APPROVAL OF MINUTES ~ Jill Bonney-Hill moved for approval of the July 2018 Minutes. Jennifer Thomas seconded. Motion passed as follows: Bonney-Hill, Iken and Thomas in favor with Gottfried abstaining and Tamayo, Wenger and Busch absent.

PROJECTS/REPORTS

Lesser Markers at Corners of Significant Land Claims: Jill Bonney-Hill shared an email from David Loudon explaining exactly where the corner marker is located. Jill will contact Faith Lutheran Church to see if they would be willing to allow the committee to put a small marker on their property at the corner. Ms. Bonney-Hill added that Mr. Loudon had indicated that he knew the location of the John Keizer house and suggested that the committee put a marker there. Committee agreed by consensus to do so depending on the location. Ms. Bonney-Hill will find out the exact location and inform the committee.

Oral History Update: Jennifer Thomas indicated that she did not want to take this project.

Geo-cache Status of Elimination of Sites on Internet: Sherrie Gottfried announced that she had spoken with Mike Hickman and he had eliminated the Keizer sites from the Geo-Cache website.

Cavalry Remount Station: No Report.

Informational Signage at Keizer School: Jill Bonney-Hill asked everyone to look at pictures on the internet and choose photos that they thought would be appropriate for the signage along with some verbiage. She indicated that Tammy Wilde wants to work with the committee on this project. Jill is meeting with her next week. Each committee member chose different websites to explore. They will send pictures to city staff to compile for consideration at the next meeting along with suggested verbiage.

Informational Signage at Schoolhouse Square: Sherrie Gottfried reported that she had talked to someone from the management company in April and he indicated that he would need to get approval from corporate. He said he would get back to her when he has a decision. She has not heard from him or followed up.

Neighborhood History/Origination of Street Names: No Report. Jennifer Thomas indicated that she would like to assist Ms. Iken with this project.

Facebook Page: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that the page is getting lots of 'likes' and views. Jennifer Thomas offered to take over this page for Ms. Bonney-Hill.

Willamette University: Liezle Tamayo was not at the meeting – No Report.

Longitude 123: Ashley Wenger was not at the meeting – No Report

Claggett Creek Watershed Council Story Map Project: Bob Busch was not at the meeting – No Report.

OTHER BUSINESS: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that she had asked David Loudon about the marker that Ms. Schulthies had said was at Keizer Rapids Park. Mr. Loudon had indicated that the only marker there is one near the boat ramp about historical crossings. Committee decided not to pursue putting a land claim marker at the park.

COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT: Roland Herrera reported that a representative from In-N-Out Burger had attended the Council meeting, and it appears that the restaurant is considering opening a restaurant at Keizer Station. He also shared the news that the body of a Keizer resident who was missing had been found.
