Lesser Markers at Corners of Significant Land Claims: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that she met with Jim McKillop at Faith Lutheran Church and the church is interested in moving forward. The next step will be to contact Jerry McGee for advice on verbiage and contact Public Works to coordinate design and installation.

Neighborhood History/Origination of Street Names: David Loudon indicated that he could share information that he has about the names of roads with whoever takes on this project.
