Fall Athletics Update for BOE meeting September 7, 2021

Fall Sports Registration:

1. Remains open for Derby High School via the online registration platform – FinalForms.
2. Derby Middle School Sports registration opened to families on September 2nd.
3. As of 10:00 a.m. 9/2 there are 94 students registered for a Fall Sport at DHS (24% of student body).
4. 93% of the registrants are compliant on forms submission.
5. 86% of the registrants are compliant with updated physicals.
6. August 31st DHS Freshmen Open House: a presentation on school engagement and extracurricular activities was provided to each cohort. Fall Sports teams were represented at tables by coaching staff and student-athletes to meet freshmen, answer questions and recruit for team registrations on FinalForms.

Derby HS Fall Sports Update:

1. Girls Soccer continues to grow and has (21) registrants and is scheduled to play first scrimmage on Thursday, September 2nd at the Ryan Complex.
2. Boys Soccer continues to grow and has (12) registrants. Scheduled home scrimmage on 9/7.
3. Boys & Girls Cross Country has (11) and (11) registrants respectively. Home meets this year will be at Witek Park.
4. Cheerleading has (9) registrants.
5. Football continues to grow with (30) registrants and has a scrimmage scheduled on 9/3 with Branford & Hartford Public at the Ryan Complex.

Transportation Update:

1. Many area school bus providers are struggling with drivers for athletic events requiring departure times before school runs (1:30 pm) or after school runs (4:30 pm). We are looking for other providers in the area to accommodate or traditional departure times for contests.
2. This may create changes in game schedules (start times.).

Practice Schedules:

1. Ryan Complex – DeFilippo Field will be scheduled for practices (football, boys soccer, girls soccer) on a pre-determined rotation of an early practice slot (2:30 – 4:30pm) and a late slot (4:30 pm – 6:30 pm). This allows each team access to an official field for practice. Short practices, walk throughs at times may go on Payden Park.
2. Each weekday one of the soccer teams will practice at Witek Park at 2:30 pm.
3. As scheduling will allow home boys and girls soccer games will be scheduled for 6:00 pm starts.
4. Cheerleading utilizes DHS Gym in the evenings.
5. Cross Country practices after school meeting at the Field House.

NVL Update:

1. NVL Athletic Directors Meeting: first monthly meeting of the academic year is Tuesday, Sept. 7th.
