WHEREAS, PB Nutclif Master, LLC (“PB Nutclif”) pursued a first appeal (the “First Appeal”) against the Township of Nutley (the “Township”) before the Essex County Construction Board of Appeals (the “Board”) alleging that certain invoices were improperly charged against PB Nutclif’s escrow accounts and which, by Order of the Board adopted on March 22, 2022, resulted in the Board affirming PB Nutclif’s appeal in the amount of \$127,608.31; and

WHEREAS, on November 16, 2021, PB Nutclif pursued a separate and second appeal against the Township before the Board (the “Second Appeal”) alleging that invoices were improperly charged against PB Nutclif’s escrow accounts totaling \$52,418.81, in addition to those at issue in the First Appeal; and

WHEREAS, the Township accepted the decision by the Board finding in favor of PB Nutclif on the First Appeal, less a disputed sum of \$60,865.15 (the “Disputed Sum”) and has acknowledged the Second Appeal; and

WHEREAS, the Township and PB Nutclif have engaged in settlement discussions regarding the First Appeal Second Appeal and Disputed Sum, which have resulted in an agreement to resolve the differences between them; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that agreement, the Township has agreed to: (i) terminate the Escrow Agreements for Phase IIB and III and close the current escrow accounts for PB Nutclif relating to Phase IIA, Phase IIB, and Phase III; (ii) refund PB Nutclif \$177,996.71 for the First Appeal, Second Appeal and Disputed Sum in the amount of \$141,893.52 and the return the remaining escrow balances for accounts IIA, IIB and III in the amount of \$36,103.19; and

WHEREAS, funds are available in account 4-01-226-205, 4-01-012-205, T-15-909-918, T-15-912-921 and T-15-912-920 which has been certified by the Chief Financial Officer, such certification being attached to this resolution; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Nutley, County of Essex, New Jersey that the Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a settlement document in a form acceptable to the Township Attorney which shall include, among other terms, a payment to PB Nutclif in a total amount of \$177,996.71; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Financial Officer be and is hereby authorized to issue the refunds to PB Nutclif as set forth herein.

WHEREAS, the following year, the first official Juneteenth celebrations took place in Texas and have continued across the United States throughout the years; and

WHEREAS, In 1979, Texas became the first state to make Juneteenth an official holiday; several others followed suit over the years. In June 2021, Congress passed a resolution establishing Juneteenth as a federal holiday; President Biden signed it into law on June 17, 2021.; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth is an important opportunity to honor the principles of the Declaration of Independence and celebrate the achievements and contributions of African Americans have made, and continue to make across our country;
