The meeting was hosted in person at the 1 Community Room and electronically through Zoom Meetings. Roll Call: Highway Commissioner Hardy; Austin Durst Sheriff's Dept; Charlene Schmid, WisDOT Traffic Safety Engineer; Trace Frost, Law Enforcement Liaison; Steve Deal, Iowa County Board Supervisor; Diane Halverson, Wildlife Forever ATV; Annette Biggin, SWTC Driver's Education. Absent: Briant Russell, State Patrol; Randy Wiessinger, Law Enforcement Liasion; Greg Lee, Public Works; Joe Davis, WisDOT/BOT; Troy Maggied SWWRPC. Excused: Joe Thomas Ridgeway; Iowa County Corp Council and Health Department Director. Agenda for this 08-18-2020 meeting and minutes of the 05-12-2020 meeting were approved by unanimous consent with no revisions. Commission members were asked to reserve Tuesday, November 10th at 9:30AM as date for the next meeting. ATV-UTV Route Maps. Hardy updated the committee on the status of the atv/utv map development by the Southwest Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission. At this time, all the routes have been signed on the county system with exception of two, which the department is waiting on the state sign permits for: A. The route for STH 39 at Mineral Point requires some revision of the township ordinance prior to WisDOT approving the sign permit. 4 B. The route for STH 191 between BB and Tom's campground is still under WisDOT review. The STH 39 route from CTH QQ of the City of Mineral Point permit was approved by WisDOT. The department was waiting on sign deliveries and then would schedule them for installation, which will open the route. The maps have been updated by SWRPC and are loaded onto the county website for download/retrieval and use by the public. They will be revisited again in November with route requests. Frost covered the BOTS accident history for 2020 to-date, legislative update and other information. The legislative updates are also available on the Community Maps webpage, and Frost distributed via email 5 after the meeting. Through 2020 to-date; Wisconsin is at 332 compared to 325 a year ago. Discussed upcoming grant enforcement opportunities. Durst provided a summary of the crash report for the 3rd quarter of the year. He recapped the fatal crash on STH 23 involving a tractor implement, and three other vehicles. He stated Law enforcement has been making a presence with reduced contact during the covid19 orders. However, they are now starting to notice an increase in traffic volumes. Schmid stated the department has held off on following up on speed studies and traffic counts due to Covid19 effect, but questioned if that has subsided? Duerst commented he thought the traffic had resumed to normal driving conditions especially on 151 corridor.

But thought night time driving might still be a decrease compared to pre-covid19.

7	Other Business. Duerst asked if a review of ordinances within the county could be done to research differing requirements such as speed limit, time or hours of use, etc. Hardy stated he would prepare a metric of ordinance language for review at the next meeting. Hardy asked Shmid if WisDOT had reviewed the accident or slide-off history of the Ridgeway corridor to 151. Some members of the commission feel there is an inordinate amount of slide off the roadway issues through the corridor around Ridgeway between the Intersection with CTH HHH east fo the village to interchange at MM52. Schmid stated she would review the accident history in the vicinity, compare the data to state averages, and bring the information to discuss at our next meeting.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020 - 1392

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTION 7.145 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF DODGEVILLE, IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF ATVS AND UTVS AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ROUTES

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DODGEVILLE, IOWA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I: Section 7.145 of the Municipal Code of the City of Dodgeville shall be and hereby is repealed and recreated to read as follows:

7.145 OPERATION OF ALL-TERRAIN AND UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLES AND ESTABLISHMENT OF ROUTES.

- (1) AUTHORITY AND PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish all-terrain vehicle (ATV) routes in the City and to provide safe and enjoyable ATV/UTV recreation consistent with public rights and interests pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 23.33.
 - (2) APPLICABILITY AND ENFORCEMENT; DESIGNATION OF ROUTES.
 - (a) Under Wis. Stat. sec. 23.33(8)(b), the City designates the following City streets as ATV routes:
 - (i) Military Ridge Road
 - (ii) King Street
 - (b) Under Wis. Stat. sec. 23.33(11)(am)4., the City authorizes the operation of ATVs on the following county and state highways within the City's territorial boundaries:
 - (i) State Highway 23 between Military Ridge Road and King Street
 - (ii) County Highway YZ
 - (c) Under Wis. Stat. sec. 23.33(1m)(c), utility terrain vehicles (UTVs) may be operated on all roads and streets in the City on which ATVs may be operated.
 - (b) The operation of ATVs and UTVs with snow removal devices attached is permitted on any roadway, or adjacent to any roadway, if the applicable roadway speed limit is greater than 45 miles per hour, and regardless of whether the City has jurisdiction over the roadway.



- (c) The provisions of this ordinance shall be enforced by the City of Dodgeville Police Department. Adoption of this ordinance shall not prohibit any law enforcement officer or DNR warden from proceeding under any other ordinance, regulation, statute, law or order that pertains to the subject matter addressed under this section.
- (3) AUTHORITY TO CLOSE ROUTES. The Chief of Police or the Director of Public Works or their designees may declare any route, or part thereof, in the City temporarily closed at any time.
 - (4) RULES OF OPERATION. The following rules of operation apply on all routes:
 - (a) Speed. No ATV/UTV shall be operated at a speed greater than the speed limit on any road.
 - (b) <u>Lights</u>. No ATV/UTV may be operated on the routes without fully functional headlights, tail-lights, and brake lights. Every ATV/UTV being operated on the routes must display a lighted headlamp and tail lamp at all times.
 - (c) Roadway Travel. On any ATV route, all ATV/UTV operation is authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway which is safe given prevailing conditions. All ATVs and UTVs must operate in single file. Operation on paved shoulders intended for bicycle or pedestrians, gravel shoulders, sidewalks, grassy in-slope, ditches or other highway right-ofway is prohibited unless the ATV or UTV is actively being used for snow removal.
 - (d) Operation. ATV/UTV operation on the routes shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Wisconsin State Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code and all other applicable ordinances, as the same may be amended from time to time.
 - (e) Open Intoxicants. No person may possess on his or her person or in or on an ATV or UTV upon any route, any bottle or receptacle containing alcohol beverages if the bottle or receptacle has been opened, the seal has been broken or the contents of the bottle or receptacle have been partially removed or released.
 - (5) HOURS OF OPERATION. ATV/UTV operation is prohibited between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day.
 - (6) OPERATORS.
 - (a) All operators of ATVs/UTVs on City routes shall be at least 16 years of age.



- (b) All operators of ATVs/UTVs shall possess a valid driver's license.
- (c) All operators of ATVs/UTVs shall possess valid proof of insurance.
- (d) All operators of ATVs/UTVs who were born after January 1, 1988, shall possess a valid safety certificate.

(7) ROUTE SIGNS.

- (a) The City will erect a sign at each point on a highway where the all-terrain vehicle route begins and at each point where the all-terrain vehicle route intersects an all-terrain vehicle trail or a highway that is not designated as an all-terrain vehicle route. The City, or county is not required to erect a sign under this subdivision at a point that is not more than one-half mile from a sign marking the same all-terrain vehicle route on the same highway. The City shall procure, install and maintain signs that conform to the requirements of Wisconsin law, the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, at locations required under this ordinance as designated by the Common Council or its authorized representative. All ATV signs on state trunk highways shall be installed and maintained by the Iowa County Highway Department and shall meet Wisconsin Department of Transportation requirements.
- (b) No person may erect, remove, obscure, or deface any official designated route or preferred route sign unless authorized by the Common Council or its designee.

(8) PENALTIES.

- (a) The penalties under Wis. Stat. sec. 23.33(13) are adopted by reference. Deposits for violations shall be required in accordance with the Revised Uniform State Traffic Deposit Schedule, as the same may be amended from time to time.
- (b) Juvenile penalties shall be as permitted under Wis. Stat. sec. 938.17. Deposits for violations shall be required in accordance with the Revised Uniform State Traffic Deposit Schedule, as the same may be amended from time to time and as the same may apply to juveniles.
- (c) The penalty for any violation of this ordinance for which no statutory penalty is provided shall be \$50.00 together with court costs, fees and assessments except that the penalty for violation of section (4)(e) shall be \$100.00 together with court costs, fees and assessments.
- (9) SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance if held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provision or application of this ordinance that can be given effect without the



invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provision of this ordinance are severable.

- (10) SAVINGS CLAUSE. This section shall in no way be deemed to supplant or otherwise invalidate any provision of state statutes relating to the subject matter hereof. Any person entrusted with the enforcement of this section may, in the exercise of his or her discretion, proceed under applicable state statutes.
- (11) COPIES TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT. The City Clerk shall immediately send a copy of this ordinance to the Dodgeville Police Department, the Department of Natural Resources, to the state traffic patrol, and to the Iowa County Sheriff's Department. A copy shall also be provided to the Iowa County Highway Department.

Section II: This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as required by law.

Chapter 31 TOWN OF DODGEVILLE ALL-TERRAIN and UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTE ORDINANCE

SECTION 1.0: INTRODUCTION

1.1 NAME

This Ordinance shall be called the Town of Dodgeville All-Terrain and Utility-Terrain Vehicle Route Ordinance.

1.2 INTENT

Following due consideration of the recreational and economic value to connect trail opportunities and weighted against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created pursuant to Town Board authority under Wisconsin Statute. §§ 59.02, 23.33(4)(d)3.b., 23.33(11)(a) and (am), and 23.33(8)(b) as amended.

1.3 DEFINITIONS

- A. All-Terrain Vehicle ("ATV") has the meaning specified within Wisconsin. Statute § 340.01 (2g).
- B. <u>ATV/UTV Route</u> shall mean Town Roads designated for use by all-terrain and utility-terrain vehicle operators by the Town Board having jurisdiction.
- C. <u>Utility-Terrain Vehicle ("UTV")</u> has the meaning specified within Wisconsin Statute § 23.33 (1), (ng).

1.4 SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Town of Dodgeville would have passed the other provisions of this Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons and circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

1.5 SAVING CLAUSE

This Ordinance shall in no way be deemed to supplant or otherwise invalidate any provision of state statutes relating to the subject matter hereof. Any person entrusted with the enforcement of this Ordinance may, in the exercise of his or her discretion, proceed under applicable state statutes.

SECTION 2.0: ATV/UTV ROUTES AND OPERATION

2.1 DESIGNATION

All Town-maintained roads, within the Town of Dodgeville, that are signed in accordance with s. NR 64.12(7), Wisconsin Administrative Code, are hereby designated ATV/UTV Routes for their entire length unless signed otherwise or prohibited by statue or county ordinance.

The Town Board shall have the authority to temporarily close any ATV/UTV route designated herein due to an emergency, complaint, or other necessary condition as determined by the Town Board.



2.2 RULES OF OPERATION

- A. All ATV/UTVs shall operate only on the paved portion of the roadway. Operation on the gravel shoulders, grassy in-slope, ditches, or other highway right-of-way area is prohibited and illegal.
- B. No operator or passenger of an ATV/UTV will be allowed to have an open intoxicant while operating an ATV/UTV on any Town designated route(s).
- C. ATV/UTV's may be operated on any designated route(s) only between the hours of 5:00 AM and 1:00 AM daily, with route use prohibited the remainder of the day.
- D. The Town of Dodgeville may close ATV/UTV routes due to road emergencies including but not limited to blizzards or flooding or other safety hazards. The closure of ATV/UTV routes will be posted on the Town of Dodgeville website at www.townofdodgeville.com.
- E. The speed limit is 30 miles per hour (MPH), or the posted speed limit, whichever is lower.
- F. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride in single file on the extreme righthand side of the paved portion of the highway except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway which is safe given prevailing conditions.
- G. All ATV/UTV operators shall have their headlight and taillight illuminated, while operating on the Town Roads.
- H. Except as otherwise authorized by State law, all operators
 - a. of ATV's who are at least 12 years of age and who are born on or after January 1, 1988 shall possess a valid state-issued ATV Safety Certification.
 - b. of ATV's between the age of 12 and 15 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or a person at least 18 years of age who is designated by the parent or guardian at all times when operating on a designated all-terrain route.
 - c. of UTV's must be 16 years of age or older.
 - d. of UTV's who are at least 16 years of age and who are born on or after January 1, 1988 must possess a valid state-issued Safety Certificate.
 - e. of ATV/UTV's and their passengers under 18 years old shall wear protective headgear while operating on a Town route-designated.
- I. No person may operate an ATV/UTV that is constructed in such a manner that noise emitted from the vehicle exceeds 96 decibels.
- J. ATV/UTV operation shall be subject to all provisions of Wisconsin Statute § 23.33, which is adopted as a part of this ordinance by reference.
- K. Mandatory Use of Seatbelts during Operation of a UTV. All occupants riding in or operating a UTV shall be required to wear a seatbelt when traveling on any trail or route within lowa County.

2.3 SIGNAGE OF ATV ROUTES

- A. Routes shall be marked with uniform all-terrain vehicle route signs in accordance with s. NR 64.12(7), Wisconsin Administrative Code. No person may do any of the following in regard to signs marking ATV/UTV routes:
 - 1) Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign.
 - 2) Possess any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard of the type established by the department for the warning, instruction or information of the public, unless he or she obtained the uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard in a lawful manner. Possession of a uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.



- B. All required designated route signs shall be paid for, installed & maintained by an ATV/UTV Club, with approval by the Town of Dodgeville.
- C. The quantity and location of signage shall be reviewed and approved by the Town of Dodgeville, where appropriate, placed at the beginning of an all-terrain vehicle route within the Town and at such locations and intervals deemed necessary to enable the ATV/UTV operators to follow the route.
- D. No sign may be mounted on any existing Town sign post unless authorized by the Town Board. Posts shall be suitably sized for mounting the necessary amount of signs at the location.
- E. No person shall operate an ATV/UTV contrary to any authorized and official posted sign.
- F. All complaints regarding signage shall be addressed to the Town of Dodgeville. These complaints will be communicated to the Club within 48 hours. The Club has 48 hours to address the complaint.

2.4 DESIGNATION OF ROUTES - SEE BELOW

SECTION 3.0: ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

This ordinance shall be enforced by any officer employed by the lowa County Sheriff Department or any other law enforcement official as set forth in Wisconsin Statute § 23.33(12).

3.1 PENALTIES

The penalties as found in Wisconsin Statute § 23.33 (13) (a) are adopted by reference.

SECTION 4.0: EFFECTIVE DATE

The Town Clerk shall properly publish this ordinance as required under Wisconsin Statute § 60.80 will become effective upon passage & publication. Chapter 31 was adopted by the Town of Dodgeville Town Board on 8.4 - 2020.



 County Q to extend from the existing route (@Plank Rd.) to Military Ridge Rd. (Highland and Dodgeville)





Update on prior route requests requiring other action prior to approvals:

- 1. Towns of Arena and Brigham Wildlife Forever ATV Club.
 - a. CTH K from Knight Hollow Road to CTH KK
 - b. CTH KK from CTH K to the Dane County Line.

Action needed before February meeting: ATV Club to discuss route adoption with Dane County and the Townships in Dane County being Black Earth and Vernon. No action by the Commission until routes in Dane County are an option for a connection. Club shall notify Highway Commissioner at least 10 days in advance of the Traffic Safety meeting for placement on the agenda.

- 2. Towns of Dodgeville and Ridgeway Pec Valley ATVers.
 - a. STH 191 from CTH BB to Spring Road (Tom's Campground access).
 - b. If STH 191 not approved, Town and Club need to consider an alternative route.

A copy of the resolution would go to the state; at which point the state would sign accordingly. Ordinance No. 600.18B

IOWA COUNTY ALL-TERRAIN and UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTE ORDINANCE

SECTION 1.0: INTRODUCTION

1.1 NAME

This Ordinance shall be called the Iowa County All-Terrain and Utility-Terrain Vehicle Route Ordinance.

1.2 INTENT

Following due consideration of the recreational and economic value to connect trail opportunities and weighted against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created pursuant to County Board authority under Wis. Stat. ss. 59.02, 23.33(4)(d)3.b., 23.33(11)(a) and (am), and 23.33(8)(b) as amended.

1.3 DEFINITIONS

- A. <u>All-Terrain Vehicle ("ATV")</u> has the meaning specified within Wis. Stat. ss. 340.01 (2g).
- B. <u>ATV/UTV Route</u> shall mean a highway or sidewalk designated for use by all-terrain and utility-terrain vehicle operators by the governmental entity having jurisdiction.
- C. <u>Utility-Terrain Vehicle ("UTV")</u> has the meaning specified within Wis. Stat. ss. 23.33 (1), (ng).

1.4 SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that lowa County would have passed the other provisions of this Ordinance irrespective of whether one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons and circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

1.5 SAVING CLAUSE

This Ordinance shall in no way be deemed to supplant or otherwise invalidate any provision of state statutes relating to the subject matter hereof. Any person entrusted with the enforcement of this Ordinance may; in the exercise of his or her discretion, proceed under applicable state statutes.

SECTION 2.0: ATV/UTV ROUTES AND OPERATION

2.1 RULES OF OPERATION

- A. All ATV/UTVs shall operate only on the paved portion of the roadway. Operation on the gravel shoulders, grassy in-slope, ditches, or other highway right-of-way area is prohibited and illegal.
- B. No ATV/UTV shall be operated at a speed greater than 30 miles per hour (MPH), or the posted speed limit, whichever is lower.
- C. No ATV/UTV may be operated on any designated route between the hours of 1:00 AM and 5:00 AM daily.
- D. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride in single file on the extreme right hand side of the paved portion of the highway except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway which is safe given prevailing conditions.
- E. All ATV/UTV operators shall have their headlight and taillight illuminated, while operating on a county highway.
- F. Except as otherwise authorized by State law, all operators
 - a. of ATV's who are at least 12 years of age and who are born on or after January 1, 1988 shall possess a valid state-issued ATV Safety Certification.
 - b. of ATV's between the age of 12 and 15 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or a person at least 18 years of age who is designated by the parent or guardian at all times when operating on a roadway designated as an ATV route or when operating on roadways of highways that are ATV trails.
 - c. of UTV's must be 16 years of age or older.
 - d. of UTV's who are at least 16 years of age and who are born on or after January 1, 1988 must possess a valid state-issued Safety Certificate.
 - e. of ATV/UTV's and their passengers under 18 years old shall wear protective headgear while operating on route-designated county highways.
- G. Mandatory Use of Seatbelts during operation of a UTV. ALL occupants riding in, or operating a UTV, shall be required to wear a seatbelt when travelling on any trail or route within lowa County.
- H. Possession of Open Intoxicants in an ATV or UTV while in operation. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess any bottle or receptacle containing alcohol beverages if the bottle or receptacle has been opened, the seal has been broken, or the contents of the receptacle have been partially removed, while operating or as a passenger on an ATV or UTV on any road or road route in Iowa County.
- I. ATV/UTV operation shall be subject to all provisions of WI Stats. S. 23.33, which is

adopted as a part of this ordinance by reference.

2.2 SIGNAGE OF ATV ROUTES

- A. Routes shall be marked with uniform all-terrain vehicle route signs in accordance with s. NR 64.12(7), Wisconsin Administrative Code. No person may do any of the following in regard to signs marking ATV/UTV routes:
 - 1) Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign.
 - 2) Possess any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard of the type established by the department for the warning, instruction or information of the public, unless he or she obtained the uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard in a lawful manner. Possession of a uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.
- B. All required designated route signs shall be paid for by an ATV/UTV club, with approval, installation, and maintenance of the signs by the lowa County Highway Department.
- C. The quantity and location of signage shall be reviewed and approved by the lowa County Highway Commissioner, where appropriate, placed at the beginning of an all-terrain vehicle route within the county and at such locations and intervals deemed necessary to enable the ATV/UTV operators to follow the route.
- D. No sign may be mounted on any existing County sign post or telephone post/pole. Posts shall be suitably sized for mounting the necessary amount of signs at the location
- E. No person shall operate an ATV/UTV contrary to any authorized and official posted sign.

2.3 DESIGNATION OF ROUTES

All requests for new or revised ATV/UTV route designations shall first be submitted to the lowa County Traffic Safety Commission for review at its November quarterly meeting. The lowa County Traffic Safety Commission shall review such requests for County Trunk Highway (CTH) route designations and make a recommendation to the lowa County Public Works Committee. The Public Works Committee shall review designation of ATV/UTV routes, including appropriate criteria for making a designation, and make a recommendation to the lowa County Board of Supervisors. County highways designated as ATV/UTV routes shall be approved by the lowa County Board of Supervisors by amendment of Sec. 2.3 of this Ordinance.

A copy of ATV/UTV routes, along with a map showing their location, shall be kept on file at the Highway Department. The Iowa County Highway Department shall file ATV/UTV

routes adopted by this Ordinance with the Department of Natural Resources Conservation Warden for Iowa County and with the Madison, Wisconsin, Office of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. The Iowa County Highway Commissioner shall have the authority to temporarily close or terminate any ATV/UTV route enacted by this Ordinance for a period up to ninety (90) days. Closures for duration of greater than ninety (90) days shall be reviewed by the Public Works Committee.

The general intent for the use of County Trunk Highway designated ATV/UTV routes in this Ordinance is to provide connections between township routes, to provide access or connection of villages to the various routes when no other options exist, and not to serve as primary routes for recreation. County Trunk Highways are classified into four categories based on their significance or importance of usage. Those categories are Principal Arterial, Major Collector, Minor Collector, and Local Road. Highways categorized as Principal Arterial and Major Collector primarily serve as high speed, high volume traffic generators; and typically carry a wide range of users.

The intent of this Ordinance is to limit the usage of Principal Arterial and Major Collector County Trunk Highways as ATV/UTV routes to reduce the potential for conflict caused by different types of users travelling at largely varying speeds in heavy volumes on the same roadway. Requests and consideration of Principal Arterial and Major Collector County Trunk Highways by ATV/UTV clubs shall be limited to serve the purpose of a connector between other ATV/UTV road routes whether they are State Highways, Township Roads, Village Streets or other County Trunk Highways designated as Minor Collectors or Local Roads. Furthermore; an Arterial or Major Collector County Trunk Highway may be considered to be an ATV/UTV route to provide direct access to a community (City, Village, or unincorporated Hamlet), when no other alternative route is available. It is not the intent of this Ordinance for Arterial or Major Collector County Trunk Highway roads to be ATV/UTV routes for the purpose of providing connectivity to all properties in the County.

- lxiv. CTH ZZ, from the intersection with CTH Z easterly to the intersection with CTH Y in the Town of Dodgeville, Secs. 30, 31, and 32, and in the Town of Ridgeway Sec. 4; all in T6N; R4E; a distance of 3.4 miles.
- lxv. CTH W, from the intersection with CTH DDD to the intersection with CTH S at the Lafayette County line in the Ton of Waldwick, Sec. 17; T4N; R4E; a distance of 0.75 miles.
- B. Under Wis. Stat. ss. 23.33(4)(d)3.b and 23.33 (11)(am)3., the County further authorizes the operation of ATVs/UTVs on:
 - i. STH 39 in the village of Linden and Town of Linden, from the intersection with Galena Street to the intersection with Dodgeville Street (also known as Wearne Road) including the bridge over Peddler creek, in the town of Linden ,Sec 8 and 9; T5N; R2E; a distance of 0.25 miles.
 - ii. STH 39 in the Town of Mineral Point and the City of Mineral Point, from the intersection of CTH QQ to the 30/45 speed limit transition near the City of Mineral Point, including the bridge over the Mineral Point Branch of the Pecatonica River, in Sec. 36; T5N; R2E, a distance of 0.5 miles more or less.
 - iii. STH 191, in the Village of Hollandale, from the intersection with 5th Avenue to the intersection with CTH K including the bridge over the Dodge Branch of the Pecatonica River, Sec.30; T5N; R5E; a distance of 787 feet more or less.

SECTION 3.0: ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

This ordinance shall be enforced by any officer employed by the Iowa County Sheriff Department or any other law enforcement official as set forth in Wisconsin Statute § 23.33(12).






SECTION 4.0: EFFECTIVE DATE










ATV-UTV Route Map






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








ATV-UTV Route Map







ATV-UTV Route Map









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

ATV-UTV Route Map




