Supervisor Peterson asked if smaller lot meets standards. Director Godfrey said it meets the minimum lot width and acreage.

Supervisor Gollon asked if there will be adequate area on the smaller lot for a septic system and replacement area. Director Godfrey replied a soil test has been filed identifying both.

Supervisor Leix asked if both lots will share the same access to the road. Director Godfrey replied they will with the smaller lot by easement.

Mr. Olson was present.

Director Godfrey gave the staff report.

Motion carries unanimously.

13. Petition by Wildwood Whitetails LLC c/o Scott Faust for a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Tourist Cottage on a 16.8-acre B-2 Hwy Bus lot in the NE/SE of S11-T7N-R3E in the Town of Wyoming.

Mr. Scott Faust was present representing Wildwood Whitetails LLC.

Director Godfrey gave the staff report.

Supervisor Gollon stated his concern over the potential staff time and resources necessary to enforce the conditions recommended by the Town.

#### Public Comment:

- Randy Manning spoke on behalf of Jeff Jacobson stated this matter was not heard by the Town Plan Commission as required by the Town's comprehensive plan and requested it be sent back to the Town. Mr. Manning further requested that the existing uses allowed by Conditional Use Permit be rescinded if this new use is approved and suggested the lot should be zoned AR-1 Ag Res with a Conditional Use Permit for the Tourist Cottage considered to more consistent with the surrounding zoning.
- Mike Degen spoke as a Town of Wyoming Supervisor and Chair of the Town Plan Commission stating he had been working closely with the applicant on this matter and made the recommendation that it go to the Board, which has been a past practice.
- Mr. Faust stated he has owned the property for about 15 years, owns all land around the B-2 lot except across the road, and feels there is value to keeping the B-2 zoning. He added Mr. Jacobson has multiple rental houses in the valley, none of which has the conditions being proposed by the Town.

Supervisor Masters asked for clarification if this matter was heard by the Town plan commission. Mr. Degen responded that, as Chair of the commission, he recommended it to go to the Town Board for action.

Supervisor Gollon stated he has no issue with the proposed short-term rental use but doesn't like the number of conditions being proposed.

Supervisor Peterson asked Mr. Faust if renters will be required to sign a rental agreement acknowledging the conditions. Mr. Faust replied they will and that he has experience in renting properties so will be actively enforcing the policies.

Motion by Supervisor Gollon to approve with the following conditions:

- No Fireworks
- No use of any recreational vehicles, such as but not limited to ATV /UTV vehicles, etc. by renters is allowed
- No parties or events
- Maximum number of guests will not exceed the septic system design capacity based on 2 persons per bedroom
- Person booking the property must be 25 years of age
- No target shooting of firearms by the renters
- Quiet hours after 10:30 pm on rentals
- A map of the property boundaries will be included in all rental orientation packages
- Rules will be posted in the house as well as online for all rentals
- One housing unit of no more than two stories on the footprint of the current dwelling
- Dark sky lighting on the new building
- The Conditional Use Permit shall terminate upon the sale of the property including the structure used as a Tourist Cottage

Second by Supervisor Lease Motion carries unanimously.

14. Motion to end the public hearings and resume the regular meeting.

Motion by Supervisor Leix Second by Supervisor Masters Motion carries unanimously.

15. Discussion of Conditional Use Permit compliance per ZH2855 affecting Scenic Sales LLC at 6530 US Highway 14 in the Town of Arena.

Director Godfrey gave the staff report.

Attorney James Graham, appearing by Zoom, spoke on behalf of the property owners, Mr. and Mrs. Durrer. He stated their intention is to sell the property and Mr. Bertrang, the owner of the auto business, is the logical first to have that option. He added Mr. Bertrang is currently seeking financing.

Supervisor Leix asked for the history of the property to which Director Godfrey summarized.

David Lucey, Chair of the Town of Arena, stated the Town is interested in having the rear part of the property cleaned up quickly as it has been a constant source of complaints.

Supervisor Peterson asked why a salvage yard hasn't been contacted to take away the junked vehicles. Mr. Bertrang replied stating it is difficult to remove vehicles in the winter and he is planning to do so now that the weather has improveded.

Supervisor Leix asked how long Mr. Bertrang has operated at the site and if he is aware of the imposed conditions. Mr. Bertrang responded he has been at the site since 2008 or 2009 and is aware of the conditions.

Supervisor Gollon made a motion to schedule a public hearing for April to consider suspending or revoking the Conditional Use Permit

Second by Supervisor Masters

Motion carries unanimously.

16. Discussion of the current provisions of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance and potential revisions.

Director overviewed the potential revisions included in the packet. The consensus of the Committee was to:

- a) Revise the definition of "camping unit" to read: Any portable device, no more than 400 square feet in area, used as a temporary shelter, including but not limited to a camping trailer, motor home, bus, van, pick-up truck, or tent.
- b) Maintain the status quo on the use of camping units outside approved campgrounds as listed in Section 2.3 of the zoning ordinance.
- c) Consider a minimum of standards to be imposed on proposals of short-term rental uses.
- 17. Report from the committee members and an opportunity for members of the audience to address the Committee. No action will be taken.

Supervisor Leix stated his support for the committee to review resolutions relating to wind and solar energy systems passed by Clark and Columbia counties at a future meeting. Supervisor Peterson was agreeable.

Kathy Ladd presented a handout suggesting revisions to the county's wind siting ordinance. Supervisor Peterson stated this committee has twice decided not to include all the provisions of PSC128 in the county ordinance due to the staffing it would require to administer and that it would only apply to systems under 100 megawatts.

Rick Zemlicka said he supports Mrs. Ladd's proposals.

Request: This is a request to zone 30.0 acres from A-1 Ag to AR-1 Ag Res.



#### 2. Comments

- 1. The existing 30-acre lot is currently nonconforming due to not meeting the minimum 40-acre lot size for the A-1 district. The proposal is to make it conform by rezoning to the AR-1 district, which doesn't require 40 acres.
- 2. If approved, the lot would allow one single family residence, accessory buildings and limited ag uses, including up to 11 animal units as defined by the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance.
- 3. There is no associated certified survey map as this lot was created prior to that requirement.
- **4.** Per Section 11.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered when deciding a zoning change:

- 1) The petition is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan and the comprehensive plan of any Town affected by said petition.
- 2) Adequate public facilities and services (including sewage and waste disposal, water, gas, electricity, schools, police and fire protection, and roads and transportation, as applicable) will be available as required by the petition while maintaining adequate levels of service to existing development.
- 3) Provisions of public facilities to accommodate the petition will not place an unreasonable burden on the ability of affected local units of government to provide the.
- 4) The petition will not result in significant adverse impacts upon surrounding properties or the natural environment, including air, water, noise, stormwater management, soils, wildlife and vegetation.
- 5) The land associated with the petition is suitable for the proposed development and said development will not cause unreasonable soil erosion or have an unreasonable adverse effect on rare or irreplaceable natural areas.
- 6) The petition will not be used to legitimize a nonconforming use or structure.
- 7) The petition is the minimum action necessary to accomplish the intent of the petition, and an administrative adjustment, variance, or Conditional Use Permit could not be used to achieve the same result.
- 8) The petition will not result in illegal "spot zoning" (i.e. use is inconsistent with surrounding properties and serves only a private, rather than public interest).

**Town Recommendation**: The Town of Arena has reviewed and is recommending approval.

Request: This is a request to zone 3.83 acres from A-1 Ag to C-1 Conservancy.



# 2. Comments

- This 3.83-acre lot was created when Mr. Nelson sold property to Messrs.
  Lyght & Hastings simply because it only touches the rest of the formers'
  land at a point, thus not being legally contiguous.
- 2. The A-1 district has a minimum 40-acre lot size so the 3.83 acres either requires rezoning or additional land be transferred to create contiguity.

- 3. If approved, the C-1 lot would allow open space uses but no development that requires a county permit. The majority of the lot is encumbered by mapped wetland and shoreland zoning, which would prohibit most development.
- 4. The associated certified survey map has been submitted for formal review.
- 5. Per Section 11.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered when deciding a zoning change:
  - 1) The petition is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan and the comprehensive plan of any Town affected by said petition.
  - 2) Adequate public facilities and services (including sewage and waste disposal, water, gas, electricity, schools, police and fire protection, and roads and transportation, as applicable) will be available as required by the petition while maintaining adequate levels of service to existing development.
  - 3) Provisions of public facilities to accommodate the petition will not place an unreasonable burden on the ability of affected local units of government to provide the.
  - 4) The petition will not result in significant adverse impacts upon surrounding properties or the natural environment, including air, water, noise, stormwater management, soils, wildlife and vegetation.

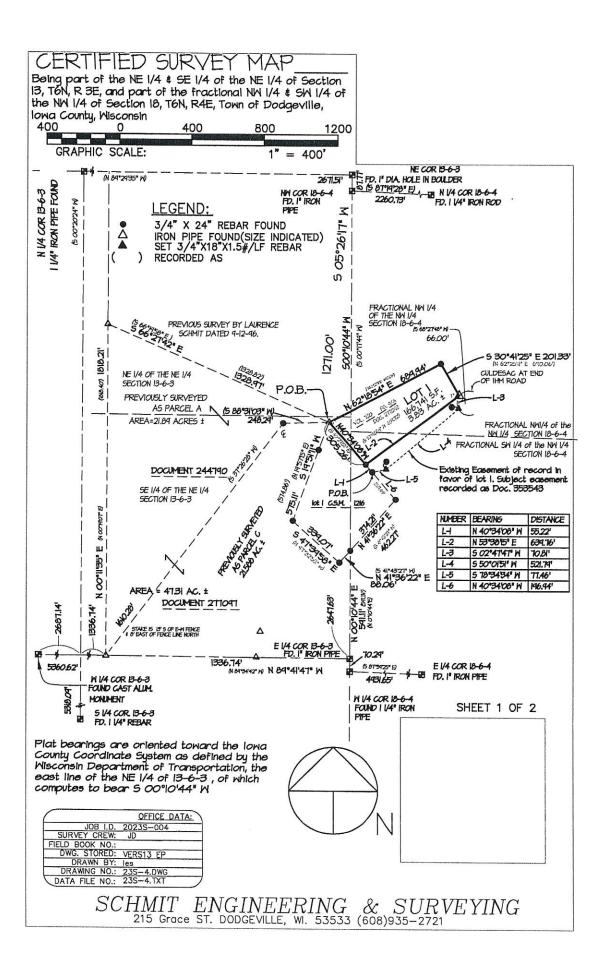

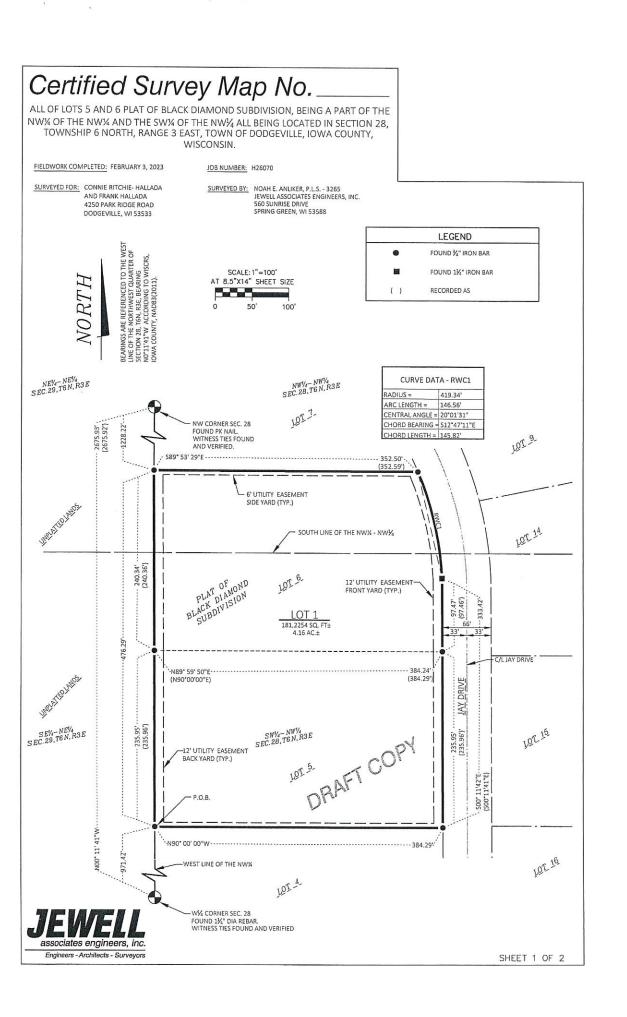

#### 2. Comments

- This is a continuation from January at which time action was postponed for up to 90 days to provide time for the Town of Eden to make a formal recommendation.
- 2. The petition includes allowing up to 3 horses on the lot.
- 3. The lot is the result of the division of an AR-1 Ag Res lot by foreclosure that hasn't yet been validated with the required CUP.
- The applicant has a State breeder license but the operation requires zoning approval.

**5**. The operation is considered a "Residential Kennel" as defined in the county's zoning ordinance as follows with the required standards:

#### Residential Kennel

Includes the breeding and/or rearing, of between 3 and 6 dogs or cats combined owned by the owner of the affected property, in association with the residential or agricultural principal use of the land and related buildings or structures. A litter of pups or kittens, kept for less than 6 months from birth shall not contribute to the number limit, provided there is not more than a single litter per year per species, not animal, on the premises. This use may not include training, boarding, grooming, sales of food, or sales of supplies. Does not include commercial kennels as defined in this Ordinance. Exceeding the animal number limits may be considered by conditional use permit provided all use standards listed below are complied with.

#### Use standards:

- a) All dogs and cats must be licensed by the appropriate town if the town maintains a licensing requirement, and regardless, the use shall be subject to all applicable town, county, and state regulations.
- b) The animals shall be securely detained on the applicant's property, whether by fencing, leash, restraint, or other humane means.
- c) Outdoor dog runs or exercise pens shall have the following setbacks:
  - i. located at least 20 feet from a lot line
  - ii. located at least 200 feet from an existing legal residence or other structure occupied at least 51% of the time on adjacent property this setback may be reduced if the adjacent property owner agrees in writing There are 3 residences within 200 feet of the applicant's lot line. An exercise pen or run in the westerly part of the applicant's lot can meet this setback.
- d) No excessive barking, cries, howling, or other noise shall be permitted. The term "excessive barking, cries, howling or other noise" includes but is not limited to the creation of any noise by a dog or cat that can be heard at the property line by any person and that occurs continuously or incessantly for a period of ten continuous minutes or intermittently for thirty minutes or more, except in instances where it can be demonstrated that such noise was associated with a person trespassing or threatening to trespass upon the private property where the kennel is situated or in instances where the animals are being teased or provoked.
- e) All pens, yards, structures or areas where animals are kept shall be maintained in a nuisance free manner. Droppings and manure shall be removed and disposed of properly so not to attract insects or rodents, become unsightly or cause objectionable odors.
- f) The lot or parcel size shall be considered as to whether adequate in size for the proposed use and its proximity to adjacent legal uses for potential negative impacts.
- a) The limit of dogs or cats can be limited where a conditional use permit is required if the limitation is to mitigate potential negative impacts to adjacent legal land uses or due to the subject lot or parcel size.
- b) Within any farmland preservation zoning district, such uses shall be subject to the following limitations: Not applicable
  - i. Be conducted by the owners or operators of the farm and employ not more than four additional persons

- ii. Require no buildings, structures, or improvements other than a preexisting farm residence, an agricultural accessory structure, or both
- iii. Not impair the current or future agricultural use of the farm or of the other farmland within the farmland preservation district

# 4. Per Section 4.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered for a CUP:

- 1) The proposed use complies with all applicable provisions of this Ordinance.

Lot division: approval of the lot division as it has already been done and the resulting lot meets minimum requirements

Animal Units: most resources recommend between 1.5-2 acres of land to support an adult horse - the applicant is requesting the allowance for 3 horses on 1.13 acres - staff would recommend approval only if the horses have access to the applicant's neighboring parents' land and would terminate if the access no longer exists

Residential Kennel: There is adequate area on the lot where the kennel can be located to meet the minimum 200-foot setback to a neighboring residence. Since there are 3 residences within 200 feet of the applicant's lot, any approval should include noise insulation. There should be consideration of a condition setting a maximum number of dogs given the small size of the lot. There should be consideration of a condition requiring ongoing compliance with the Iowa County Regulations of Dogs and Animal Control Ordinance as administered by the Iowa County Sheriff's Office and maintenance of any required State license or permit.

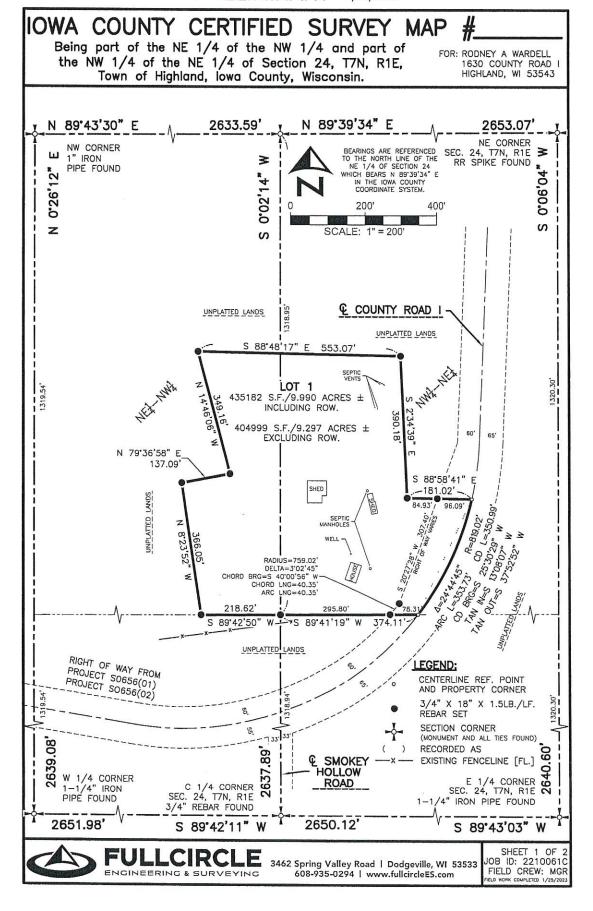

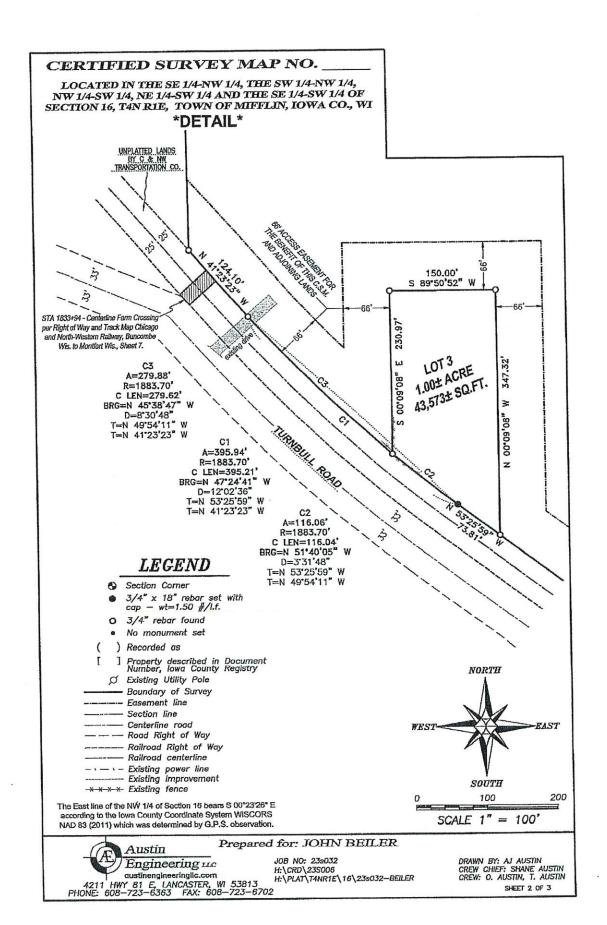

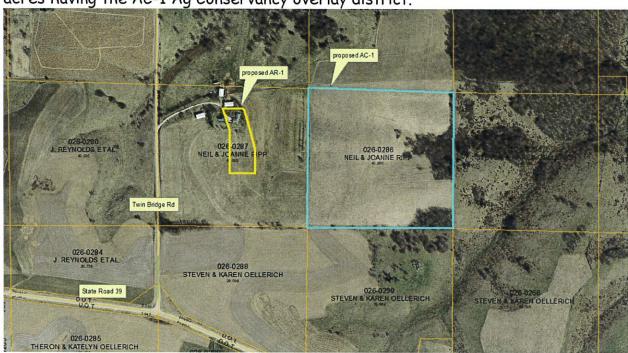

#### 2. Comments

- The A-1 district has a minimum 40-acre lot size, so rezoning is required in order for the proposed 3-acre lot to be legally created. The AC-1 overlay is required by the Town of Waldwick's 1:40 residential density standard.
- 2. If approved, the AR-1 lot would allow one single family residence, accessory structures and limited ag uses, but no animal units as defined by the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance. The AC-1 overlay district prohibits any development that would require a zoning permit.
- 3. The associated certified survey map has been submitted for formal review.

## **4.** Per Section 11.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance, the following standards are to be considered when deciding a zoning change:

- The petition is consistent with the Iowa County Comprehensive Plan and the comprehensive plan of any Town affected by said petition.
- 10) Adequate public facilities and services (including sewage and waste disposal, water, gas, electricity, schools, police and fire protection, and roads and transportation, as applicable) will be available as required by the petition while maintaining adequate levels of service to existing development.
- 11) Provisions of public facilities to accommodate the petition will not place an unreasonable burden on the ability of affected local units of government to provide the.
- 12) The petition will not result in significant adverse impacts upon surrounding properties or the natural environment, including air, water, noise, stormwater management, soils, wildlife and vegetation.
- 13) The land associated with the petition is suitable for the proposed development and said development will not cause unreasonable soil erosion or have an unreasonable adverse effect on rare or irreplaceable natural areas.
- 14) The petition will not be used to legitimize a nonconforming use or structure.
- 15) The petition is the minimum action necessary to accomplish the intent of the petition, and an administrative adjustment, variance, or Conditional Use Permit could not be used to achieve the same result.
- 16) The petition will not result in illegal "spot zoning" (i.e. use is inconsistent with surrounding properties and serves only a private, rather than public interest).

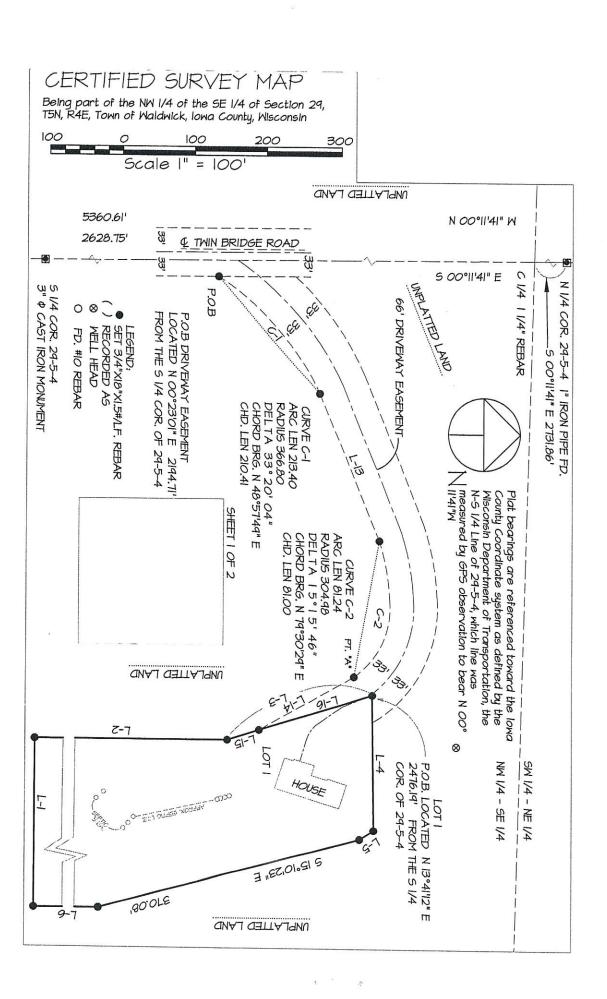

Agenda Item 14: Consideration to suspend, modify or revoke the Conditional Use Permit granted per ZH2103 and modified per ZH2855 that allows used vehicles sales with conditions on a B-2 Highway Business lot being parcel 002-1043.AA in the Town of Arena as provided for in Section 4.0 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance.

#### Background:

- In 2017 per ZH2855, the Conditional Use Permit for said property (PIN 002-1043.AA) was reviewed for possible suspension or revocation due to alleged noncompliance with conditions imposed in past hearings.
- The Committee provided 30 days to bring the property into full compliance or the CUP would be automatically suspended. Compliance will require:
  - a) A maximum of 80 units for sale on the property, which includes a car, truck, trailer, motorcycle, lawnmower, boat or camper intended for sale
  - b) All dismantled or no-running vehicles must be removed from the property or stored inside a building
  - c) Dismantling of vehicles must be done inside a building
  - d) From this date forward, any vehicle requiring repair in order to be made saleable within 60 days or must be either stored inside a building or removed from the property. Not complying with this condition shall cause immediate suspension of the conditional use permit.
- In response to neighbor complaints, the Committee decided on December 9, 2022 to provide up to 90 days for the new owner and business operator to work out if the land was to be sold and how to bring the property into compliance.
- On March 23, 2023 the Committee decided to hold a public hearing to consider action under Section 4.4 of the Iowa County Zoning Ordinance which states:

Any conditional use permit may be revoked if it is found that the use is not being conducted in compliance with the plans and specifications submitted with the application and as subsequently approved, or if the use is being conducted in violation of the conditions imposed at approval. The revocation process shall

involve the Committee holding a public hearing after providing written notice to the permittee of the conditional use permit citing the violation or compliance issues with the permit. Once notified in writing by the County, the permittee shall be allowed to present evidence on his/her behalf in writing and may attend the public hearing to provide testimony. After the public hearing, the Committee may revoke or modify the conditional use permit.

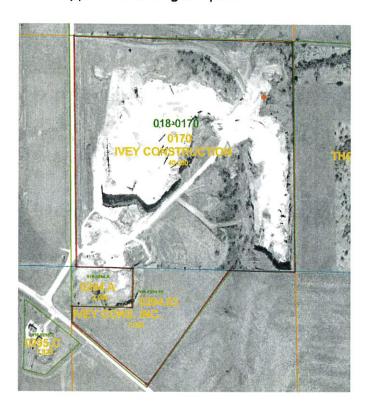

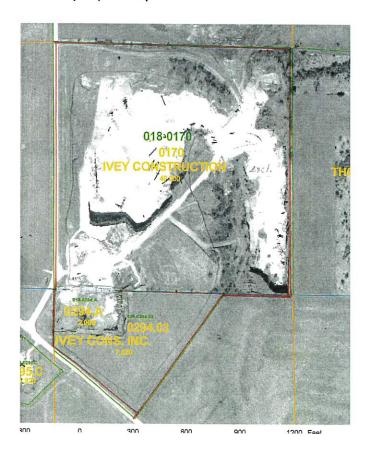

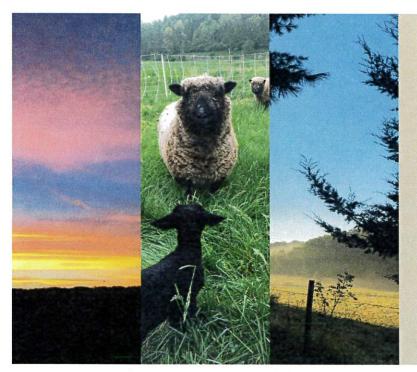
#### Request for Temporary Use Permit Iowa County Planning & Zoning Committee

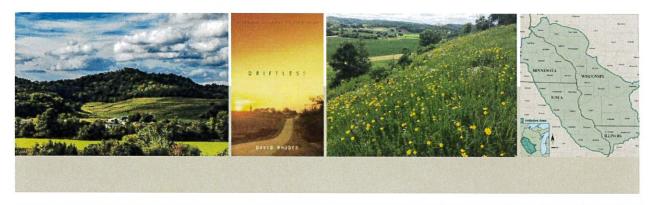
## Wisconsin's Architectural Gems: Frank Lloyd Wright

Frank Lloyd Wright was an American architect, designer, writer, and educator. He designed 1000+ structures over a creative period of 70 years. Wright played a key role in the architectural movements of the twentieth century, influencing architects worldwide through his work based in Wisconsin. Wright was the pioneer of the Prairie School movement of architecture.

## The Driftless

The Driftless area is a large peninsula of land, mostly located in Southwest Wisconsin, that went unglaciated throughout the last glacial period, which occurred 10,000 years ago. The region's distinctive terrain is due to its having been bypassed by the last continental glacier. The word "driftless' simply refers to the fact that this area lacks glacial drifts.

The Driftless Area geography is characterized by its steep, rugged landscape, and by the largest concentration of cold water streams in the world. The absence of glaciers gave the rivers time to cut deeply into the ancient bedrock and create the distinctive landforms. <u>Karst topography</u> is found throughout the Driftless area. This is characterized by <u>caves</u> and cave systems, <u>disappearing streams</u>, <u>blind valleys, underground streams</u>, <u>sinkholes</u>, <u>springs</u>, and cold streams. characterized by shallow limestone bedrock, caves, sinkholes, springs, and cold streams.

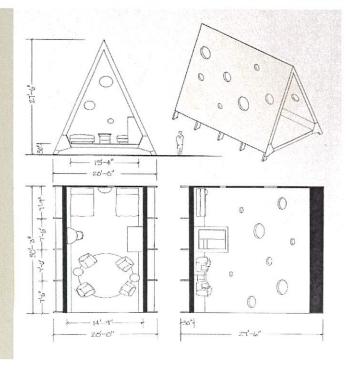


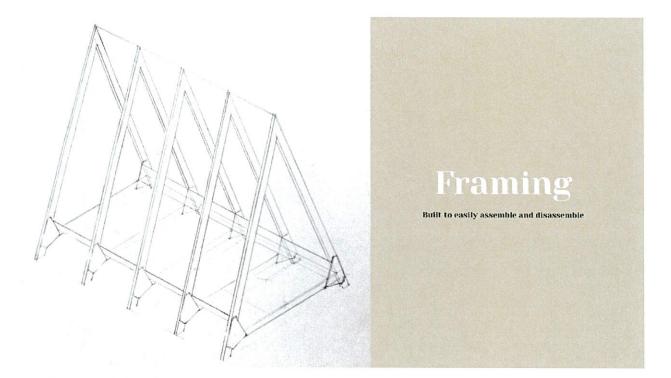




## OMG! Cheese Wedge Cabins

Inspired by Robin Falck, the Finnish industrial designers award winning 'Nolla' Cabin, these cabins will be a fun take on the original design. Instead of looking sleek and modern they will be painted and decorated to resemble large wedges of cheese - celebrating Wisconsin's heritage as the cheese capital of the U.S. Bull with sustainably harvested wood from responsibly managed forests these cabins will sit nestled on an organic sheep farm, in a little valley.

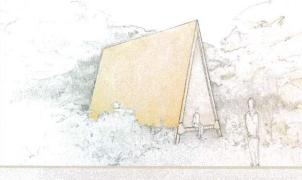




## Locations

Just like the original Nolla cabin, these cheese wedge cabins will be built to be easily disassembled and moved to new locations, giving variety to guests and lightening the footprint on the land by rotating the cabin locations each year. Cabins will be named after and designed to look like wedges of award-winning, local artisan cheeses. While a 1th farm guests can lear a about the regenerative agriculture practices that are used and about the re-wilding projects that are underway. They can also enjoy cheese tasting and cheese making Airbnb experiencies. The immediate area has many artisan cheese makers, organic farmers and other artisans and artists and is a popular area for tourists, attracting visitors from Chicago, Minneapolis and beyond.

The profits from the cheese cabins will be used for habitat restoration projects on the 34 acre farm and will help support the continuation of the heritage breed of south down sheep, the breed is on the 'watch' list for conservation and so the flock is being managed to help restore the breeds numbers.











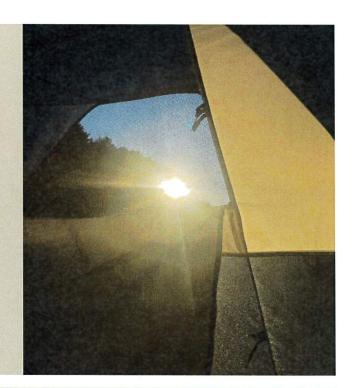


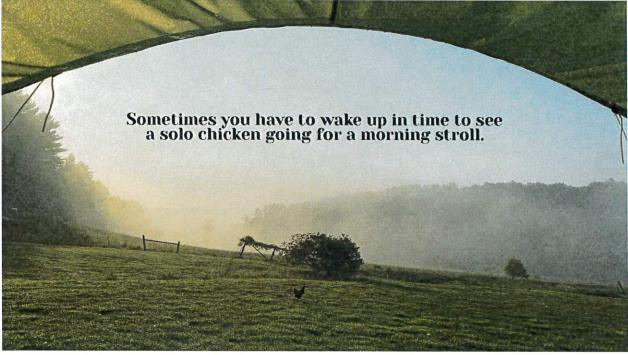


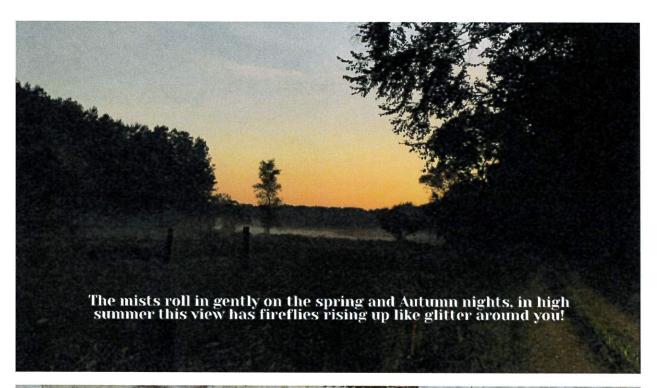
Our Farm

Old English Southdowns are a smaller heritage breed. They were on the 'endangered' list, now they have recovered enough to be on a 'watch' list.





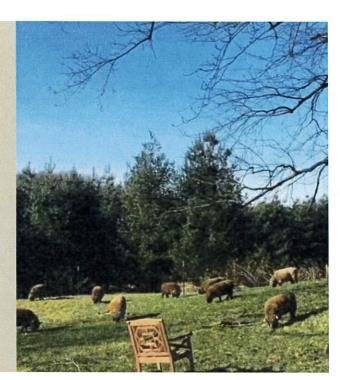




Our Farm

I started off rotationally grazing the sheep, but when they'd escape they ran for forage in the woods and in the verges, I realised these sheep want to eat more than the same type of grass everyday - so I began letting them free range and the flock health is the best it's ever been. They self treat; if they need something specific they go find it!

The sheep are free to range and the humans are free to pull up a chair and watch!





Wisconsin Cheese

Dairy farm families have been a part of Wisconsin for over 180 years. Today Wisconsin is home to nearly a quarter of the nation's total dairy farms, 95% of which are family owned.

Wisconsin choesemakers use about 90% of Wisconsin's milk supply to make more than 3 billion pounds of cheese every year. Wisconsin has 1290 licensed cheesemakers-more than any other state.

Wisconsin is a world of cheese in just one state, crafting more than 600 different varieties, types, and styles of cheese making up 50% of the nation's specialty cheese and 25% of the nation's everyday cheese.

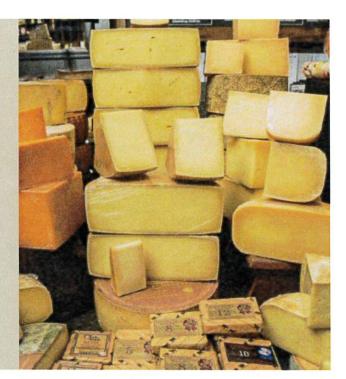
It is also the only state to offer a master cheesemaker program, which is based on the rigorous standards of similar programs in Europe.

With the healthy combination of fertile land and a balanced climate, milk production excels. And Wisconsin's milk is not only impressive in terms of quantity, but also in quality.

The state has lost about 40,000 dairy farms over the last four decades. And that decline continues as we are losing about one farm per day.

In addition to their well documented history of animal abuse, corporate confracted CAFOs (confined animal leeding operations) have pushed smaller farms out of business at a breakneck pace. Keeping thousands of cows in massive concrete sheds and mechanically feeding them grain is chapper than letting them graze on grass and live freely. Which takes more time, care and human expertise.

Agritourism represents a new hope and is a growing segment of Wisconsin's economy organisations like the Wisconsin Aericultural Tourism Association are dedicated to growing the movement, in order to help families stay on the farms they cherish.

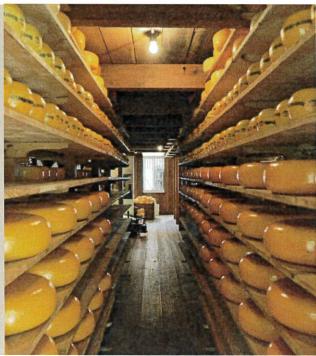


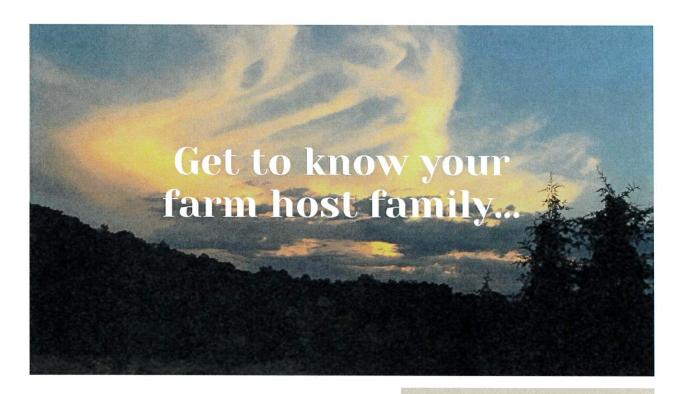

# Why HeartSong?

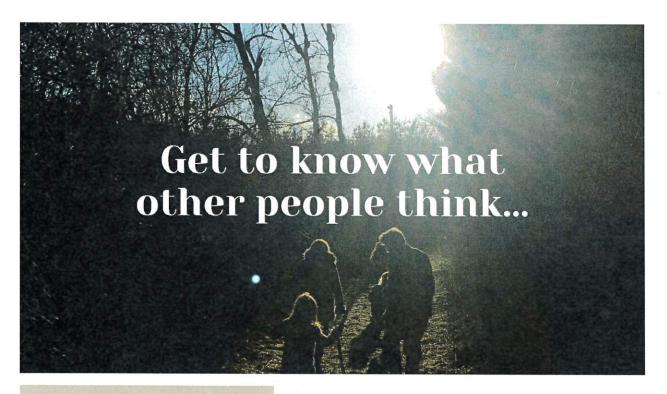

The farm is surrounded by wild woods on three sides and has a beautiful meadow as it's centre piece. The flock of 60 sheep run free range through the meadow and forests. The farm has a beautiful trout stream running through it and is located in the magical 'Driftless' region, which itself boasts its own micro climate and exclusive species of flora and fauna not found anywhere else in the world.

Bringing an Agri-tourism element to my farm would help it be more viable financially so I can continue the sustainability efforts I'm practicing on it. I also believe as we enter the Anthropocene (period of deep climate change) that restoring peoples connection with nature will be an essential task. We need to health the story of separation between humans and nature. Staying in these fun cabins, at one with their surroundings, waking to birdsong and lambs bloating, guests and rekindle their love of nature and learn how to live in harmony with it.

I am a self taught, organic farmer, originally from London England, I work at the nexus of marketing and sustainability running a consulting business that focuses on helping shift the narrative of the climate crisis from one of doorm and gloom to one of opportunity. In my spare time I farm and run a sweet little Airbob cottage in a local village about 20 minutes away. 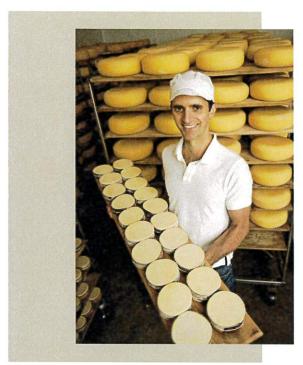

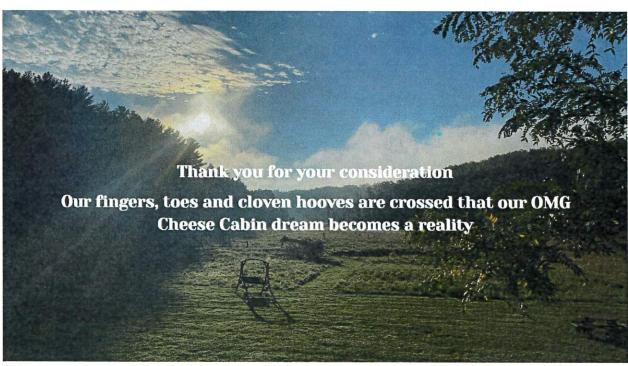

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Legislature has limited how counties can regulate solar and wind energy Systems. See Wis. Stat. § 66.0401.

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WHEREAS, The Wisconsin Public Service Commission ("PSC") has promulgated rules that limit how counties can regulate wind energy systems. *See* PSC 128 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code.

WHEREAS, Planning and Zoning is a fundamental regulatory function and authority of Wisconsin counties.

WHEREAS, Clark County residents have expressed concerns about contractual provisions proposed by both solar and wind renewable energy companies in renewable energy easement agreements.

WHEREAS, the Clark County Planning, Zoning and Land Information Committee and the Clark County
 Board of Supervisors have concerns about the regulatory limitations placed on the counties by PSC 128
 and Chapter 66, Wisconsin Statutes.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Clark County recommends and requests the Wisconsin Public Service Commission and the Wisconsin State Legislature to revise PSC 128 and/or Chapter 66 of the Wisconsin Statues to address the following concerns:

- a. Some renewable energy contracts under the current regulations appear to bind owners and their property to decades worth of encumbrances while allowing renewable energy companies to terminate the contracts at any time for any or no reason.
- b. The law does not prohibit energy companies from shifting liability created by the renewable energy company to the landowners. This includes liability for stray voltage, diminished property values, neurological problems, cancer, and death that the renewable energy companies cause.
- c. State Law prohibits the regulation of the density and footprint of renewable energy systems by Municipalities, and prohibits Clark County from requiring bonding certain to ensure proper decommissioning of renewable energy systems.
- d. Clark County has concerns about the use of renewable energy systems and their impact on agricultural land and production, at a time when war abroad disrupts food chains and causes food shortages, and as domestically we are experiencing uncontrolled inflation.

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#### RESOLUTION NO.

SYNOPSIS: Request State to Revise Solar Energy System Law INTRODUCED BY: Planning and Zoning Committee

#### To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Columbia County:

WHEREAS, Wisconsin counties possess limited authority to regulate solar energy systems in their communities as a result of Wisconsin State law; and,

WHEREAS, the regulation of solar energy systems is generally dependent on size, with smaller solar energy systems being subject to within Wis. Stat. § 66.0401(1m), and those above one hundred (100) megawatts the Wisconsin Public Service Commission (PSC);

WHEREAS, while Wis. Stat. § 66.0401(1m) provides a mechanism for counties to consider areas of local concern, it provides little ability for counties to restrict or even deny a project based on local concerns from residents, environmental impact, or economic impact. Within Wis. Stat. § 66.0401(1m), terms like "public health" or "safety" are undefined, a clear evidentiary threshold was never included; and, while found with Wis. Stat. § 59.69, the term "welfare" was not included with the reason for its omission uncertain; and,

WHEREAS, there are currently 14 solar and battery energy storage systems being proposed in the Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc. queue as of February 23, 2023 to be constructed within Columbia County, totaling 1220 MW of solar energy generation potential and 1000 MW of battery storage potential; and with many of these developers stating that there will be a phase 2 for their projects, an untold number of acres of prime farmland, wildlife habitat, threatened and endangered species of plants and animals that have been documented within project areas, scenic country views, lives, and livelihoods could be destroyed with little to no opportunity for the County to intervene; and,

WHEREAS, public utilities and private developers are using a loophole in Wis. Stat. § 196.491(3)(d)2 and 3 that exempts wholesale merchant plants from meeting the same standards as public utility companies in order to receive their Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) and then immediately turn around and sell the project to a public utility company.

WHEREAS, the State has given planning and zoning authority to the County through Wis. Stat. § 59.69, specifically in order to "promote the public health, safety, convenience and general welfare; to encourage planned and orderly land use development; to protect property values and the property tax base" and to "preserve wetlands; to conserve soil, water and forest resources; to protect the beauty and amenities of landscape and man-made developments; to provide healthy surroundings for family life." However, when it comes to utility-scale solar, the County process and authority is completely circumvented.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Columbia County Board of Supervisors hereby requests that the Wisconsin State Legislature revise Wis. Stat. § 66.0401(1m) and Wis. Stat. § 196.491 as follows in order to grant Wisconsin counties the authority to responsibly site utility-scale solar installations in order to maintain orderly planning and comply with the statutory requirement laid out in Wis. Stat. § 66.1001(3) to adhere to the objectives, goals, and policies contained in the County's comprehensive plan:

66.0401(1m) Authority to restrict systems limited. No political subdivision may place any restriction, either directly or in effect, on the installation or use of a wind energy system that is more restrictive than the rules promulgated by the commission under
