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MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SEPTEMBER 24, 2025 – 9:00 A.M. 900 NORTHSTAR DRIVE

NEW BUSINESS

DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY – EASEMENT FOR PIPELINE RIGHT OF WAY

Director of Public Works (DPW) Eric Martin stated the District has two sewer mains conveying wastewater from Northstar to Truckee through Martis Valley. An easement issued to Placer County for the construction and maintenance of the sewer lines expired in 2024. A new easement has been drafted to grant the District easement rights directly. If approved, the easement will be granted to the District for a term of fifty (50) years.

Director Forni moved to approve the Department of Army – Easement for Pipeline Right of Way. Director Ives seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Brown. The motion carried.

ADOPTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE 40-25 ESTABLISHING FIRE DEPARTMENT FEE SCHEDULES

Fire Chief Jason Gibeaut stated Ordinance 40-25 Establishing Fire Department Fee Schedules was introduced to the Board and the public at the August 20, 2025 Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors. The Board acted to waive further reading of Ordinance 40-25 and directed staff and District Counsel to publish a summary of the ordinance, a requirement that was met prior to the September meeting.

Director Forni moved to Adopt Ordinance 40-25 Establishing Fire Department Fee Schedules. Director Ives seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Brown. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION 25-16 "A RESOLUTION SETTING FORTH FINDINGS TO AMEND 2025 CALIFORNIA FIRE CODE ADOPTION

Fire Prevention Officer (FPO) Brandon Olk stated the resolution before the Board provides the Northstar Fire Department with the power to amend the 2025 fire code. Resolution 25-16 represents the data and statistical findings to support the amendments the District is proposing to the 2025 fire code. Other regional fire departments are proposing many of the same changes to the 2025 fire code to provide consistency throughout the region.

Director Forni moved to approve Resolution 25-16 "A Resolution Setting Forth Findings to Amend 2025 California Fire Code Adoption. Director Ives seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Brown. The motion carried.

Director Brown arrived at the meeting at 9:30 A.M.

INTRODUCTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE 41-25 "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ADOPTING THE 2025 EDITION OF THE CALIFORNIA BUILDING STANDARDS CODE (TITLE 24, CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS), PART 9 (2025 CALIFORNIA FIRE CODE) AND APPENDICES; AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 39-22 OF THE NORTHSTAR COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH."

FPO Olk stated the District must formally introduce the proposed Ordinance 41-25 prior to the Board considering the ordinance for adoption at a future meeting.

Director Ives moved to waive further reading of Proposed Ordinance 41-25 – "An Ordinance Amending and Adopting the 2025 Edition of the California Building Standards Code (Title 24, California Code of Regulations), Part 9 (2025 California Fire Code) and Appendices; and Repealing Ordinance No. 39-22 of the Northstar Community Services District and All Other Ordinances and Parts of Ordinances In Conflict Therewith." Director Forni seconded; roll call was taken. Yes: Directors Brown, Forni, Ives, and Radanovich. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. The motion carried.

- DPW Martin stated the contractor for the Martis Valley Trail Segment 3F has multiple crews working to complete the project between landscaping, bridges and pavers
- Staff is seeking approval for an amendment through Placer County for the use permit for the Wood Energy Facility.
- SUSW Contardi stated the operations crew worked seamlessly to repair a water main break and minimize service disruptions

BACKGROUND:

The section below provides information from the Fire Department on its current projects that are not the subject of a separate report. This report is formatted to provide new information and recent progress only.

OPERATIONS:

- Continue to research all viable means of additional revenue or cost-savings for NFD in preparation for sharing before the Board of Directors.
- Eastern Placer County fire departments/districts received notice that the 1st part of LAFCO's study will be ready for review by the end of October.
- NFD's "Elevator Emergencies" policy is under review to determine if and how dispatches for "nonemergencies" can be reduced.
- Eastern Placer County Fire Chiefs met with Cal Fire to discuss mutual agreements and pursuits within our
- Meeting with regional Ops Chiefs to discuss mutual matters such as trainings, command software, etc...
- Attended a Lake Tahoe Regional Fire Chief's Association meeting to discuss and address issues mutually affecting our operations/services within the Northern Nevada/Lake Tahoe region.
- Attached is a report reflecting the number and types of calls NFD was dispatched over the last month.

PREVENTION:

- Except for The Ritz hotel, all Fire & Life Safety Inspections have been brought into compliance. The Ritz hotel is still not ready for their reinspection.
- Placer County STR Defensible Space Inspections and Focus Area inspections are finishing up for the season. NFD will continue to inspect properties upon request.
- Continued meetings with Eastern Placer Fire Prevention Officers to discuss fire code, local prevention measures and enforcement within the greater region.
- Plan review and inspections for development within Northstar (tenant improvements, new construction and means of egress/ingress).
- Continued enforcement of fire suppression/prevention system's compliance within commercial buildings.
- Assisting stakeholders with fire and life safety concerns, (Ritz Carlton Hotel, Mid Mountain Day Lodge, Gold Bend Condominiums) by testing fire protection systems and updating pre-plans to reflect the most current site and contact information.
- Preparations for the International Code Council (ICC) test.

FUELS MANAGEMENT:

Currently, we have two contracted hand crews working on different projects. The first is continuing to work in the 48-acre TTAD grant project area between Martis Landing and Basque. They estimate one more week of work before completing the project area and moving on to the 63-acre project area along the District's eastern boundary. The second contracted hand crew is starting work on Measure U "beyond 300-feet" project areas. Currently, we are building burn piles above Ski Trails Condos - working south up towards the resort's gondola lift line.

- Forest fuels reduction is expected to continue through the end of October. Fuels Management continues to assess both weather and ground conditions routinely to make an educated decision as to when project work should end for the season.
- Attended Prescribed Fire Pre-Season Meeting hosted by Placer County and USFS.
- Working with CAL FIRE Battalion Chief Thomas Smith to coordinate a prescribed pile burning operation tentatively scheduled sometime between November 3-19, 2025. The first project area will be on the ski hill near the Ritz-Carlton and 900-Road. Further details will be sent to stakeholders once future weather forecasts provide greater clarity into viable windows of time to operate.
- Working on CAL FIRE Wildfire Prevention Grant, 3rd Quarter Report, as well as a Reimbursement Request that are due by October 31st.
- Continued necessary field work prior to winter weather setting in. Includes pulling old flagging, capturing total number of treated acres, capturing "after" photo points of completed project work, tracking ongoing forest health issues, and covering burn piles.

BACKGROUND: The updates below provide information on the District's public works services,

projects, and programs that are not the subject of a separate report. This report is

formatted to provide new information and recent progress only.

DISCUSSION:

• Martis Valley Trail Segment 3F – C&D Contractors is in their 5th month of construction. Bridges have been installed, rockery wall construction is nearing completion, aggregate base placement is completed, and boardwalk installation and revegetation well underway. Excellent progress is being made at the picnic area, scenic overlook, and trailhead as well. Paving is tentatively scheduled for October 15, 16, and 17. Weekly progress meetings are being held in coordination with the contractor, consultant team, and Vail.

Wood Energy Facility

- Staff is coordinating a contract change order with Messersmith that includes added costs to produce the water-cooled oscillating grate in the US, to increase the feed stock auger to maximize storage, and to provide the ammonia tank for the ceramic filtration system. At \$160,850, the proposed change order represents 5.5% of the original contract amount and therefore doesn't need Board approval (15% is the limit for staff approval). Language was also added regarding invoice timing to make sure the deadline for the CalFire grant is met as well as a commitment to provide certifications for providing USA steel, an Investment Tax Credit requirement to meet domestic content standards.
- NCSD and PR Design staff met with the Placer County Planning Dept. Director to discuss the Use Permit Amendment process. The Placer County Air Pollution Control District (PCAPCD) permit amendment is currently under review.
- PR Design continues to coordinate with Messersmith and subconsultants to further design. Bid documents will be prepared over the next few months in an effort to bid the project in February/March 2026.
- Organic Rankine Cycle (ORC) Power Generators: The ElectraTherm equipment purchase will be processed upon Liberty's service application approval. Staff is checking in regularly regarding the approval.

Regional Collaboration:

- GM Geary with be presenting to a group of nonprofits on October 9 to encourage broad support of the use of forest biomass residue. The organizations include: The Nature Conservancy, Environmental Defense Fund, Breathe California, Central Sierra Environmental Research Center, and Pacific Forest Trust-American Lung Association.
- DPW Martin will present on a panel at the 2025 Biomass and Beyond workshop aimed at creating a resilient bioeconomy.
- Staff is coordinating all aspects of the Corp Yard Car Chargers installation including: scheduling with Liberty Utilities for their portion of the installation, trenching and site work by Ops Dept. staff for the District's side of the power infrastructure, electrical work by San Joaquin Electric, installation inspection with DOWL, and charger purchase and installation by EV Range. A grant agreement amendment to extend the completion deadline with the PCAPCD was also coordinated.
- A brief summary of the response to the water main break in the Rocky Point area of the Indian Hills Condos is provided as an attachment to this report.
- Travis Dwyer was recently promoted to Senior Utility Services Worker after a thorough selection process. Historically, the District has had up to three Senior Utility Services Workers. With Travis' promotion, there are currently two Senior Utility Services Worker positions filled.
- DPW Martin attended the Nevada County Sustainability Summit with thoughtful discussion about a resilient future.
- IT/GIS Coordinator Goates and Nims and Associates representative Aaron Dinette are
 continuing to make progress with the IT infrastructure migration to the Cloud. Storage data is
 currently being moved over in strategic portions. VueWorks, the District's asset management
 platform, is being installed in the cloud as well. Local machines are being updated to the
 Windows 11 operating system as Windows 10 will no longer be supported by Microsoft.
- District Metered Area (DMA) meters were successfully installed and commissioned allowing for enhanced system loss diagnostics for certain areas of the Northstar Water System.
- GM Geary and DPW Martin attended Placer County Water Agency's annual east slope Board meeting.




1. Water System Production and Consumption Trends



- A temporary repair was made late in the evening restoring service to the majority of the units.






Response Information


8-29-2025: Permanent repair was installed.
