APPROVAL OF MINUTES ~ Sherrie Gottfried moved for approval of the October 2016 Minutes. Anita Zahniser seconded. Motion passed as follows: Bonney-Hill, Zahniser and Adams in favor with Gottfried abstaining, Wenger absent and two positions vacant.

PROJECTS/REPORTS

Flood History River Marker at Boat Ramp Update:

- *Flood Sign:* Staff reported that the signs and posts have been received. David Loudon has done the elevation survey. Installation is contingent on volunteers and concrete donations.

Oral History:

- *Anita Zahniser* reported that the Joy Beebe interview is near completion. She is working with Phillip Wade and the YouTube video to insert photographs. Phillip is looking for a 1941 recording of "yours" which was 'their song'. Ms. Zahniser also talked to Lynn Woolfe; he has her outline and she has his pictures. They will not film in the fallout shelter as originally planned because it is too dark and damp. The focus will be on baby boomers and what Keizer was like before McNary High School opened. This will be the last interview Ms. Zahniser does because she is not renewing her term on the committee. She announced that Chief John Teague is willing to do interviews with other surviving police chiefs and Jim Taylor would like to be interviewed.

Status of Geo-caches: Kris Adams reported that everything is outdated. She put a comment on the KPIC Facebook page asking for input from interested citizens on whether or not the project should be continued. Committee members suggested that perhaps instead of the Geo-cache project, Keizer points of interest could be included in the Pokemon Go game.

Savage House: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that she has done no further research. Staff informed committee members that one of the conditions for the development of the property was to have an informational sign on the property. The committee could develop and design the sign. Chair Bonney-Hill urged committee members to review the websites she had provided in July and come up with ideas on what should be put on the sign. Everyone agreed that it should definitely contain a 'family tree'.

Facebook Page: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that it is still getting views, but not as much lately; probably because there has not been a meeting since July.

Council Liaison Report: Roland Herrera was absent. Mayor Cathy Clark attended the meeting in his place. She provided details about the Savage House property and how it will be developed, announced that Winco/Waremart is coming to Keizer – to the old Albertson's store and will hire 38 new employees, and that other stores are redeveloping along River Road. The Holiday Parade is being adopted by the Keizer Chamber of Commerce, the Town & Country Mural is complete, the Black, White and Gray Show is coming up and the Heritage Centennial celebration is November 12 with the Heritage Christmas event on December 15. Sherrie Gottfried added that Powerland got a \$74,000 grant.
