WHEREAS, food Allergy Awareness Week was established as a national week of encouraging food allergy awareness and supporting those who are affected by food allergies and anaphylaxis; and

WHEREAS, food allergies affect as many as 32 million Americans, including 6 million children; and

WHEREAS, the prevalence of food allergies appears to be increasing among children under the age of 18, which is 2 students in every classroom; and

WHEREAS, nine foods account for 90 percent of all food allergy reactions: Peanuts, Tree Nuts, Milk, Egg, Wheat, Soy, Fish, Shellfish, and Sesame.

WHEREAS, a food allergy is an immune system response to a food the body mistakenly believes is harmful. When a person with food allergy eats the food, his or her immune system releases massive amounts of chemicals, including histamine, that trigger a cascade of symptoms that can affect the respiratory system, the gastrointestinal tract, the skin, and/or the cardiovascular system; and

WHEREAS, anaphylaxis is a serious allergic reaction that comes on quickly and has the potential to become life-threatening, and there is no cure for food allergies, so strict avoidance is the only way to prevent an allergic reaction; and

WHEREAS, food Allergy and Anaphylaxis Connection Team (FAACT) is a national, nonprofit organization committed to their mission to educate, advocate, and raise awareness for all individuals and families affected by food allergies and life-threatening anaphylaxis;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners in the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey recognize the week of May 11-17, 2025, as

Food Allergy Awareness Week

and encourage all residents to increase their understanding and awareness of this potentially life-threatening medical condition, improving the quality of life of the 32 million Americans affected by food allergies and anaphylaxis.

WHEREAS, the Township of Nutley has a need to retain the professional services of FAR Planning. (“FAR”), to provide architectural planning and architectural consulting services related to the ongoing redevelopment of the Hoffmann-LaRoche/ON 3 campus (the “Services”); and

WHEREAS, this contract is awarded without competitive bidding as a “Professional Service” in accordance with N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5 of the Local Public Contracts Law because the contract is for professional services; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that FAR, located at 190 Veterans Drive, Suite 210, Norhvale, NJ 07647 is qualified and best suited to provide the Services to the Township of Nutley; and

WHEREAS, FAR has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that it has not made any reportable disqualifying contribution to a political or candidate committee in the Township of Nutley in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit them from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, funds are available from Account No. 5-01-226-205 and will be certified by the Chief Financial Officer, said certification being attached to this resolution and/or will be reimbursed by escrow accounts to be established with the designated redeveloper of the subject property; and

WHEREAS, FAR has submitted a proposal for the Services and, in accordance with the proposal will perform the Services at a cost not to exceed \$75,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the anticipated term of this contract is for twelve (12) months, from May 6, 2025 through December 31, 2025; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, State of New Jersey, that:

1. The Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with FAR, as a professional service, in an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00.
2. A copy of this Resolution, as well as the Contract, shall be placed on file with the Clerk of Township of Nutley; and a notice in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law of the State of New Jersey shall be published in the Nutley Sun.
