The Draft policy states that this program be offered to only Iowa County residents. Maintenance will continue to be involved in making sure equipment is in good working order and safe. Evans asked if anyone from Bloomfield is still involved. Hiltbrand said they are still operating the program. Jeff Lindeman, VSO, will be running the program with assistance from Maintenance and the ADRC. We do not have the storage space for it in the HHS Center. Currently stored at Bloomfield H.E.L.P. Review Healthcare & Rehab. Ladewig asked that it be included in the newsletter and on the website when details are ironed out. Rolfsmeyer asked if we would collaborate with the hospital when a hospital patient is released and they need something from the loan closet. The ADRC does that now and will continue to do so. Ladewig acknowledges there are well over 1,000 pieces of equipment. Fisher asked how many residents remain at Bloomfield. As of 3/16/22, six residents remain per Hiltbrand. Employees who worked for Maintenance at Bloomfield are shifting offices to other county buildings. **Review Department Reports:** SUN (Seniors United for Nutrition): Cecile McManus, SUN Director for Iowa and Lafayette Counties, presented. Debbie Schaaf was hired for the Dodgeville site manager position. Iowa County employees have been helping deliver meals for SUN. Three of the ADRC board members are drivers for SUN as well. Jay Loop is retiring and a new hire is starting on Tuesday, 3/29/22. Transitioning from Bloomfield to Law Enforcement Center for meal provision. Bloomfield's last day providing meals for SUN is April 1. Summit Management Co. will be managing the kitchen at the Law Enforcement Center. Joan Davis mentioned the Dodgeville dining site is small. Is that the same everywhere? McManus said Benton is their largest site at 10-11 participants. Core group in Dodgeville is 5-8 people. Davis said folks seem lonely and there are some that would benefit eating at the site instead of home. Socialization is such a key factor. Hiltbrand said she attends many meetings about nutrition and socialization. People are attending congregate sites less and less and opting for home delivery. O'Brien completely agrees and mentions that COVID is still out there and don't let down your guard. Be cautious. Ladewig told McManus to talk to Larry Bierke about money from Campbell Fund (leftover from Bloomfield). EBS (Elder Benefit Specialist): Report provided. Renae Kratcha presented. 30 new Review clients last month. Social Security is behind about 2-3 months in processing claims, therefore Medicare Part B and Retirements are delayed. Clients are receiving notices Department for overpayments and they are being asked to pay it now. They are requesting Reports Waivers to give them more time. IRMAA is an income-related monthly adjustment amount and it is an extra Medicare cost added to your Part B and Part D premiums. The SSA determines whether you are required to pay an IRMAA based on the modified adjusted gross income reported on your IRS tax return from two years prior. If your AGI was \$182,000 or less for a joint tax return, you are ok. If it is greater than that, you have to pay more than the standard \$170.10. Kratcha is seeing many retirees filing for social security and Medicare. Ladewig asked if the ADRC is giving tax help. Oleson told the board that the ADRC assists customers schedule appointments
