Meeting was called to order by Chair David Gollon at 1:05 pm.

Roll Call. Members present: Rod Anding, Ron Benish, Bob Bunker, Kevin Butteris, Roger Dax, Dave Gollon, Don Leix, and Dan Nankee (via Zoom). Others present: Katie Abbott, Landon Baumgartner (via Zoom), Larry Bierke (via Zoom), Dan Spurley (via conference call)

Approve the agenda for this July 22, 2020 meeting: Mr. Anding made a motion to approve July 22, 2020 agenda. Sup. Butteris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approve the minutes of the June 17, 2020 meeting: Sup. Benish made a motion to approve the June 17, 2020 minutes. Sup. Nankee seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Report from committee members and an opportunity for members of the audience to address the committee. No action will be taken. Sup. Leix passed around a political ad that was printed in two local newspapers; Sup. Nankee discussed Covid19 funding for farmers, an article about farm program payment caps, and a report about farm subsidies.

FPP Notice of Noncompliance appeal: Discussion with Mr. Spurley about his farm's compliance issues and his reasons for the appeal. Sup. Benish moved to deny the appeal and not reinstate the Spurley Farm to FPP until they receive their CAFO permit. Mr. Bunker seconded the motion. Aye- 5 Nay-1 Absention-2 Sup. Nankee voted against the motion. Sup. Leix and Sup. Butteris abstained from voting. Motion carried.

NRCS update: no update was provided

Land + Water Association Video: video was postponed due to technical difficulties

Blackhawk Lake Commission update: Sup. Leix reported that Dan Welsh is retiring by September 1; the Commission has concerns about people driving too fast and may install radar signs; campgrounds have been full and they've had the best quarter they've ever had. There will be no joint LCC-Commission meeting/potluck this year. Corporate Counsel has looked at the 2015 Operations Agreement and will discuss with LCC at an August meeting.

FPP policy revision proposal: Ms. Abbott pointed out the most recent changes; discussion of the 30-day response time and probationary period. Sup. Leix moved to pass the policy on through the policy approval process. Sup. Butteris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Approve cost-share rates for cropping practices and nutrient management planning: Ms. Abbott presented the Land Conservation Department's plan for cost-sharing cropland practices. Discussion of using in conjunction with FPP, funding, and standards. Sup. Benish moved to approve the plan and cost-share rates. Sup. Leix seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Land Conservation Department updates:

- a) Second vehicle arrangement: Ms. Abbott updated the committee on the Long Range Planning Committee's direction for LCD to purchase a vehicle from Highway in 2020, requiring a budget amendment.
- b) Birch Lake valve repair timeline: Ms. Abbott went over the timeline for the DNR grant and the repair, including a December deadline for the permit application, followed by the request for bids, bid approval by DNR, the grant agreement, and a 1-year deadline to complete the repair after the agreement is signed.
- c) County Conservation virtual meeting summary: Ms. Abbott provided some highlights of her recent online meeting, including DNR's nitrate rule development and other Counties' strategies for handling compliance for landowners vs. operators.

Agenda items for future meetings: Blackhawk Lake Operations Agreement, FPP extension requests, SWIGG study update, cost-share project approvals, CREP management plan approvals, regional invasive species coordination, 2021 budget proposal (August), Land +Water video

Dear Iowa County Land Conservation Department,

We at the Upper Sugar River Watershed Association (USRWA) are providing a proposal of the projects we would take on as part of the newly forming Lake Monitoring and Protection Network. Project planning is in accordance with NR 193, a state rule going into place this year. This will shift from the current grant funded coordination model to a long-term guaranteed allocation to counties. This allocation is meant to provide payroll to coordinators for completion of core services deemed essential by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR).

Current Projects:

As part of a WDNR Surface Water AEPP Education and Planning "boots on the ground" grant, we have been conducting operations in Iowa County since July 2019. Some of our ongoing projects are listed below.

- <u>Purple loosestrife bio-control:</u> Rearing species-specific beetles for wetland invasive species control. Monitoring populations for beetle presence at historic release sites.
- Coordination of Clean Boats Clean Waters inspection recruitment and training: Staffing Blackhawk Lake with paid staff and volunteers for summer 2020. Working with UW Extension and WDNR to provide training for lake associations and friends groups.
- Monitoring for wetland and aquatic invasive species: Locating and verifying sites for control work. Mapping occurrences for regional planning and grant funding.
- Aquatic invasive species (AIS) signage inventory and installation: Inspecting and updating boat landings and other public water access sites with WDNR approved prevention signage.
- <u>Invasive species education and training events:</u> Providing educational support on invasive species issues with youth conservation days. Hosting plant ID trainings for citizens. Speaking at meetings and gatherings on the importance of invasive species prevention.

Current Partners:

We have existing ties with a number of non-governmental conservation organizations that are helping with our on-going projects. We also have cultivated grant funded work for local contractors. Continuing to work with these groups will maximize the work that can get done in lowa County.

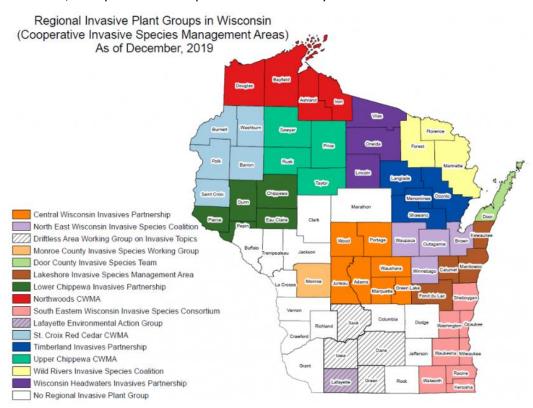

Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area:

As a way to collaboratively approach invasive species management in the region, USRWA is building a Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area (CISMA) that will replace the one previously managed by Southwest Badger RC&D. Our current scope covers Sauk, Dane, Iowa, Green, and Lafayette counties, with potential to expand to Grant county after we build our initial membership.



The goal of our CISMA is to align resources from different participating groups in a synergistic collaboration. For example, some groups are volunteer rich but lack tools or accessible sites to keep them fully engaged. Some groups have great knowledge of native plants and restoration techniques but lack boots on the ground. By hosting social events and sharing a regional calendar, a CISMA can help balance the strengths and needs of different organizations and find the right volunteers for the job. We are acting as a fiscal sponsor as we write a multi-partner MOU. Our working title is the Driftless Area Working Group on Invasive Topics.

USRWA is linking our involvement with the Lake Monitoring Protection Network as a training and volunteer matchmaking resource for the region. This will further leverage partnerships as we expand core services in Iowa County.

Estimated funding details and timing:

Now is a good time to decide how to proceed with Lake Monitoring and Protection Network coordination planning. Official funding levels will be confirmed in August, with Iowa County estimated to receive \$10,900 annually to complete these core services. No in-kind match is required for coordination funds, which cuts some bureaucracy from the reporting process. Intention to apply for NR 193 coordination funds must be made to the state by September 2, 2020. Counties or county designated agents would then connect with WDNR biologists to confirm the scope and projects covered. We would be happy to incorporate any feedback on your end into the proposal. A final application is due by November 1, 2020 to the WDNR.

USRWA looks forward to communicating with your planning staff and committee to further our work in 2021. We believe we are a great fit for this coordination service. Our non-profit organization has a twenty-year history of successfully completing citizen-based conservation projects. We are supported by a deeply engaged volunteer board of directors, local community sponsors, and the confidence and trust of the WDNR. Our staff's experience partnering with municipalities and non-profits, combined with our ongoing volunteer coordination in the region, can maintain and expand the momentum of the efforts we are currently conducting. Together, we can move forward your commitment to protect the lands and waters of lowa County.
