ORDINANCE No. 2026-11

AMENDING CHAPTER 390 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE, ARTICLE II
LEAD BASED PAINT HAZARD INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR
RENTAL DWELLINGS, SPECIFICALLY PARAGRAPH 5-G

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Verona, County of Essex, New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 390 article II of the Township Code is amended as follows: [Added text is **emboldened**, and text being eliminated is shown in *strikethrough italics*.]

G. The fees for a lead-based paint inspection shall be as follows:

- (1) The fee for a visual assessment **will be \$150 per unit when completed by a Township Inspector and \$250 per unit if completed by a contracted vendor.**
- (2) The fee for the filing of a lead-safe certification or lead-free certification shall be \$25.
- (3) In a common interest community, any inspection fee charged shall be the responsibility of the unit owner and not the homeowners' association, unless the association is the owner of the unit.
- (4) In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16h, an additional fee of \$20 per dwelling unit inspected by the Township's lead inspector or the owner's private lead inspector shall be assessed for the purposes of the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Act (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.1 et seq.) unless the unit owner demonstrates that the Department of Community Affairs has already assessed an additional inspection fee of \$20. The fees collected pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited into the Lead Hazard Control Assistance Fund.
- (5) Reinspection/clearance: **\$150 per unit when completed by a Township Inspector and \$250 per unit if completed by a contracted vendor.**
- (6) XRF lead inspection: \$150/unit per lead free.

SECTION 2: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS

All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, it being the legislative intent that all such ordinances or part of ordinances now existing or in effect unless the same are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance shall remain in effect.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable and if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance, but shall remaining in effect; it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 5: CODIFICATION

The Municipal Clerk and the Township Attorney are authorized and directed to change any Chapter, Article and/or Section number of the Code of the Township of Verona in the event that the codification of this Ordinance reveals that there is a conflict between the numbers and the existing Code, and in order to avoid confusion and possible accidental repealers of existing provisions not intended to be repealed.
