APPROVAL OF MINUTES ~ Ashley Wenger moved for approval of the May 2018 Minutes. Jill Bonney-Hill seconded. Motion passed as follows: Bonney-Hill and Wenger in favor with Busch and Thomas abstaining and Iken, Tamayo and Gottfried absent.

APPEARANCE OF INTERESTED CITIZENS: Anita Zahniser, former KPIC member, inquired as to the progress of the Oral History project and asked permission to complete the interview she had been working on (Lynn Wolfe) when she resigned. Committee members agreed by consensus to allow Anita to complete the interview.

PROJECTS/REPORTS

Lesser Markers at Corners of Significant Land Claims: Jill Bonney-Hill explained the history of this project for the benefit of the new members and reported that she is working with David Louden and Jerry McGee and will have more to report next month.

Oral History Update: Jennifer Thomas agreed to take on this project.

Geo-cache Status of Elimination of Sites on Internet: Rhonda Iken was not at the meeting – No Report.

Cavalry Remount Station: Sherrie Gottfried was not at the meeting – No Report.

Informational Signage at Keizer School: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that she had met with the Heritage Board and they were in favor of the signage. They voted unanimously to

approve it and added that they want to have a say in what is put on the sign. They are fine with mounting in to the side of the building and with having one the same size as the flood history signs. They would also like to help with the sign at Schoolhouse Square.

Informational Signage at Schoolhouse Square: Sherrie Gottfried was not at the meeting – No Report.

Neighborhood History/Origination of Street Names: Rhonda Iken was not at the meeting – No Report.

Facebook Page: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that the page is getting lots of 'likes' and views.

Willamette University: Liezle Tamayo was not at the meeting - No Report.

Longitude 123: Ashley Wenger reported that she has done some research and found there is an internet-based project where people visit intersections of longitude and latitude. It is called the "Degree Confluence Project". Markers for intersections must be within 100 meters to 'count'. She has been in touch with David Louden and he agreed with the estimation of where it is.

Claggett Creek Watershed Council Story Map Project: Bob Busch volunteered to take on this project.

COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT: Roland Herrera reported that Council passed a resolution asking Polk County to prohibit shooting across the river off Riverbend Road. He provided information about National Night Out and upcoming amphitheater concerts and urged committee members to attend Council meetings.
