**6.1 INFORMATIONAL PAMPHLET UPDATE.**

The Clerk of the Board presented the informational pamphlet draft to the Board. Director Gregorio suggested to change the language in part of the pamphlet and to change the logo on the front to full color. Director Gregorio also suggested to highlight the section regarding what will happen if the proposed benefit assessment does not pass. Director Kelley suggested to highlight the current demand for services call number. Director Kelley also suggested to add an email address for a point of contact.

The Board discussed other ways to reach the public. Chairman Nelson noted how important it is to advertise on Facebook. Director Gregorio would like to go to businesses to obtain letters of support. Director Kelley questioned if the volunteers would be willing to put up a table at Wal-Mart or other businesses to hand out informational pamphlets.

**6.2 BALLOT DESIGN UPDATE.**

The Clerk of the Board presented the ballot design draft to the Board. Director Gregorio suggested that the logo on the ballot is changed to full color. Director Gregorio also suggested to change the color to red for the title 'Official Ballot'. The Clerk of the Board reported that all ballots will be mailed and tabulated by Alissia Northrup's office at the County.

The Board discussed the possibility of changing the language on the ballot and what it would take to move forward with a change. The Clerk of the Board noted that it would take a special meeting that would need to be scheduled immediately to change the language that has been previously adopted in Ordinance 21-001.

Director Erler and Director Kelley would like to keep the wording as is. The Board agrees to keep the language as is in the ballot and to just move forward with changes on the informational pamphlet.

**6.3 PRICING FOR POSTAGE.**

The Clerk of the Board reported that the cost of having ballots be printed, mailed, and coded will cost approximately \$14,524.35. The Clerk of the Board also noted that it will be a savings of over \$9,0000 compared to ballots and informational guide that was mailed out last year. Pro Vote Solutions is company that will be printing and mailing out the ballots and informational guides; the same company that the County uses for elections.

STAFF REPORT – ADOPT RESOLUTION NO. 21-002 FOR CAL-OES ASSIGNMENTS AND PORTAL TO PORTAL PAY

BACKGROUND

Employees of the Crescent Fire Protection District, both career and volunteer, have participated in the past in station coverage assignments and on fire assignments in the State Responsibility Areas for CALFIRE. There is also potential to participate in fire assignments as a local government resource through CALOES; this occurred last September on the Slater Fire that burned from Happy Camp to Gasquet overnight where personnel were deployed for multiple days engaged in structure protection and fire attack. Fire Personnel utilized an engine and water tender on assignment in the Gasquet area. Because the fire was not a CALFIRE incident, timecards and pay sheets (F-42's) had to be submitted through CALOES, a practice that had not been required for a number of years.

It was found that Crescent Fire Protection District did not have a current salary schedule on file with CALOES. Volunteer fire personnel are paid a set rate by both CALOES and CALFIRE. While straight time base rates are listed on the annual salary survey logged with CALOES, agencies are reimbursed at an overtime rate of time and a half at invoicing for base rates for personnel of the rank of Battalion Chief or below. Positions above Battalion Chief are paid straight time. The personnel base rates are as follows:

- Battalion Chief                      \$27.14 (ST)    \$40.71 (OT) per hour
- Captain                                \$22.58 (ST)    \$33.87 (OT) per hour
- Engineer                                \$22.58 (ST)    \$33.87 (OT) per hour
- Firefighter                              \$22.58 (ST)    \$33.87 (OT) per hour

Per past practice, personnel have been paid at the overtime rate as paid by CALFIRE or CALOES as they were the persons who agreed to the assignment and took time away from work and family. The District has retained the revenue from any fire apparatus or vehicle use, and the 10% total administrative fee. There is no proposal to change any of this practice.

There is a difference with how hours are assigned between state and federal agencies. The state pays on a "Portal to Portal" basis for personnel and apparatus for assignments lasting longer than 24 hours committed. The federal agencies often pay at a rate of 16-hour days for personnel and

apparatus assigned to incidents where commitments are longer than 24 hours. Under the “Agreement for Local Government Fire and Emergency Assistance to the State of California and Federal Fire Agencies California Fire Assistance Agreement (CFAA)” there is a provision to pay local government resources on a 24 hour “Portal to Portal” basis, even when assigned to incidents in excess of 24 hours where an agency would not otherwise pay, so long as the local government agency has a “Portal to Portal” resolution adopted by its governing board and the resolution is filed with CALOES.

### FISCAL IMPACT

There is no negative fiscal impact from adoption of Resolution 21-002 adopting and authorizing “Portal to Portal” payments on fire personnel, apparatus and vehicles. It will require full payment for personnel and resources committed to an incident, especially a federal incident.

## ELECTION SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into this 10th day of May, 2021, by and between the Crescent Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as “District”, and Alissia Northrup, County Elections Officer/Registrar of Voters of the County of Del Norte, hereinafter referred to as the “Elections Officer”, relating to the handling, tabulation, and storage of the Crescent Fire Protection District Benefit Assessment Mailed Ballot Proceeding (hereinafter referred to as the “Assessment Ballot Proceeding”).

### RECITALS

- A. The District has determined it is necessary and desirable to secure certain election services related to the handling, tabulation, and storage of ballots.
- B. The Elections Officer is qualified and willing to provide such election services pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

### AGREEMENT

1. Scope of Services. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the Elections Officer will perform the services set forth in Exhibit “A”.
2. Term of Agreement. This Agreement will remain in effect until June 30, 2021. This agreement may be extended by written mutual agreement.
3. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to its subject matter, and it supersedes and replaces any prior or contemporaneous understandings or agreements, whether written or oral, between the parties with respect to such subject matter.
4. Amendment. This Agreement may be amended only by a written agreement executed by the parties hereto at the time of the modification.
5. Signature. The following signers represent that they are authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the party for whom they sign. The parties agree that signatures on this Agreement transmitted electronically in PDF format have the same force and effect, and are considered the same as, originals.

## **EXHIBIT A SCOPE OF SERVICES**

### Method of Voting

A notice of assessment and ballot were mailed to property owners of the Crescent Fire Protection District on May 30, 2021. The ballot allows property owners to express their support or opposition to the proposed assessment. Property owners who own more than one property will receive separate ballots for each property. Each ballot provides the following parcel information:

- Owner of Record
- Count Code
- Parcel Number
- Units of Benefit
- Use Classification
- Annual Assessment Cost

For ballots to be considered valid, the Yes or No box must be checked and the property owner must sign the ballot. The District has made accommodations for replacement ballots, for instance if a ballot is lost or a property owner wants to change their vote. The law requires that each assessment ballot be signed by the record owner of the parcel. In order to maintain anonymity, the Election Office will handle and store all ballots. A postage paid return envelope addressed to the Elections Office (981 H Street, Suite 160, Crescent City, CA 95531) was provided with each mailed ballot.

### Public Hearing

By law, at least 45 days must elapse between mailing of the ballots and the public hearing. A public hearing before the Crescent Fire Protection District Board will be held on Monday, June 14 at 5:00 p.m. at the Washington Station. At the public hearing, the District will announce the alternate date/location for tabulating the ballots. Ballot tabulation will commence on June 15 at 10AM at the Board Chambers led by the County Election's Office. Notices regarding tabulation will be posted at the Elections Office, Fire Station, and on the District's website with a link to view a live stream of the tabulation.

### Tabulation

Ballots are weighted according to the proportional financial obligation of the affected property (i.e., the total assessment amount of "yes" votes vs. the total assessment amount of "no" votes). Laptops with spreadsheets will be provided for entering ballot data. Ballots will be removed from the envelope and sorted by "yes" votes, "no" votes, and invalid ballots. The tabulation program will allow the count code and units of benefit to be entered on the spreadsheets. After all ballots have been entered, the total annual cost will be calculated.

### Results

The assessment will not be imposed if, upon the conclusion of the public hearing, weighted ballots submitted in opposition to the assessment exceed the weighted ballots submitted in favor of the assessment. The ballots are weighted according to the proportional financial obligation of the affected property.

### Reporting

The results of the tabulation will be announced following tabulation and certified at the July 12 Crescent Fire Protection District Board Meeting.

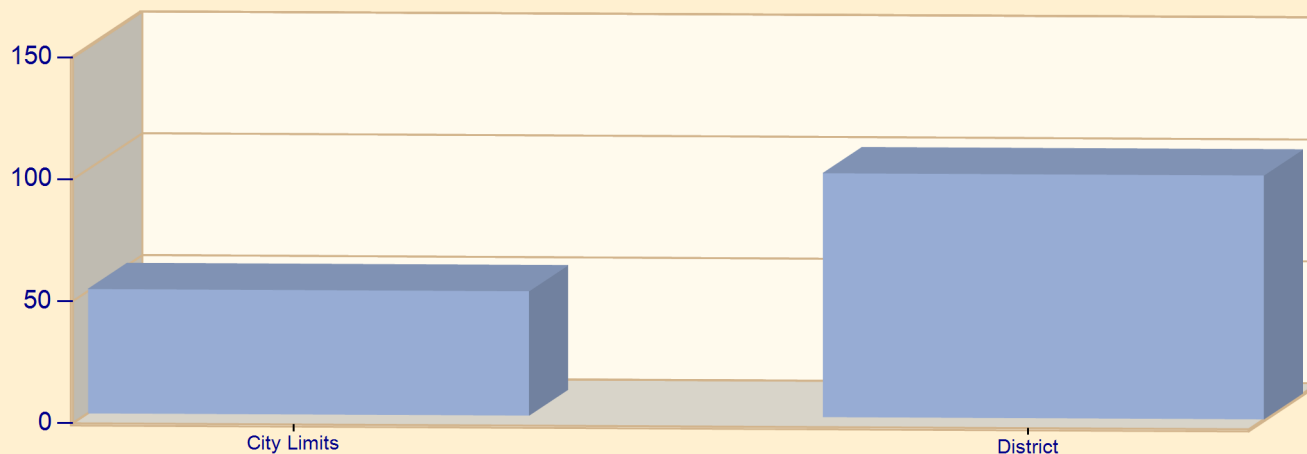

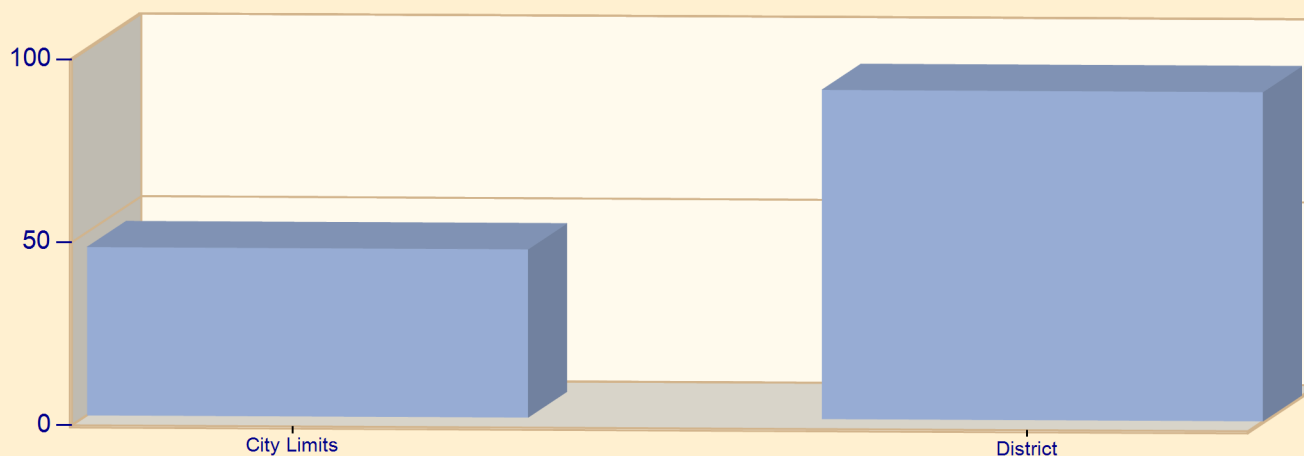
