8. PRTC Financial Report – Kurt Schafer, Treasurer.

Schafer presented the cash flow and balance statement from the third quarter of 2022. There was one check for \$1,800 for Q3 management.

Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and payment of bills. Anderson/Ladewig. Passed Unanimously.

### 9. Wisconsin & Southern Railroad's Report on Operations – Ken Lucht– WSOR

Lucht stated WSOR received a grant to assist in bridge replacements on the Monroe Subdivision. The bridges are near Hanover Road (1), a bridge near Orfordville (2), and a bridge near Monroe (3). The grant was for \$2M and WSOR expects the bridges to come in well over budget and will be bidding it this winter. At the January meeting, WSOR will be presenting the project and possibly asking for assistance from the Commission. Lucht hopes for some relief in steel prices. Negotiations are ongoing with Union Pacific to assist with the Janesville Bridge project. WSOR and WisDOT received a \$6.8M federal grant to address these bridges being underrated and bottlenecking the entire south system of WSOR. Lucht stated Union Pacific wants to keep the trackage but lease it to WSOR.

11. Tri-County Trail Commission Report – Flannery, TCTC.

2. PRTC Administrator's Report - Honer, Admin.

13. Update and Possible Action on Private Crossing License near Browntown, WI. - Honer, Admin.

Honer presented the private crossing agreement and explained the applicant would like to have permitted access to cross the trail and install a walkway to an existing set of stairs. Larson asked about the precedent of the Commission providing these types of agreements. Honer stated the Commission has attempted to address any private access or use of the trail corridor through either a private crossing agreement or an offer-to-use

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agreement. The Commission discussed that the applicant is seeking a footpath which is allowed use of a recreational trail, however, the applicant is also seeking a pallet walkway and staircase. The Commission discussed not allowing the improvements (pallet walkway and staircase) to be permanent.

- Motion to approve the private crossing license with the change to ensure the pallet walkway is unaffixed. Ladewig/Larson.
