Chairman Nelson called the meeting to order at 5:35 PM. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice Chair Short. Vice Chair Short and Director Erler were sworn in after reading the Oath of Office.

Chairman Nelson noted there is no report out of closed session.

**4.1** APPROVE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF NOVEMBER 14, 2022

On a motion by Vice Chair Short, seconded by Director Gregorio, motion carried unanimously 5/0; the Board of Directors approved the Consent Calendar.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

**5.1** CONSIDER AND APPROVE REPAIR AND RECERTIFICATION OF WT-5150

Chief Carey stated that Captain Borges has been in communication with various diesel mechanics and pump technicians. All sources agree on what course of action needs to be taken; the pump impeller has excessive damage and will need to be repaired. Chief Carey expressed the importance of having an additional working water tender along with WT-5159.

On a motion by Director Gregorio, seconded by Vice Chair Short, motion carried unanimously 5/0; the Board of Directors approved up to \$17,000 in repairs and recertification of WT-5150.

**5.2** CONSIDER AND AUTHORIZE STAFF TO MAKE A ONE-TIME PURCHASE OF A WATER TENDER OR ENGINE ABOVE THE AUTHORIZED PURCHASING AMOUNT

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board of Directors

Chief Carey briefed the Board stating Crescent City Fire & Rescue is attempting to keep to a proactive and responsible vehicle replacement program. With the help of Senior Fleet Mechanic Jason Borges, CCF&R is actively researching feasible replacements for aging apparatus. Water Tender 5159 is in solid working condition as front line water tender. 5150 is out of service awaiting pump repairs. With the purchase of an additional water tender, the district will be able to contract a water tender out to other agencies and incidents throughout much of the year. This can be a valuable source of revenue for a relatively small investment. We will be researching the best values on the market to decide whether to purchase a Fire Engine or

a Water Tender. Having an increased fleet of available water source with a water tender, could positively affect our Department's ISO rating in the future. Director/Battalion Chief Gregorio will be very active in the research process for this purchase.

On a motion by Vice Chair Short, seconded by Director Gregorio, motion carried unanimously 5/0; the Board of Directors authorized staff to make a one-time purchase of a water tender or engine above the authorized purchasing amount.

Vanessa, Clerk of the Board, stated there had recently been a claim submitted to Golden State Risk Management regarding the theft at Cooper Station. The District was reimbursed the costs of the stolen/damaged items minus the deductible.

Chief Carey also mentioned the need to fill the vacant positions on the District's Oversight Committee. The Board advised running a radio ad to attract potential applicants.

At the next meeting Chairman Nelson would like to review the possibilities of selling Cooper Station and building a new station in a different location.

4. CONSIDER AND APPROVE A 50/50 SPLIT PURCHASE WITH THE CITY FOR THERMAL IMAGERS AND RADIOS

Chief Carey briefed the board stating that as Firefighters, we depend on a few things for us to do our job effectively. One is our SCBA's to do work and attempt to save lives in hazardous atmospheres, and the second is our Radio/Communications equipment. He stated that the department's current radios are a hodgepodge collection of hand me downs and small purchases over the past couple of decades. We have no fewer than 3 different manufacturers and 5 different models in use. Many of our radios were given to us from various departments who, at the time, determined them to be outdated for their needs. Most of these radios are from before the 2015 merger and in the case of the Motorolas, do not have available parts or servicers to repair. He went on to say that the Department has an exciting and unique opportunity right now to really address a lacking part of our operational infrastructure. The department has had to piecemeal small purchases and hand me down radios for decades; with Measure S and the benefit assessment, we can responsibly use public supported monies to fund our dire need for radios.

*The following citizen addressed the Board:*

Roger Gitlin: questioned the amount of thermal imager cameras (TICs) each agency would be receiving; *Chief Carey stated both the City and the District will receive 6 handheld TICs and 1 larger TIC for the duty officer, for a total of 12 handheld and 2 larger TICs.*

Chairman Nelson questioned the difference in Motorola and Kenwood brand radios; Director Gregorio and Chief Carey spoke about the quality of the Kenwood radios, which is what most departments are currently using.

Director Erler questioned what the department would do with the older radios; Chief Carey stated that the radios would be delegated to various agencies in need, one of which would be the Fire Explorer Program.

Chief Carey explained the plan is to have a cache of radios that the volunteers would "checkout" upon arrival at a station to respond to a call and will rely on their pagers when they are not at a station.

Director Gregorio questioned the compatibility with City Police and Sherriff's office; Chief Carey noted that they most agencies are using Kenwood radios.

Directory Kelley questioned the lifespan of the Kenwood radios; Chief Carey stated that each radio has an average of 8-10 years.

Chief Carey recommended the Board go forward with the first quote to avoid making small purchases throughout the years. This will ensure the department receives the number of radios needed to operate safely and sufficiently.

*The following citizen addressed the Board:*

*Roger Gitlin asked for clarification on the cost of the radios; Chief Carey reported the District's share would be approximately 45,500. The City would need to approve the same amount in order to purchase a total of 60 radios, 12 handheld TICs and 2 larger TICs for Crescent City Fire & Rescue.*

On a motion by Director Gregorio, seconded by Vice Chair Short, motion carried unanimously 5/0; the Board of Directors APPROVED A BUDGET TRANSFER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$45,500 FOR A 50/50 SPLIT PURCHASE WITH THE CITY FOR THERMAL IMAGERS AND RADIOS.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the Board Members of the CRESCENT FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT APPROVED A BUDGET TRANSFER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$45,500 FOR A 50/50 SPLIT PURCHASE WITH THE CITY FOR THERMAL IMAGERS AND RADIOS.

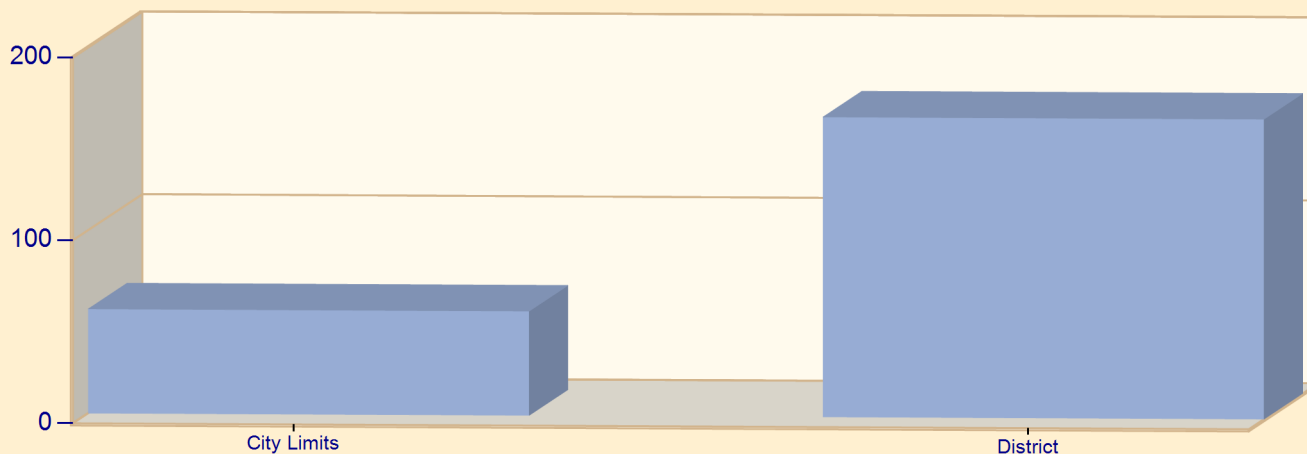

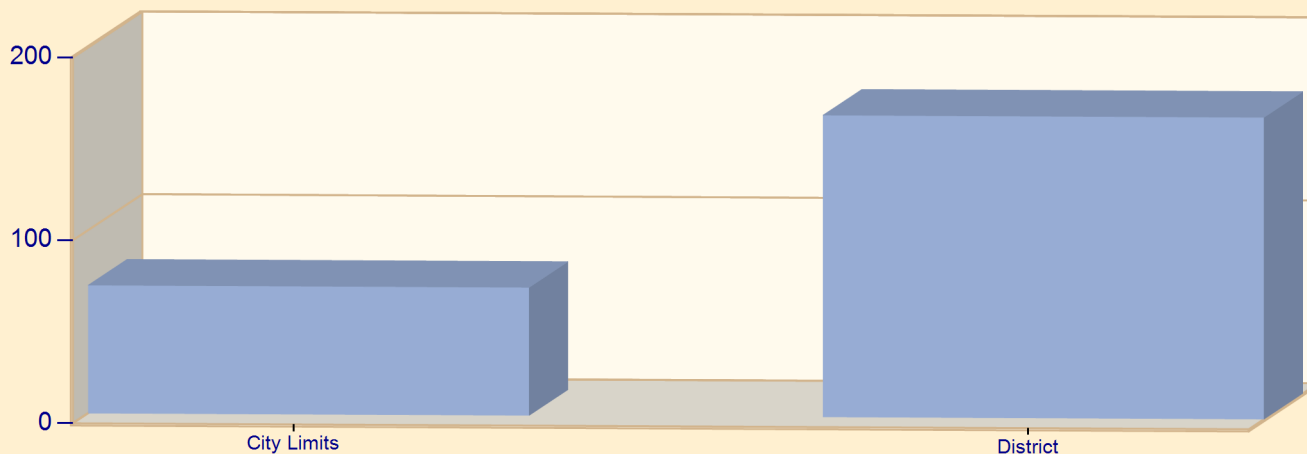
