ORDINANCE NO. 25-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25, ZONING AND LAND DEVELOPMENT, ARTICLE 800 ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT § 25-800.1 ESTABLISHMENT, MEMBERSHIP AND ORGANIZATION OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 25, Article 800, Section § 25-800.1 is hereby amended.

Section 2.

The following is added:

- d. A vacancy on the Board of Adjustment is created when a member resigns, a member's term of appointment ends, or when a member is disqualified by the body of competent jurisdiction after finding a member ineligible. The resignation of a board member shall be placed in writing to the Chairman of the Board of Adjustment.
- e. When a vacancy on the Board of Adjustment arises, the Chairman shall notify the City Clerk and the City Clerk shall notify City Council of the vacancy. Notice soliciting qualified residents wishing to apply for the vacant position and providing the form of application shall be publicly advertised on the city's website for a period of 30 days before the deadline to submit written application to fill the vacancy.
- f. Applicants for a position on the Board of Adjustment shall be interviewed by City Council in Closed Session and selected by majority of vote of City Council members during a public meeting of City Council. Applicants who were previously interviewed by City Council but were not thereafter appointed to the Board may be appointed by a majority vote of City Council members without a second interview.

Section 3.

All ordinances or portions thereof inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4.

If any portion of this ordinance is declared to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage in the time and manner prescribed by law.

WHEREAS, the effective date of this agreement is January 1, 2025 and shall remain in effect through December 31, 2030, unless cancelled by either party on 30-days prior written notice to the other party; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ocean City shall pay rent to Paul A. Young for the use of Hangar A-4 in the amount of \$600.00 per month and shall increase up to 3% per year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ocean City and Paul A. Young wish to formalize the aforedescribed arrangement; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Ocean City, New Jersey that the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to enter into a written agreement with Paul A. Young substantially similar to the attached Agreement for the City of Ocean City's lease of Hangar A-4; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Ocean City, New Jersey that the City of Ocean City's obligation to pay rent as set forth in the written agreement with Paul A. Young is contingent upon adoption of subsequent operating budgets.

AGREEMENT FOR SUBLEASE OF HANGAR A4 OCEAN CITY AIRPORT

WHEREAS, Paul A. Young, of 1112 Simpson Avenue, Ocean City, NJ 08226 (hereinafter, "Young"), is the sub-lessee of hangar number A-4 in Hangar A as shown on the Plan of Hangars for the Ocean City Airport (hereinafter, "the Hangar"); and,

WHEREAS, the City of Ocean City, of 861 Asbury Avenue, Ocean City, NJ 08226 (hereinafter, "the City" has a need for storage for equipment used in the maintenance of the Ocean City Airport; and,

WHEREAS, the City has been utilizing Young's Hangar for storage of airport groundskeeping equipment since January 1, 2013;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. Recitals.

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein as if set forth at length.

2. Term

The effective date of this Agreement is January 1, 2025. This agreement shall remain in effect. through December 31, 2030, unless cancelled by either party on 30-days prior written notice to the other party.

3. Hangar Rent.

The City shall pay rent to Young for the use of the Hangar in the amount of \$600 per month effective January 1, 2025; thereafter, the rent shall increase up to three percent (3%) per year. Beginning January 1, 2026, the City shall pay Young rent for the Hangar on the first (1*) day of every month. The City's obligation to pay rent is contingent upon the adoption of subsequent operating budgets.

4. Use of the Hangar.

The City covenants and agrees that it will use and occupy the Hangar solely for the storage of airport groundskeeping equipment, and for no other purpose, except upon the prior written consent of Young, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The City shall comply with all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Hangar in respect to the City's use and occupation of the Hangar and shall make all alterations, installations, or additions to the Hangar in compliance with all applicable governmental laws, rules, regulations and requirements.

5. Utilities.

Young shall be responsible to pay for electricity to the Hangar.

6. Maintenance and Repairs.

The City hereby acknowledges that it has examined the Hangar and agrees to accept the Hangar in its current condition, and enters into this agreement without any representation on the part of Young as to the condition thereof. The City shall be solely responsible for the

maintenance of the Hangar and shall keep the same in a state of good condition and repair, and at the end or other expiration of the term hereof, shall deliver up the Hangar in good order and condition, wear and tear from reasonable use thereof excepted, and in broom clean condition. The City shall maintain the Hangar in a clean and sanitary condition, and shall not encumber or obstruct the entrances to the Hangar. The City shall make, at it's sole cost and expense, all repairs necessary to maintain the interior of the Hangar, Notwithstanding the foregoing, Young shall be responsible for repairs, maintenance and replacement (if necessary) of the Hangar door.

7. Insurance.

The City shall obtain and keep in full force and effect at all times during the term of this agreement, at its own cost and expense, for the mutual benefit of Young and the City, comprehensive general liability insurance, with combined single limit coverage to afford protection in an amount not less than \$500,000,000 for injury or death to any one person and \$1,000,000.00 for injury or death to more than one person in any one accident or occurrence and not less than \$250,000.00 for loss or damage to the property of any person, corporation or other entity protecting Young as additional insured against any and all claims for personal injury, death or property damage occurring in, upon, adjacent to or in any way connected with the Hangar or any part thereof.

8. Condemnation.

If the Hangar or any material part thereof shall be condemned for public use, then and in that event, upon the vesting of title to the same for such public use, this agreement shall terminate, anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding. All compensation awarded or paid upon such a total or partial taking of the Hangar shall belong to and be the property of Young.

9. Consent of Hangar A Association of Ocean City, Inc.

Young shall be responsible to obtain any required consents of the Hangar A Association of Ocean City, Inc.

10. Default.

- A. The occurrence of any of the following shall constitute a material default and breach of this agreement by the City:
- (1) A failure by the City to pay, when due, any installment of rent where such failure continues for fifteen (15) days after the same is due.
- (2) A failure by the City to observe and perform any non-monetary terms or conditions of this agreement to be observed or performed by the City, where such failure continues for thirty (30) days after written notice thereof from Young; and
- B. Upon the occurrence of any event of default, Young, at his option, may serve notice upon the City that this agreement and the then unexpired term hereof shall cease and expire and become absolutely void on the date specified in such notice, to be not less than thirty (30) days after the date of such notice. However, in the event the default is due to a non-payment of rent, the City shall have the right to effectuate a cure thereof by payment of any sum due.
- C. In the event of Young's termination of this agreement due to the City's default, Young may re-enter and repossess the Hangar.

11. Governing Law.

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, Any and all actions to enforce this agreement shall be brought in Cape May County, New Jersey.

12. Waiver.

The parties hereto waive a trial by jury of any and all issues arising in any action or proceeding between them or their successors or assigns under or connected with this agreement or any of its provisions or any negotiations in connection therewith or the City's use or occupation of the Hangar.

13. Invalidity of Particular Provisions; No Waivers; Construction.

A. If any term or provision of this agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this agreement shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

B. Failure of a party hereto to complain of any act or omission on the part of the other party hereto or to take any action in response to such act or omission, no matter how long the same may continue, shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any of its rights hereunder.

14. Notices.

All notices under this agreement must be in writing. The notices must be delivered personally or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the other party at the address written in this contract, or to that party's attorney.

15. Partial Invalidity,

If any provision of this agreement shall be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the remaining provisions of this agreement, all of which shall remain in full force and effect.

16. No Assignment.

This agreement shall not be assigned without the written consent of Young,

17. Entire Agreement.

This agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties hereto and there are no other or collateral oral agreements or understandings, No addition, modification or variation from this agreement shall be enforceable unless the same shall be in writing and signed by the parties hereto. The title to paragraphs of this agreement are for convenience of reference only, and are not to be construed as defining, limiting or modifying the scope or intent of any of the terms and conditions of this agreement.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY SITE IMPROVEMENT ADVISORY BOARD FOR A SPECIAL AREA STANDARD FOR PARKING ONLY IN THE SECOND WARD OF OCEAN CITY

- **WHEREAS,** in order to establish uniformity and consistency with residential development in New Jersey, the Residential Site Improvement Standards (RSIS) were adopted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, these statewide standards regulate various aspects of residential development, including water supply, sanitary sewers, storm water management, along with streets and parking; and,
- **WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A 40:55D-40.5 provides that the New Jersey Residential Site Improvement Standards shall supersede any site improvement standards included in any local or municipal zoning ordinance; and,
- **WHEREAS**, the Second Ward of Ocean City, which is the area from the south side of Fourth Street to the north side of Twelve Street, bay to beach, is where most of the city's commercial businesses exist along with many lodging establishments; and
- WHEREAS, this high concentration of commercial businesses in the Second Ward creates a parking shortage or deficit that adversely impacts the quality of life for both residents and visitors of the Second Ward; and,
- WHEREAS, current parking requirements of the New Jersey Residential Site Improvement Standards does not provide adequate off street parking in the Second Ward to accommodate the number of vehicles often associated with new residential development consisting of four (4) or more bedrooms; and
- WHEREAS, to provide much needed parking relief for residents and visitors of the Second Ward, a proposal mandating that all new residential construction that has four (4) or more bedrooms require an off-street parking spot for each bedroom be established; and,
- WHEREAS, this proposed new parking requirement for new construction of homes with four (4) or more bedrooms in the Second Ward would exceed that allowed by Table 4.4 of the New Jersey Residential Site Improvement Standards; and
- **WHEREAS**, in order to provide this parking relief for residents and visitors of the Second Ward, a Special Area Standard must be created for all new residential construction in the Second Ward that has four (4) or more bedrooms; and,
- WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Ocean City desires to create a Special Area Standard for parking applicable for only new residential development in only the Second Ward that includes homes with four (4) or more bedrooms: and
- WHEREAS, approval from that Site Improvement Advisory Board of the Division of Codes and Standards of the Department of Community Affairs would be required since the new proposed off street parking requirement for the Second Ward exceeds that allowed by Table 4.4 of the Residential Site Improvements Standards; and,
- **WHEREAS**, in order to obtain approval from the Site Improvement Advisory Board for a Special Area Standard for off street parking for the Second Ward, an application must be submitted and filed with the Site Improvement Advisory Board requesting the same in accordance with *N.J.A.C* 5:21-3.5; and,
- **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the governing body of the city of Ocean City of the following:
 - 1. The recitals as listed and described above are hereby incorporated into this resolution.

- 2. Authorizes the city to file an application with the Site Improvement Advisory Board of the Division of Codes and Standards of the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs for a Special Area Standard from the Residential Site Improvement Standards (RSIS) in order to provide off street parking standards for the construction of new homes only in the city's Second Ward, which consist of four (4) or more bedrooms.
- 3. This application to the Site Improvement Advisory Board shall require an off-street parking spot for every bedroom for new residential construction of homes that have four (4) or more bedrooms and shall only be applicable to the Second Ward.

4.	This resolution shall take effect immediately after passage.

REVOCABLE LICENSE FOR FENCE ENCROACHMENT

Agreement made, effective as of ________, 2025, by and between THE CITY OF OCEAN CITY, a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey, of 861 Asbury Avenue, Ocean City, NJ 08226 (hereinafter "City"), which is the owner of a certain 65' wide right-of-way known as Simpson Avenue and 60' wide right-of-way known as Fifth Street, and MICHAEL P. MURPHY, JR. and JILL N. MURPHY, owners of 15 Fifth Street, Ocean City, NJ 08226 (hereinafter collectively "LICENSEES").

WITNESSETH:

- A. LICENSEES are the owners of Lot 29, Block 411, situated in the City of Ocean City, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey (hereinafter, the "Property"), and City is the owner of the 65' wide right-of-way known as Simpson Avenue and 60' wide right-of-way known as Fifth Street adjacent to the south east side of the Property (see Copy of the final as-built survey prepared by The Hyland Group dated July 8, 2025, attached hereto as Exhibit A).
- B. LICENSEES propose to install a fence enclosing the Property in order to enhance the safety of their yards and would like to install the fence no closer than two (2') feet from the edge of the existing sidewalks, rather than on the property lines of the Property.
- C. LICENSEES and City desire to create a revocable encroachment license over the area between the property lines of the Property and the fence to be constructed by LICENSEES, and permit LICENSEES to install a conforming fence no more than two (2') feet beyond the property lines, and at least two (2') feet from the edge of the existing sidewalks for the benefit of the Property, subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

LICENSEES and City agree as follows:

A revocable license for the proposed a conforming fence no more than two (2') feet beyond the property lines, and at least two (2') feet from the edge of the existing sidewalks in favor of the LICENSEES' property is created over that portion of the City rights-of-way adjacent to Lot 29, Block 411 and located as depicted on the attached Exhibit A.

This revocable license agreement is specifically intended to and shall run with the land until (a) the fence to be installed in accordance herewith is demolished or removed, after which there shall be no license or other permission for the replacement or reconstruction of any improvements within the public sidewalk, street or right-of-way; or (b) until this revocable license is revoked and extinguished by the City upon 90 days written notice to LICENSEES, or LICENSEES'S successor in title, after which the encroachment shall be completely removed and

the public right-of-way restored in a manner consistent with the immediately surrounding area (be it grassed or concrete) at the sole expense of LICENSEES or LICENSEES' successor in title.

LICENSEES shall be responsible for the care and maintenance of the fence. It shall be LICENSEES' responsibility after full execution of this license to record this license with the Cape May County Clerk's Office and provide a copy of the recorded document to the City.
