GALLERY DISPLAY SCHEDULE: No works had been submitted for display or approval. Lore Christopher volunteered to contact the colored pencil people and students taking Keizer Art Association classes to see if they would like to display. Nate Brown indicated that he would contact the quilters for the December/January slot. Ms. Christopher urged everyone to get the word out on their Facebook pages. Discussion followed regarding the possibility and process involved in displaying exhibits from the Art Museum at the Community Center Gallery. Mr. Brown indicated that he would check with the City Attorney to see if this could be done.

KEIZER CULTURAL HISTORY POLE PROJECT: Commissioners reviewed information regarding engraved paving stones to be sold as fundraisers and decided to focus on getting the poles started first. It was noted that funding may only allow for one pole to be done, but once it was finished, it might be easier to get donations for the second one. Commissioners reviewed the Request for Proposals and made various changes to be submitted to the City Attorney for review. The hope was to publish the RFP on June 1 and close on August 31, 2018.

<u>Lore Christopher moved that the Public Arts Commission forward the edited Request for</u> Proposals with instruction to Nate to resolve the cost issue (Section J) once the review

is completed by Shannon Johnson. Beth Melendy seconded. Motion passed as follows: Melendy, Steen, Long, Gonzalez and Christopher in favor with Ryan and Abdelrasul absent.
