SUBJECT: UGB PROJECTS

BACKGROUND:

Since our completion of the State required Periodic Review (land use regulation review by the state to ensure conformance with all State requirements/goals) in 2014, we have been working to address the deficiencies documented in that examination. The State acknowledged that Keizer does have a deficit in all housing types, and importantly, a deficit of enough developable land in our portion of the shared UGB to accommodate that need.

Since that time, several things have been happening. We have consistently asked the state to help us resolve those issues by providing the technical assistance necessary to do so. We have repeatedly applied for Transportation and Growth Management (TGM) grants to study and document the area location and quantity needed—and have been consistently denied, with the explanation that the state does not fund such efforts. After a few of these dead-ends under our belt, we have tailored our requests to what will be funded, and have now been successful in obtaining assistance. All of these projects have one goal in mind: providing the necessary factual information necessary to make informed and intelligent decisions regarding the UGB.

The following is a list and short description of these efforts:

- Education and Outreach Grant. Comparison of other Cities UGB efforts demonstrating a success, a modified request, and a change of mind by other cities.
- **Keizer Revitalization Project**. A major effort to evaluate the market issues, the development potential and the possible land use efficiency measures that could be implemented for our major corridors.
- **BLI/HNA Update**. This project will establish our new population forecast, specific to Keizer, and our land needs.
- "Divorce 101". We have pressured the state to make a determination on the issue of what if Keizer decides to separate the UGB and what specifically that would entail. The state has now issued a "White Paper".
- Transportation Impacts from Growth Study. Following on the heels of the KRP we will have a MPO funded project aimed at specifically determining what impacts will be created on our regional transportation system from 3 scenarios: infill only (relying on the capacity of the shared UGB), expanded UGB, and/or a blend of the two.

- Develop and implement a stable funding source to attain sustainable police staffing at acceptable levels now and into the future.

- Engage in a comprehensive community wide Urban Growth Boundary Expansion (or not) discussion with residents.
- Use the proceeds from the sale of Keizer Station Area A LID properties
