16	COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: The only kind of
17	question I have is I've been around town a lot, and
18	Mayor Kelly, can you hear me?
19	MAYOR KELLY: Yeah. I can hear you.
20	COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: I was just wondering,
21	because I've been getting stopped an awful lot, of
22	whatever happened with the Board of Education and the
23	audit? Did they do it? Are we doing it?
24	It's kind of embarrassing, like, when people
25	come up to me and ask me the question of what's going

on with that because I haven't heard anything. Has anybody on our board?

DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: So the subcommittee has a while ago met on that, and one of the critical actions that we had to take was to find a source of funding that could pay for that. So we were fortunate in that, working with the Assemblyman Venezia, we've been able to receive a state grant of \$100,000 to be able to conduct the audit.

Right now, it's now identifying someone who has the skills to do a comprehensive forensic audit of the school board, and so it's moving along. It's not done yet, but the board understands it needs to be done. We now have identified the funding for that, right? And the funding came to the municipality, so the municipality will pay for it, right?

COMMISSIONER PETRACCO: But the Board of Ed will do it?

DEPUTY MAYOR EVANS: But the Board of Ed will do it. But they -- we're going to make sure that whoever is selected is qualified to do it. But that -- so to answer your question, it hasn't been done yet. It hasn't been forgotten. It will come.
