1	Chair called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
2	Roll Call. Members present: Supervisors Haag, Forbes, Meek, Richter and Ray. Others Present: County Administrator Larry Bierke, Emergency Management Director Keith Hurlbert, Sheriff Steve Michek, Corporate Counsel Matt Allen, Susan Hepler, Nancy Tews, Carolyn Smith, Supervisors: Leix, Meyers, Paull, Davis, Masters, Deal Butteris, and EM/Admin Assistant Amanda Gardner.
3	Sup. Richter moved to approve the agenda October 30, 2018 meeting. Sup Ray seconded the motion. Carried. Aye-5 Nay-0
4	Sup. Forbes moved to approve the minutes of the October 2, 2018 meeting. Sup. Haag seconded the motion. Correction on meeting for next meeting stated October 20, should be October 30. Carried. Aye-5 Nay-0
5	Public comments: Chair Meek noted that public comments are limited to 2 minutes. Supervisor Paull updated the Committee on the Substance Abuse Coalition and their efforts to organize and the latest presentation from Children Alliance for Health. Wants OWI program to keep going for first offenders. Nancy Tews noted that an existing OWI is an established program and the OWI court established results are unknown. Grant Money vs. County Funds - grant dollars are still our money. The current program, OWI-ISP, shows where our money goes with the new proposed program doesn't have a known result. Find the money, as Public Safety is a huge part of the budget.
6	OWI-ISP 2019 Budget – Matt Allen, Corporation Counsel recommended combining both #6 & 7 items on the agenda. The committee approved the request. Mr. Allen reviewed the 2019 budget and ideas they are working on. Economic Development would be a great location to get dollars or from sales tax fund. Coordinator could look for grant dollars for 2020. Motion to adjust the amounts budgeted as reflected in the proposed OWI revenue and expense worksheet handout to make up the \$32,960 in levy dollars with a corresponding reduction in the economic development budget (line 74) by Supervisor Ray. Seconded by Haag. Discussion on the program Aye - 4 Nay - 1. Carried. Supervisor Forbes voting against.
7	Consider the OWI-ISP 2019 budget – combined with #6
8	Courthouse Active Shooter Training – Keith Hurlbert, Emergency Management Director provided the committee with a brief update regarding the Full Scale Exercise at the Courthouse on October 26 th . The exercise went very well. There was a total of 179 participants, 33 role players, 33 staff, 97 Law Enforcement, EMS and Fire, 10 observers, 5 armed officers, and Upland Hills Health Staff. This exercise was to test staff and outside agencies on what to do in the event of an active shooter. This was an opportunity to evaluate what went right, what needs to be improved on. Feedback has been very positive and a lot of suggestions have been made on ways to improve by staff. Emergency Management held training for 15 businesses at 6 meetings over a 3 month period leading up to Friday's exercise. Several businesses and a School District now want planning. Currently involved in all school districts in the county. All Courthouse employees were trained by Upland Hills ER staff on "Stop the Bleed". Mr.

	Hulbert is scheduled to speak to the County Board in January.
9	Sheriff's Department: Sheriff Michek provided the committee with the following: 1. Department report: Still working on NexGen911 with Frontier Communications, very difficult to work with. Sheriff updated the committee on the communication upgrades that will be coming. 2. Employment report: Four new hires in the new future due to vacancies. Several are pending background checks before offers can be extended. Having good luck getting quality candidates to apply.
10	Financial Statements ending September 30, 2018. No questions were brought forth.
11	The next meeting date is December 4, 2018 at 5:30 p.m.

Supporting Increased County Child Support Funding

- WHEREAS:** Iowa County administers the Child Support Enforcement Program on behalf of the state, providing services to Iowa County residents including paternity establishment, obtaining child support and health insurance orders for children, and enforcing and modifying those orders; and
- WHEREAS:** Our children's well-being, economic security and success in life are enhanced by parents who provide financial and emotional support; and
- WHEREAS:** Iowa County Child Support Agency ensures that parents take responsibility for the care and well-being of their children, supports the involvement of parents in their children's lives and provides services to both custodial and noncustodial parents; and
- WHEREAS:** The Child Support Enforcement Program is an effective investment in Wisconsin's future as child support increases self-sufficiency, reduces child poverty, and has a positive effect on children's well-being; and
- WHEREAS:** Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program is ranked 2nd in the nation for collecting current support; and
- WHEREAS:** Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program is incredibly cost-effective, collecting an average of \$5.56 in support for every dollar invested in the program; and
- WHEREAS:** County child support agencies collected \$934 Million in child support during 2017, 95% of which went directly to families while 5% reimbursed public assistance programs; and
- WHEREAS:** Child support agencies help save taxpayer dollars by establishing health insurance orders for 97% of cases, which reduces state Medicaid costs by moving children from public assistance to private insurance; and
- WHEREAS:** State funding for county child support services has not increased above the 2007 funding level while county agency costs have steadily increased due to growing caseloads, inflation and new federal regulations; and
- WHEREAS:** Wisconsin's strong performance in child support is at risk without additional state funding. Diminished performance would result in reduced federal funding to Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS:** Decreased federal funding would lead to less funding for Iowa County Child Support Agency.

WHEREAS: New state investments in child support are amplified by a generous federal match. Every \$1 of state GPR invested in the Child Support Program generates \$2 in federal matching funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the IOWA COUNTY Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that state funding for county child support agencies be increased by \$1.5 million GPR in each fiscal year of the 2019-21 Wisconsin state budget, which will generate approximately \$3 million in additional federal funding each year. This investment will ensure that counties can continue to effectively provide economic support to our children.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded by the County Clerk to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, State Senators and State Representatives representing IOWA COUNTY, the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Administration, and the Wisconsin Counties Association for consideration.
