RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve the low bid submitted by Standard Pipe Services, LLC. in the amount of \$101,665 for the re-lining of 792 linear feet of 8" sanitary sewer main, 349 linear feet of 12" sanitary sewer main, and 38 point repairs. The work will be accomplished in Fox Hall, Downtown Dover, and Wesley College Area.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

Wastewater Management includes the Inflow / Infiltration Removal capital project to correct areas in the sanitary sewer collection system that are deteriorating and allowing groundwater to enter the sanitary sewer system through cracked pipes and/or through poorly sealed joints. Eliminating infiltration into the City's sanitary sewer mains will result in reduced pumping and treatment costs.


During FY 17/18, a Sanitary Sewer Inflow & Infiltration Study was conducted by Public Works staff to identify areas with high priority relining, repairs and replacements needed. This study was completed by reviewing sanitary sewer assessment videos through a pipe condition grading software program. Public Works field staff collected the videos and provided them to the Engineer & Inspections Division of Public Works. The high priority list was placed on a relining, repair or replacement schedule over the next five (5) years. This bid is for Phase 2 of this budgeted project- Relining. The bid package was advertised by the City's Contract and Procurement Manager under Bid #19-0003PW and was opened on August 14, 2018. The following three (3) contractors submitted bids for the proposed project.

City staff reviewed the Standard Pipe Services, LLC bid package and found it free of math errors and/or discrepancies. In addition, staff has reviewed the contractor's qualification information which included a list of recently completed projects similar in material scope to the sanitary sewer replacement project and their financial statement and found all information to be adequate. The low bid represents fair market value; and their qualifications are in accordance with the requirements of this project.

Fox Hall Sanitary Sewer Main Relining







BACKGROUND

The Dover Police Department recently received its annual allocation from the Office of Justice Programs (OJP) for the 2018 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG). Similar to previous years, Dover Police Department was identified as a disparate funding agency along with Smyrna Police Department and Kent County. This disparate condition requires the submission of a joint grant application for the three agencies.

Although no funds were designated for Kent County in the allocation document, a Memorandum of Understanding will be completed and signed by all three agencies and will state that Kent County will waive any claim to funding on the grant. The Dover Police Department will serve as the fiscal and administrative agent for the grant. The following table shows the breakout for the grant funds:

- 1. Are any of this project's costs included in the City budget?

 Yes, this grant was included in the Police Department grant budget for FY19, however, the full amount of the grant was not budgeted because the actual amount awarded was more than anticipated. Only \$130,000 was budgeted to be received, so a budget adjustment will be submitted to add to and realign the grant programs in Fund 710 to accommodate the programs requested.

 Maintenance and software licensing fees will be needed in year five after the purchase of the FARO equipment is made. Software licensing fees are estimated at \$1100/year, but the hardware maintenance costs are unknown at this point.
