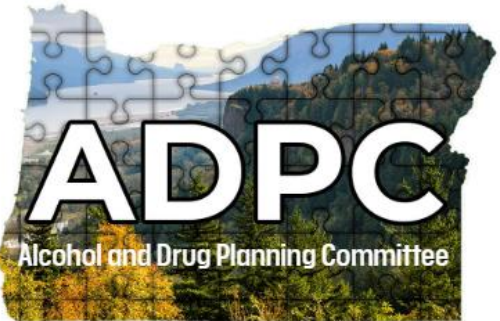
Opioid Settlement Funding Updates



Columbia County

- CC Board of Commissioners recently approved our **Vulnerable Populations Health Promotion Specialist** position, which we will be looking to fill in the coming weeks
 - This position will co-locate with CCPH and the CC Jail, working on prevention, treatment, and care coordination activities with justice involved individuals
- Working with jail medical contractor (MedTrust) to **increase hours for two staff**:
 - Mental Health MA/LPC/LMHC - 24 to 32 hours/week
 - Psych provider – 3 to 5 hours/week
- **OSF Community Wellness Grant** application window closed Friday, 5/29 with 10 completed applications received.
 - Seeking 2-3 grant reviewers
 - Award notices to be sent week of June 22
 - Projects start July 1

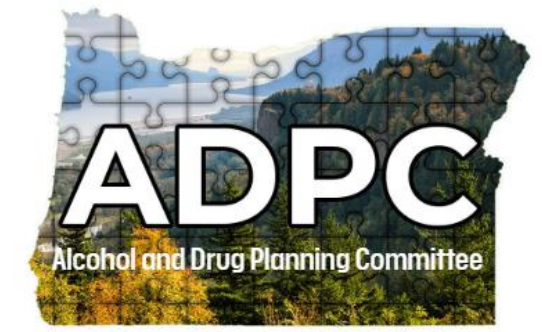

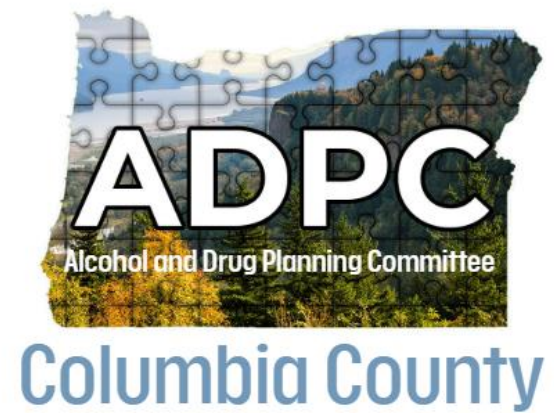

Regional Overdose Surveillance & Response Plan



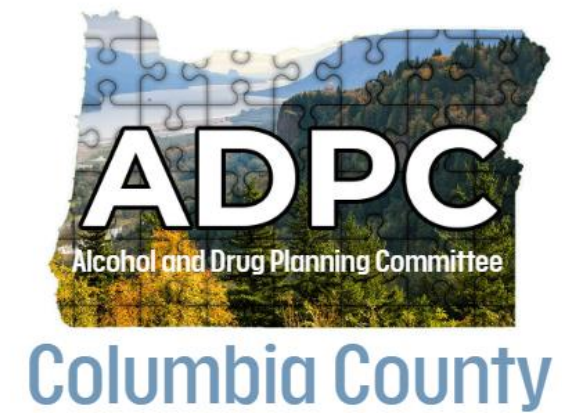
Why Regional?

- Clatsop, Tillamook, and Columbia Counties make up the North Coast Region funded through OHA PE62 Overdose Prevention program funds

Response Levels

- **Green**: At or below expected
 - Routine data monitoring and communication with partners
- **Yellow**: Higher than expected
 - Increased surveillance to look for trends, alert partners, messaging to affected populations
- **Red**: Much higher than expected
 - Continued enhanced surveillance, assess internal programs, convene response team meeting

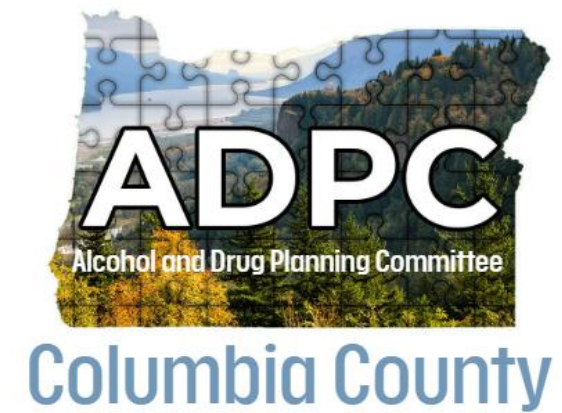
Regional Overdose Surveillance & Response Plan (Cont)



Current Data Sources

- Quantitative:
 - Electronic Surveillance System for the Early Notification of Community-based Epidemics (ESSENCE) data
 - Preliminary County Overdose Death Reports from Medical Examiner's Office
 - Emergency Medical Services (EMS) ESSENCE data
 - State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS)
- Qualitative:
 - Harm Reduction and Sharps Exchange Programs
 - Law Enforcement
 - Community-based Organizations

Regional Overdose Surveillance & Response Plan (Cont)



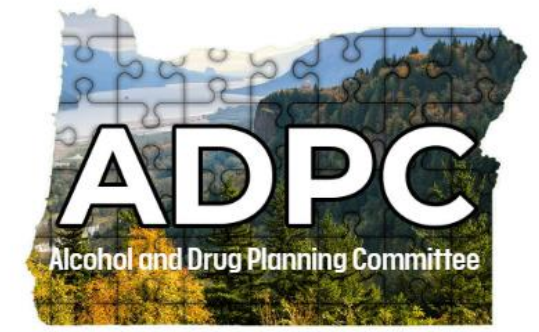
How We Use Data

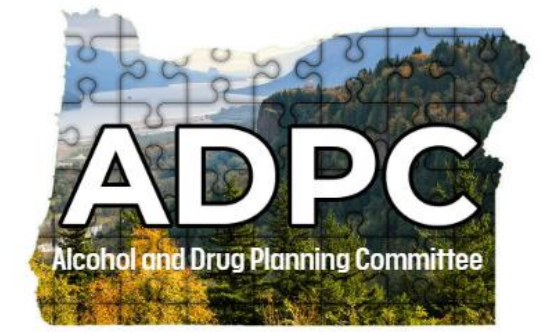
