My sincere thanks to our Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Matthew Conway Jr. all our Administrators and Central office staff.

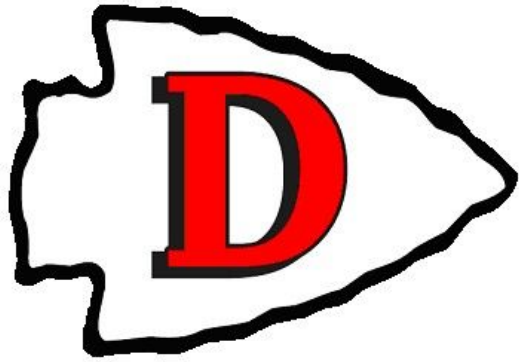

Amendment to Memorandum of Understanding
by and between
WestEd and Derby Public Schools

Effective October 11, 2024, WestEd (“WestEd”), a multi-state JPA, and Derby Public Schools (“Partner”) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (“Agreement”) relating to the Impact Study of ASSISTments Tutoring Program. WestEd and Partner are collectively referred to as “the Parties.”

This Amendment to the Agreement by and between WestEd and Partner is effective as of date the Amendment is fully executed. The Parties amend the Agreement to replace paragraphs in Sections 1, 2, 5, and 9 with the following:

Section 1. Purpose:

School Community Educator Coordinators (CECs), tutors, classroom teachers and their students ranging from grade 3 to grade 8 who are identified by their schools to have a low prior performance in math will be eligible to participate in the study in the 2024-25 and 2025-2026 school year.

Section 2. Terms and Termination

- A. This MOU is effective as of the date first set forth above and expires December 31, 2027.

Section 5. Confidentiality

- D. PII will be destroyed at the earlier of: (1) when the PII is no longer needed for analysis, (2) September 1, 2028, or (3) within 10 days of the termination of this MOU pursuant to section 2.B hereinabove, and delivery to WestEd of Partner’s written demand for destruction of the PII.

Section 9. Partner Responsibility

- C. Partner will provide student level data as outlined below for participating students in the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 school year.
 - i. Student name
 - ii. Grade
 - iii. Classroom teacher
 - iv. District ID number
 - v. Date of birth
 - vi. Sex
 - vii. Race/Ethnicity
 - viii. Enrollment status
 - ix. Low-income status indicator (if applicable)
 - x. English Learner status
 - xi. IEP/Special education status

- xii. Contact information for students’ parents/guardians
- xiii. State and/or district benchmark assessment data

D. Partner will provide WestEd with rosters of participating classrooms in the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 school year.

Except as expressly amended here, no other changes are made to the original Agreement between the parties and all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
