidate for residential conversion and will decrease slightly with new development.

#### 8.6 Future Land Use Districts

These Future Land Use Categories are used to describe the intent of each district depicted on the Future Land Use Map. Often, they forecast a zoning district or other implementation tool (such as overlay district) to implement the Future Land Use Map.

## 8.6.1 Agriculture and Rural Density-Based Residential Land

This is the majority land use identified in the future land use map. Additionally, this area is subject to a 20-acre residential density standard meant to maintain the rural character of the town.

This is the majority land use identified in the Future Land Use map (see Map 8.4). This land use would largely stay as currently zoned, but any future residential development would be subject to a 20-acre residential density standard meant to maintain the rural character of the town. To clarify, the term "Agriculture" as noted herein and on the Future Land Use map is defined as 'agricultural or forest cropping or livestock pasturing'. This excludes 'agricultural businesses' that require AB-1 zoning, or any other type of business development. (Refer to Section 8.6.3 for a definition of commercial land use.)

#### 8.6.2 Conservation and Environmental Lands

The Conservation and Environmental Land Future Land Use represents managed open spaces that are currently under conservation management or maintain conservation easements that prohibit future development. Much of this land is owned by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources WI DNR. Additionally, wetlands and floodplains are included as environmental lands. These lands are not proposed for future development and are intended to remain free of development.

#### 8.6.3 Commercial Land Use

A Commercial district includes uses that are business related including retail or light industrial. Commercial districts may also include areas of intense commercial development along major transportation routes, close to interchanges. Commercial A would, for the most part, be transparent. These commercial uses would include household occupations allowable in many zoning districts. Commercial B would include structures dedicated to the sale of goods or merchandise for personal or household consumption, such as neighborhood stores. Commercial C would include manufacturing of goods for consumer sale. In many cases these uses may be light industrial in producing products proposed for end users rather than for use by other industries, and include such things as feed mills, carpentry shops, or farm implement dealers. The town has identified an area on the eastern border of the town, along East Brigham Road. The area identified is both to the east and the west of East Brigham Road between US Highway 18/151 and County Road ID. Additionally, the town included existing commercially zoned parcels in the Future Land Use map to represent a commitment to the existing businesses in the town. The Future Land Use map identifies an additional 147 acres of land for future commercial use.

Encourage commercial activities to develop near existing businesses where public roads/facilities and services have capacity to accommodate high volumes of traffic, parking, and other public needs. The anticipating traffic type, volume, and pattern must be compatible with existing public roadways so as not to create a significant safety risk or need for road modification or maintenance at the expense of the Town of Brigham. The preference is for areas of intense business development to be located along major transportation routes or close to interchanges.

The Town's preference for commercial development would include land permitted uses identified under the A-1, B-1, and B-2 in the Iowa County Zoning Ordinances, unless designated therein as not being allowed. To protect active agricultural operations with livestock and residential development, some uses listed in the Iowa County Zoning Ordinances are not permitted in the Town of Brigham, specifically nonmetallic mining (quarries) within 1,000 feet of an active agricultural operation with livestock or a residence, fertilizer plants, and commercial kennels, as listed under the Agricultural Business District. This does not include currently active, permitted businesses which may expand only onto adjacent properties owned as of the effective date of the Comprehensive Plan. In addition, no heavy industrial and manufacturing will be allowed in the Town of Brigham as listed in the B-4 and B-5 Business Districts in the lowa County Zoning Ordinances because of the absence of Town of Brigham sewer or public water facilities to serve such heavy industrial and manufacturing uses. While the land uses in the B-3 District are allowed in the Town of Brigham, they are restricted to one quarter section on either side of East Brigham Road between US Highway 18/151 and County Road ID (previously designated as a Commercial Overlay District on the Future Land Use Map).

Businesses that produce or utilize hazardous, volatile, or other substances deemed a potential threat to public health and safety, whether by design or as a by-product, are discouraged unless there are credible measures put in place for mitigating the potential impacts. The State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) WI DNR, United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA), and other governing agency guidelines and standards should be evaluated before these types of developments are considered.

Recommendations to Iowa County on land use changes and Conditional Use Permits shall start with the Town of Brigham Plan Commission reviewing for consistency with this plan and action

taken by the Town Board. As part of reviewing commercial development proposals, landowners or developers will be required to submit an impact statement assessing in detail the proposed project's impact on adjacent properties and town resources developments shall be subject to site plan review per the Town's Building Site Regulations Ordinance (Ordinance 4.06). The results of such an impact assessment must prove positive benefits to the community before such development will be permitted. Refer to Section 8.6.3.2 for Impact Plan Requirements.

#### 8.6.3.1 Commercial Development Corridor

The Town has identified a Commercial Development Corridor within the town to support this strategy. This Commercial Development Corridor includes lands along US Highway 18/151, starting at the Dane/lowa County line on the east end extending west (excluding the Village of Barneveld) to the Brigham/Ridgeway town line on the west end. This corridor includes all of the lands north and south of the centerline of US Highway 18/151 for two quarter sections. Within this Commercial Development Corridor, the density standard does not apply if the land is zoned as business. Specific land uses within this corridor would range from agriculture, residential, and recreation to business, commercial, and light industrial. Land uses south of US Highway 18/151 and west of Barneveld will be more specifically defined as infrastructure is built and areas of development are started.

Since County Highway ID, located north of US Highway 18/151 and east of Barneveld, falls within the boundaries of the Development Corridor, business development in this area will require more stringent restrictions so as to not cause conflict with the existing residential and agricultural properties on the north side of County Highway ID. This may include, but is not limited to, locating businesses closer to US Highway 18/151, giving preference to professional service businesses (i.e. – attorneys, engineers, medical, insurance, etc.), limiting lumen levels of lighting beyond property borders, minimizing noise, and restricting building heights to avoid obstruction of viewscapes.

Some uses listed in the Iowa County Zoning Ordinances are not permitted in the Development Corridor of the Town of Brigham because of the detrimental impact of these uses upon active agricultural operations with livestock and residential development, specifically nonmetallic mining (quarries) within 1,000 feet of an active agricultural operation with livestock or a residence, fertilizer plants, and commercial kennels, as listed under the Agricultural Business District. This does not include currently active, permitted businesses which may expand only onto adjacent properties owned as of the effective date of the Comprehensive Plan. In addition, because of the absence of Town of Brigham public sewer and public water facilities to serve such uses, no heavy industrial and manufacturing will be allowed in the Town of Brigham as listed in the B-4 and B-5 Business Districts in the Iowa County Zoning Ordinances. While the land uses in the B-3 District are allowed in the Town of Brigham, they are restricted to one quarter section on either side of East Brigham Road between US Highway 18/151 and County Road ID (previously designated as a Commercial Overlay District on the Future Land Use Map).

#### 8.6.3.2 Commercial Impact Statement

When considering an individual commercial development, the Town of Brigham will take into account the consistency with, and impact on, existing legal uses in the area. As part of reviewing such development proposals, the individual or entity proposing a commercial development shall prepare in writing for the Town's review, a comprehensive Impact Plan and Business Statement outlining the specific affects the proposed development might reasonably be expected to have on the Town and its residents. The Impact Plan shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- 1. Hours and days of operation.
- Opportunities for employment.
- 3. Estimated number of patrons, customers, and clients during an established period of time.
- 4. Amount of additional traffic to be expected on local Town and Country roads.
- 5. Amount of foreseeable for publicly provided services or expanded infrastructure use, including but not limited to roads, utilities, and emergency services.
- 6. Anticipated need for heavy machinery and/or equipment, the amount, and whether the machinery and/or equipment would have regular use of local roadways.
- 7. Impact of local tax revenue in relation to the additional public costs of the proposed venture.
- 8. Impact on Town farms, farmland, natural resources, scenic qualities, and the overall environment.
- The Plan Commission may request other aspects or attributes of the commercial development, or the business proposed to be operated, that potentially might affect the Town, the County, or their residents.
- 10. Businesses should not be in conflict with existing adjacent properties, and a buffer strip may be required between commercial and residential properties. Submit a plan for a buffer strip if required.
- 11. Lighting plan, to include the following:
  - a. Shielding the light source.

All exterior light sources greater than 1,000 lumens must be shielded so that the light source is not visible from any point higher than an angle 4" above the horizontal. This means that if your eye is above the fixture, you should not be able to see glare from the light source or lens.

In most cases, meeting this provision means that a light source must be enclosed in a nonadjustable shield that is aimed downward. Exterior lighting that is mounted underneath an eave or soffit may also meet the definition of shielded, if light from the source does not rise more than four degrees above the horizontal.

#### b. Preventing light trespass.

Light trespass (from any number of light sources) cannot exceed 0.5 footcandle. The illumination amount (in footcandles) must be measured using a light meter, either at a point ten feet past the adjoining property line, or at a point four feet above the ground (or higher) on an occupied structure.

There cannot be a direct line of sight between other property and a light source (or it's reflector) on your property, such that glare from the light source would cause discomfort or annoyance on the other property.

- 12. Noise abatement plan, if needed.
- 13. Building size (under 20,000 sf is recommended) and building height.
- 14. Proposed signage.

In addition to the Impact Plan, the Town will review an application to ensure it complies with the following:

- The proposed development will be limited to areas where the rural nature and agricultural characteristics of the Town are not adversely affected.
- Development that minimally conflicts with neighboring farming operations and agricultural production will be favored.
- Development shall not substantially, inhibit, or otherwise affect the use and enjoyment of neighboring properties. A developer shall propose ways to mitigate any issues/conflicts raised by adjacent neighbors.
- Development shall be such that emergency access is available to all portions of the property used in the commercial development.
- Proposed development shall not disturb or otherwise adversely affect historic or archaeological sites or endangered or threatened species, and shall not disrupt, disturb, or destroy any critical or unique natural features of the site. To ensure compliance with these criteria, the developer/applicant will provide verification from appropriate governing agencies (i.e. WI DNR, US EPA, etc.). The enforcement may lie outside the Town and County.

# 8.7 Land Goals & Objectives

Goals and objectives identify what the plan should accomplish. Goals are statements that describe a desired future condition, often in general terms. Objectives are statements that describe a specific future condition to be attained, to reach the established goals. This plan provides brief goal(s) followed by an objective statement.

#### 8.7.1 Protect Rights of Landowners and Residents

The town will utilize consistent policies and procedures, which are fair to all landowners and residents and encourage a sense of community among these individuals, while preserving public health, welfare, and the town's character. Landowners, residents, and town officials will work together, using the comprehensive plan and ordinances, to enable orderly development, while assuring taxes received and services provided are in balance.

#### 8.7.2 Follow and Implement this Comprehensive Plan

Recognizing the hard work and dedication of numerous groups, individuals, and organizations, this comprehensive plan shall be implemented to realize the desired improvements. Development decisions will be consistent with the adopted plan, as required by State Statutes. Where recommended by this plan, the Brigham Town Board will update ordinances, assign tasks, or develop ad hoc committees to increase the likelihood of successful goal achievement, protection of residents' rights, preservation of land values and aesthetic appeal, and satisfactory delivery of town services in an efficient and cost-effective manner. A procedure for reviewing

and then amending this plan is provided within the plan in order to keep the document current and usable.

#### 8.8 Land Use Policies & Recommendations

Recommendations identify the action necessary to achieve goals and objectives. For this reason, recommendations should be actionable, attainable, and specific. Not all recommendations can be achieved in the short-term, so they should be specific enough so that any individual or group wishing to achieve a stated goal can take action.

The following recommendations were jointly developed by the Town of Brigham Plan Commission and its consultants.

- Restrict building in wetlands, shoreland areas, and floodplains (per state statutes and county codes).
- Allow up to four (4) land divisions per parent property every five (5) years, being the act of subdividing larger property to create a new parcel, lot, or tract of land that is less than 40 acres. A parent property shall be that tract of land as described on a recorded deed on file with lowa County Register of Deeds prior to the effective date of this plan. The 5-year time period is intended to require a minimum of five (5) years between the effective date of a second land division of a parent property. Any dispute over alleged building sites or rights transferred with divided property shall be resolved by the affected property owners, not the town, and shall be resolved prior to town action on any request impacting any such property.
- Consider commercial development in coordination with the Future Land Use Map. Update standards for this exception within the Building Site Regulations (Ordinance 4.01) to enable.
- Discourage development on steep slopes. Require special mitigation techniques for development on slopes greater than 20%.
- Allow 2-acre minimum lot size for new residential lots.
- Prohibit new subdivisions defined as land divisions creating five (5) or more parcels or building sites within a 5-year period.
- Encourage new development to follow conservation-based guidelines:
  - o Provide vegetative buffers between building sites and sensitive environmental areas.
  - Preserve mature trees, vegetation, and other attributes that relate to the site's history or natural character.
  - Restore degraded environmental areas, such as streams, prairies, and wetlands.
  - Encourage Best Management Practices (BMPs) for stormwater management and erosion control.
- Institute a 20-acre density standard.
- Require a "Concept Plan" from anyone applying for a land division (defined as creating a
  lot less than 40 acres) for residential development. The Concept Plan shall be submitted
  to the Town Plan Commission and Board for review and approval. The Concept Plan shall

stay with the land, not the landowner, and shall only be modified when approved by both the landowner and the town.

Allow one (1) residential land division for parcels created prior to February 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019, that
are greater than 10 acres but less than 40 acres.
