3 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Ceci, are you ready?

4 MADAM CLERK: Yes.

5 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Okay.

6 MADAM CLERK: Thank you, Deputy Mayor. Board
7 of Commissioners Public Meeting. Today is Tuesday,
8 August 5, 2025, and the time is now 7:07 p.m.

9 Pursuant to the requirements of the Open
10 Public Meeting Act, (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975), notice of
11 this meeting was published in November 21, 2024, issues
12 of the Nutley Sun, The Herald News, and The Star-
13 Ledger. A copy of this notice has been posted on the
14 Nutley Town Hall Bulletin Board, and a copy is on file
15 in the Municipal Clerk's office.

16 Deputy Mayor Evans?

17 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Here.

18 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Tucci is absent,
19 excused. Commissioner Scarpelli?

20 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Here.

21 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

22 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Here.

23 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Kelly?

24 MAYOR KELLY: Present.

25 MADAM CLERK: All present, Mayor, except for

1 Commissioner Tucci. He's absent, excused.

2 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: I want to acknowledge
3 that the Mayor is online this evening. He's in
4 transit, serving our country. So, Mayor, thank you for
5 taking the time to be able to join us tonight.

6 MAYOR KELLY: Happy to be here.

7 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Okay. Madam Clerk,
8 minutes?

9 MADAM CLERK: Yes. We have regular meeting
10 minutes for June 17, 2025. I need a motion, please.

11 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Move it.

12 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

13 MADAM CLERK: Sorry. Deputy Mayor Evans?

14 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Aye.

15 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

16 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

17 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

18 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

19 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Kelly?

20 MAYOR KELLY: Aye.

21 MADAM CLERK: Thank you.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Communications, please.

23 MADAM CLERK: Yes. The Nutley Music Boosters
24 Association has submitted a letter requesting
25 permission to hold raffles on Sunday, November 23rd,

1 2025, at 3 p.m. at 44 Park Avenue. Motion, please.

2 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Move it.

3 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

4 MADAM CLERK: Deputy Mayor Evans?

5 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Aye.

6 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

7 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

8 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Petracco?

9 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Aye.

10 MADAM CLERK: Mayor Kelly?

11 MAYOR KELLY: Aye.

12 MADAM CLERK: Thank you. That's all for
13 communications.

14 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: On reports, I have a
15 Code Enforcement Report for June '25 and for the second
16 quarter 2025. The bills?

17 MADAM CLERK: Yes, Deputy Mayor. We have the
18 bill list for August 5, 2025. Public Affairs,
19 \$191,008.43. Revenue and Finance, \$4,246,689.62.
20 Public Safety, \$307,857.57. Public Works, \$141,744.09.
21 Parks and Public Property, \$1,460,614.40. And Water
22 and Sewer Utility, \$143,560.30.

23 And we have payroll for July 18, 2025.
24 Regular payroll, \$1,051,102.76. Overtime for July 18th
25 is 95 -- I'm sorry, \$97,513.49. And then we have

1 payroll for August 1, 2025. Regular payroll total,
2 \$1,034,201.18, and the overtime payroll was \$64,581.56,
3 for a total payroll of \$1,098,782.74, and a grand total
4 of \$8,738,873.40.

5 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Move the bills.

6 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Second.

7 MADAM CLERK: Deputy Mayor Evans?

8 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Aye.

9 MADAM CLERK: Commissioner Scarpelli?

10 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Aye.

17 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Thank you.

18 Moving on, does anyone wish to comment, public comment
19 on the agenda items that are on -- that we have this
20 evening?

21 Seeing no one, Commissioners, any announcements this
22 evening? Mr. Scarpelli?

23 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I just would like to say
24 one more time we have had a couple more break-ins looking
25 for car keys and things like that. A lot of the times,
it's the

1 doors are left open either on the cars or in the homes.

2 The other thing I would just -- I've been
3 shouting this message for probably 18 years now,
4 sitting up here. Please, if you see something strange
5 in your neighborhood, call the police department.
6 You're not bothering us. You're really helping us.
7 You know, the cops can't be on every side street, every
8 main drag, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We'd rather
9 go check it out and laugh about it and say, yeah, the
10 person was legit or, you know, no foul.

11 But we could really use the public's help if
12 you do -- please, you see something strange in your
13 neighborhood, you don't even have to give your name
14 when you call the police department. You could call
15 anonymously. But please, help us help you. Thank you.

16 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Deputy Mayor, may we
17 have a moment of silence for Commissioner's Petracco's
18 dad?

19 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Absolutely. Thank you.
20 I was going to do the same thing.

21 (Pause)

22 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Commissioner, our
23 condolences to you and your family.

24 COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: Thank you, guys.

25 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: I just have one

1 announcement. One was the assembly office was here
2 today for assist helping people with filling out their
3 tax relief application they call PSA-1 forms for
4 questions. I want to thank them for coming into town,
5 and I also want to acknowledge that as through the
6 Revenue and Finance Office, that the tax collector is
7 available daily to assist taxpayers as well if they
8 have questions with the same form. Just give her a
9 call and we'll set up an appointment, be happy to help.
10 And you want a reminder that those forms are due to be
11 filed before October 31st.

12 Mayor Kelly, do you have anything to add in
13 terms of public announcement?

14 MAYOR KELLY: Nothing from me this evening.
15 Thank you.

16 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Okay. Moving on to
17 ordinances. We have three ordinances on tonight for
18 public hearing. They fall into my area. The first one
19 is 3592. This is for capital improvement funding,
20 which is part of the One Nutley Program, which will
21 assist in making improvements within the Township,
22 specifically, assisting with the renovations for the
23 middle school, which will enable sixth graders to
24 attend middle school starting in September of 2026.

25 Open public hearing. Seeing no one, close

1 public hearing.

2 COMMISSIONER SCARPELLI: Second.

3 MADAM CLERK: Deputy Mayor Evans?

4 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Aye.

23 One's for the sewer utility. The other's

24 (indiscernible) town. Can I do them together?

25 MR. BRUNO: You can.

1 DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: Okay. So the next two
2 ordinances, 3594 and 3595, this is our regular
3 authorization for capital improvement for the -- in the
4 Township. It basically covers improvements to our
5 buildings, to our parks, public safety are the primary
6 users of these funds. We maintain a capital
7 improvement program that's in generally between 1.5 and
8 \$2 million per year, which helps us stabilize our debt
9 over the long term. And it's worked very well keeping
10 our debt, actually, less than four percent of our
11 annual appropriation, which, by comparison, is quite
12 low. 3595 is actually for a utility vehicle for the
13 water's use utility.

14 Does anyone wish to comment on these
15 ordinances this evening? Seeing no one, close the
16 public hearing.

6 right. Thank you.

7 My resolutions for this evening.

8 Whereas, on January 7, 2025, the Township of
9 Nutley authorized Resolution Number 09-25 to enter into
10 a contract with The Law Firm of O'Toole Scrivo, 14
11 Village Park, Cedar Grove, New Jersey;

12 Whereas, Change Order 1 has been authorized
13 for the original contract to increase it by \$45,000;

14 Whereas, the funds are available from Account
15 5-01-012-205 and have been certified by the Chief
16 Financial Officer, said certification being attached to
17 this resolution;

18 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board
19 of Commissioners in the Township of Nutley, County of
20 Essex, State of New Jersey, that the Change Order
21 Number 1, as attached, is a change from the contract
22 previously made by the Township of Nutley with the The
23 Law Firm of O'Toole Scrivo, and it is hereby authorized
24 and approved.

25 So moved.

6 was completed earlier this year. We did have a few
7 minor points to address, and we've agreed to do that in
8 compliance with the statutory requirements from the
9 Division of Community Affairs.

10 Whereas, the New Jersey Budget and Fiscal
11 Affairs Laws require all local governments to prepare
12 and send in a Corrective Action Plan as part of their
13 annual audit process;

14 Whereas the Corrective Action Plan, which the
15 Chief Financial Officer prepared and placed on file
16 with the Township Clerk within 60 days from the date
17 the governing body received the audit, outlines actions
18 the Township will take to correct the recommendations
19 listed in the Comments and Recommendations section of
20 the 2024 audit report;

21 Whereas, the Chief Financial Officer has
22 provided the attached Corrective Action Plan, which
23 covers the findings and recommendations outlined in the
24 2024 report;

25 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board

1 of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley that they
2 hereby approve the Corrective Action Plan prepared by
3 the Chief Financial Officer in response to the 2024
4 Audit report; and

5 Be it further resolved that the Corrective
6 Action Plan shall be placed on file with the Office of
7 the Township Clerk and shall be referenced in the
8 synopsis of the audit report; and

9 Be it further resolved that this resolution
10 will take effect immediately.

6 of Commissioners, Township of Nutley, in the County of
7 Essex, State of New Jersey, that the Treasurer is
8 hereby authorized to refund payments for recreation
9 programs in the amounts listed below.

18 Whereas, the applications have been reviewed
19 and approved by the Municipal Clerk and the Police
20 Department;

12 of the inactive Class C liquor licenses listed below

13 have filed renewal applications with the Division of

14 Alcoholic Beverage Control and with the Clerk of the

15 Township of Nutley for the '25/'26 licensing term; and

16 Whereas, on January 16, 2024, Governor Philip

17 D. Murphy Signed legislation, which amended

18 NJSA 33:1-12.39 effective August 1, 2024, providing

19 that an inactive Class C license shall not be renewed

20 if it has not been actively used in connection with the

21 operations of a licensed premises within two

22 consecutive license term; and, if the license remains

23 inactive at the end of the two-year term will expire

24 unless the municipal issuing authority extends the

25 period and renews the license for an additional one

1 year.

2 Additionally, pursuant to the terms of the
3 new law and concurrent with the effective date,
4 August 1st, 2024, holders of inactive Class C licenses
5 no longer petition the Director for good cause to
6 receive 12.39 relief in order for the municipal issuing
7 authority to renew the inactive license. However, the
8 governing body of a municipality may in its discretion
9 extend the period during which the license may remain
10 inactive for an additional year.

11 Whereas, the applications for renewal of the
12 inactive liquor license set forth within are complete
13 in all aspects, the municipal/state fees have been paid
14 and Tax Clearance Certificates obtained, and the
15 applicants are qualified to be licensed according to
16 all statutory, regulatory, and local government
17 Alcoholic Beverage Control laws and regulations,
18 including NJSA 33:1-12.39 and the Division of Alcoholic
19 Beverage Control Advisory Notice 2025-01 on the
20 implementation of said statute.

21 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board
22 of Commissioners, Township of Nutley, County of Essex,
23 State of New Jersey that the renewal of the following
24 inactive Plenary Retail Consumption Licenses be granted
25 to the following licensees and the Township be and is

1 hereby authorized to sign and issue license certificate
2 to said licensees effective July 1, 2025, through
3 June 30, 2026:

4 License Number 0716-33-017-011, Mat Holdings,
5 and License Number 0716-33-029-010, Mat Holdings,
6 Plenary Retail Consumption License.

22 Whereas, the Township of Nutley wishes to
23 install and maintain surveillance/ALPR cameras and
24 equipment on traffic signals within rights of way
25 belonging to the County of Essex County;

1 Whereas, the County requires that Nutley
2 submit a certified copy of a resolution approved by the
3 Board of Commissioners indicating that Nutley will hold
4 the County of Essex harmless from any claims or actions
5 of law directly resulting in -- from the installation
6 and maintenance of said surveillance/ALPR cameras and
7 equipment;

8 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board
9 of Commissioners, Township of Nutley, a Memorandum of
10 Understanding with the County of Essex. Said
11 memorandum shall be in the form attached hereto, or
12 substantially similar thereto, and shall have a Hold
13 Harmless and Indemnification provision providing for
14 indemnification of the County of Essex for any claims
15 directly arising from Nutley's use of traffic signals,
16 rights of way all belonging to the County of Essex for
17 the purpose of installing and maintaining surveillance
18 cameras and equipment;

19 Be it further resolved that a copy of the
20 resolution and executed Memorandum of Understanding
21 will be Hold Harmless and Indemnification provision
22 shall be filed with the Nutley Municipal Clerk Office
23 and by the Chief of Police.

24 I move resolution.

10 sorry. Where NJS 40A:4-87 provides the Director of the
11 Division of Local Government Services may approve the
12 insertion of any special item of revenue in the budget
13 of the county or municipality when such item shall have
14 been made available by law and the amount therefore was
15 not determined at the time of the adoption of budget;
16 and

17 Whereas, the Director may also approve the
18 insertion of appropriation for the equal amount;

19 Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Board
20 of Commissioners, the Township of Nutley, County of
21 Essex, New Jersey, hereby requests the Director of
22 Division of Local Government Services to approve the
23 insertion of an item of revenue in the budget of the
24 year 2025 in the sum of 7,000, which item is now
25 available in revenue from the Distracted Driving

1 Crackdown Grant pursuant to the provisions of the
2 statute;

3 Be it further resolved that the like sum of
4 7,000 same and hereby appropriated under the caption,
5 General Appropriations, appropriations excluded from
6 the CAPS, Distracted Driver and Crackdown and Grant,
7 other expenses, \$7,000;

8 And, therefore, it be resolved and
9 notification of these budget changes will be made by
10 the Chief Financial Officer to the Director of the
11 Division of Local Government Services through an
12 electronic submission process.

13 I move the resolution.
