DISCUSSION ON SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

Dr. Conway: As you know, Deputy Chief Grogan is on with us this afternoon. Back at the last police commission meeting, the police commission voted to approve. You can tell me the exact motion, Deputy Chief Grogan but to moving forward with discussions on implementing a School Resource Officer that would be funded by the Police

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Department. So, we've taken between the statute, the statutory MOU that's required as well as the current CAGE policy and summarized them in this presentation for you to just give you an idea of what a School Resource Officer does. I don't know if you want me to go through the slides, if you've had a chance to peek at them.

Mr. Gildea: I would just go through them quick. I looked at them. I don't know if everyone did. So, I think we all get what they do. Especially if you get to the memorandum and that piece of it.

Dr. Conway: Sure. So, it would be in addition to our current SSOs within our schools mainly on the campus of the middle school/high school but certainly responding to and doing visits to both of our elementary schools as well. And they'll work in concert with our current SSOs as well as provide them additional safety and security with both the day to day as well as our all hazard safety plan that will be the key point person for communication between the school and the Police Department and developing relationships with students, staff as well and then collaborate on our school safety and crises plans so that we submit to the State to ensure that day to day those plans are in place and happening on the ground.

They call it a triad but three different roles of the main one being a law enforcement officer within our buildings. Second is counselor providing mentoring services. Counseling to at risk students mainly around drugs and alcohol for which they received training on. And then on other related topics whether that be for parents, staff, students on law enforcement itself in the community and the positive aspects of a police officer.

Within in our schools it offers a deterrence. It offers additional access control as a safety liaison, crises planning, mentorship to our students and educating our public, our parents, our staff and our students in different areas of law enforcement, alcohol and drug abuse. All the normal school discipline, procedures would remain the same and under the jurisdiction of the school, the school district and the principal of the schools. When it's determined if criminal conduct is when the SRO would get involved with the principal, the student and the parents. And in only those situations.

Deputy Chief Grogan can explain some of the training, but it's a week-long training. The position probably will not start until September the next school year. So, it will be funded in the '26/'27 budget in the police department take effect in the start of the school year. In terms of FERPA to have access for school records, again the SRO would not have any access to school records except as needed by a law enforcement capacity just like it is now, names released to the media in any situations. It's required now for every district in 2023 the legislature passed legislation that requires a memorandum of understanding between a police officer and the Board of Education and it really spells out. There's a sample MOU attached. The exact rules and responsibilities of both parties. And the only addition that we would add to that if this

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Committee and then the full Board as well as the City which is understanding around or language is year around use of body cameras.

Everything else that you see in that is pretty much covered by statute in that MOU. Daily interaction, when do they get involved, when they not get involved. It's who evaluates the police officer. Who do they want to report to on a daily basis. When do they get involved in discipline and then their annual review. Those are really the four main areas of that MOU. We would ask that the fifth area which would be the body camera. It's with the Department.

Mr. Gildea: I thought when interact with the body cameras are mandatory, is that no longer mandatory in a school setting or am I wrong about it being mandatory?

Deputy Chief Grogan: No, that's mostly for criminal justice system for the most part. Like normal encounters if you were to come up in casual conversation does not get recorded. There's a lot of stipulations with the medical records when we go to the hospital. If it's not criminal related, the cameras are off. The camera medical that houses the things that aren't necessary criminal behavior we shut them off. Any information regarding the kids is not releasable. So, you don't have to worry about people FOI'ng the body cams.

Mr. Gildea: What would be your process is with regards to them being on within a school setting?

Deputy Chief Grogan: They'd only be activated if a criminal situation would be going on, if there was a fight or something going on. Normally just like an encounter. Our cameras are not running until an encounter or something and then we activate them.

Ms. Tovar: This might be for Dr. Conway. In the instance of let's just say athletics. And I know that we've had some need to beef up the police coming to our fields and we stopped visiting them and also more of the Saturday morning games. Would we consider it or maybe this officer would go to certain fields with us if we considered changing that to revisiting those fields or would that need to be there.

Dr. Conway: Yeah, they definitely would, Kim. And whether it's part of a regular schedule or it's something that we in addition to their regular duties during the day would be supplemental services provided by the SRO in consultation with the Police Department.

Ms. Tovar: Thank you.

Mr. Gildea: Any other questions at this point?

Dr. Conway: We just got three areas of transparency in operation for protection of students and privacy in consideration with the body cameras causing a positive

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relationship with law enforcement with students and the individual in the building, getting to know students and then a collaborative approach to the safety of crises only. And that's really it for a summary of all of the documents that you received, the policy, the MOU.

Mr. Gildea: It would be an existing police officer. I'm just curious, Deputy Chief, is that appointed, is that applied for. I'm just curious how the selection process on your end works.

Deputy Chief Grogan: So, yeah, we did an internal hiring. They do the internal hiring basically, those interested we'll decide based upon the interview. Obviously, we'll want the best person that's going to be involved with the kids and they know part of it is going to be teaching and creating those relationships. So, I think there's two more weeks we kept to internal hiring, just a posting for it. We'll review them and have somebody there. We have training. Doc touched on the training. Training already scheduled in mid-March. It's a week-long class that's hosted by National Association of School Resource Officers. It's pretty much the premier class. It seems to be the class to have to becoming an SRO. And obviously all of our guys we'll do some additional training with whoever is selected for it regarding juvenile laws.

We all know just the basic facts to take a certain type of a sex assault complaint. Just the minimum facts. Pretty much we're looking to get the person like in the interdisciplinary teams so they have knowledge of all this stuff. As you guys know, a lot of the problems start in the school and vice versa, start on the road. So, we're looking to just be involved, you need that continuity. It's important to create the relationships with the kids. It's huge moving forward. Anything non law enforcement related by the kids seeing everybody in the school on a daily basis that goes, it's well worth it and helps everybody.

Mr. Gildea: If I'm not mistaken, Doc, we've had this before.

Deputy Chief Grogan: I would say probably about 15 years ago and then probably for manpower reasons and budgetary, we got away from it.

Mr. Gildea: I'm just curious, the relationship between the SSO and the SRO, does the School Resource Officer have any administrative sway over the SSOs considering they're still in law enforcement. They're still highly qualified. How is their relationship between the SRO and the SSO working in your mind?

Deputy Chief Grogan: They're basically working together. So, basically having the officer on campus to take the complaint. Whereas SSOs pretty much they're for security purposes but pretty much at some point if something happens, we're still responding. So, to have someone really unique at the high school and middle school campus, they're adjacent to one another, which helps. So, they'll spend the majority of

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their time there. But the way I see it is they'll still check at the elementary schools and aid for any child reading books that Dr. Ciccarini or Mr. Russo, we're there to help. But we'll definitely be on the middle school and high school campus.

Ms. Nuzzo: It's just the one that's going to share the middle school and the high school, correct?

Deputy Chief Grogan: Yes.

Mr. Gildea: If there is no other questions, I would see if somebody wants to make a motion to recommend this to the full Board.

Motion that the Student Health and Safety Committee recommend the SRO position in the Derby School System to the full Board. Passed with a motion made by Ms. Kim Tovar and a second by Ms. Erica Nuzzo.

DISCUSSION ON POLICY 5132 – DRESS AND GROOMING

Mr. Gildea: Student Health and Safety Committee recommend additional language for the policy for dress and grooming to the consideration by the policy committee.

Doc, do you or any administrators have any recommendations to bring before the subcommittee today?

Dr. Conway: The only additional were the ones that we reviewed before but we didn't have time to come to any final decisions on. And it's really around language, we have language that says what you can wear. But we want to add language that specifies what you can't wear.

Mr. Gildea: I'm so sorry to do this, and I don't know if Deputy Chief Grogan is going to hang on but in the event he does, I just wanted to thank him for thinking of us, thank him for being so community minded and thank him for making it this evening. So, Deputy Chief, we appreciate you for certain. Thank you so much.

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Deputy Chief Grogan: Thank you. Let me know when the next meeting is if you need anything.

Mr. Gildea: Yes, sir.

Dr. Conway: Thank you Deputy Chief.

Mr. Gildea: Have a good night.

Deputy Chief: Thank you. You too.

Mr. Gildea: All right. Doc, I'm sorry, I didn't mean to interrupt.

Dr. Conway: Whether there was a need to list the items that are not allowed. While we listed the items that are allowed, there's been questions that have come up and the response has been simply, no, just the items that are allowed are allowed.

Ms. Tovar: I actually wanted to discuss this as well Doc. I'm really glad that this is on the agenda. So, I know that, you know, based on my own observance and speaking with other families, and you know, just being that what the struggles that kids and families are having with outer wear for school. You know, the kids are not at this moment, they're being told they're not able to wear, I'm going to use Gabe for example, just because you know, his wrestling sweatshirt or, you know, wrestling outerwear, football outerwear, where they are within the uniform colors, they're not being allowed. And I think that we do need to revisit that for multiple reasons.

One coming into for having the uniforms, obviously it was a costly expense for a lot of families. And coming from a small Town like our own with the type of makeup that we do have in our community. You know, I know that it was not really cost-efficient for everybody, which is another point that I did want to actually discuss. But a lot of these kids who have you know, partake in sports or band or whatever that happened is Derby apparel, they're not able to use it now. And here it is, it's freezing cold out. Today we finally got the fleece's added on. I love the fleece, however, not everybody can afford the \$30 fleece and it's cold in the school.

So, I kind of have a bit of conflict that sits with me with not allowing the kids to wear these Derby Program, you know, school program items that have been purchased. And I don't know if our Board can discuss it, bring it to the policy committee, whatever committee that we have to about that.

Mr. Gildea: There are items here that we were talking about earlier about whether we would recommend to wear. So, in addition to that, are you trying to, I just want to clarify. Are you saying that you think we should add coats or hoodies or is there something specific.

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Ms. Tovar: No, I think we should be allowing the kids to wear their sports sweatshirts or coats or whatever Derby school sport or activity clothing item that was you know, purchased through their fundraiser, whatever. I think we should be letting these kids wear them. As long as they're not covered in holes. And they're in good condition. That's my opinion. And I know that there's a lot of families who are facing the conflict of purchasing these uniforms in general and I know that Rebecca had asked this question at our last I believe it was the full Board meeting. I could be wrong or maybe it was our last Committee of the Whole meeting. But it was questioned that do the families who are having financial issues with purchasing the uniforms, are they aware that they could reach out to Central Office for assistance on that.

Mr. Gildea: I definitely think we should discuss the finance assistance piece as well. But can we just take one at a time though.

Ms. Tovar: Okay.

Mr. Gildea: So, your first part you're asking is, should we allow our kids to wear outer garments that are Derby-related hoodies, zip up jackets, coats, inside school on cold weather days.

Ms. Tovar: Yes.

Ms. Nuzzo: I'm good with it. Not so much Mila, she only has pop warner stuff and that's different. But Vinnie has the baseball stuff. And when we buy stuff from the fundraisers and when he's participating in a sport, you know, he wants to wear it. He likes to wear it. So, I don't disagree with that at all.

Mr. Gildea: Let me ask a question. Would you guys want to do that seasonally like from October to February or would you just want that to be year-round.

Ms. Tovar: I think it would be a year-round thing.

Mr. Gildea: Okay.

Ms. Nuzzo: I mean I know there are certain things for the team, which is just like a regular t-shirt. Maybe not so much a t-shirt because then we're kind of playing it a little away from like the polos. As far as like if they have their zip-up jackets or their sweatshirt for whatever sport team that they're involved in, I think that's okay.

Mr. Gildea: Rebecca, Ken.

Ms. O'Hara: Most of them are hoodies that the kids have?

Ms. Tovar: A lot of them have.

Ms. Nuzzo: There are a lot of crew necks so I don't know if that's just, you know, like the cheerleading. I purchased a couple of those.

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Ms. O'Hara: So, just to let the kids know that they can wear anything that not the hoodie. Because hoodies are not allowed? Are hoodies allowed?

Dr. Conway: So, we left that open at our last discussion about this.

Mr. Gildea: If someone has a hoodie on, do they get spoken to currently?

Ms. Caggiano: Yes. I know that there was some discussion last time like if there was a game day, you could absolutely wear whatever to represent your team. We're just looking for clear guidance because you do get on our side, you will let so and so to wear that, you're not allowing me. Is it because I'm white and they're African American. So, that's kind of where it could start to lead to. Tracy has done some fundraising for families. Got together and they gave her a substantial amount of money and we purchase pants, sweatshirts and shirts for anyone who didn't have it. Well, what do you think the next kind of thing that turns into is why wasn't my purchased. We know exactly what families need it. But it gets to the pettiness to the lack of a better word to come out with. Well, they can wear this. I can't. Can I have my jersey over it? Can I not? So, we've decided to let it set straight right now. So, we're kind of waiting for this to flush out where things need to change.

Mr. Gildea: My opinion or my thought process when we did this about the polo shirts was that when we were trying to get some uniform look and I thought we had intentionally did not want to allow hoodies that wasn't the kind of appearance that we were looking for initially. And I thought that we were all on the same page at one point. I guess my question is without being smart enough with my kids being out of school now so not having the experience. In addition to the fleece, are there additional school outerwear garments that don't have hoodies?

Dr. Conway: The sweatshirt, there is a sweatshirt also besides the fleece that has the Derby patch that does not have the hood that they can buy as part of the uniform.

Mr. Gildea: Kim, is that what you were talking about or were you talking about hoodies?

Ms. Tovar: So, I was talking about Derby items that was purchased or have them purchased outside in the past outside of school uniforms that kids already have. And that's why my financial aspect part of it kind of went a little bit hand in hand with it because these items were already you know, in their drawers, in their closets and they're Derby items, I think that we should be allowing them to wear them instead of having to go out and purchase the crew neck or the fleece because a lot of our families can't afford that. It's kind of a two-part.

Mr. Gildea: So, are they hoodies or are they not hoodies?

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Ms. Tovar: They're both. Yes and no. So, some are hoodies. Some are not. Like, my son has hoodies, he's got a windbreaker with a hood on it. But he's got stuff that doesn't as well.

Mr. Gildea: Do you want to bring up the finance part now?

Ms. Tovar: Yeah. It has been brought to my attention that one of our previous meetings as I've stated before about families coming to her and mentioning that they were not aware that they can go to Central Office for assistance in purchasing school uniforms. We were told that night that we do have a way we help families with this, that and the other and that they should be aware of that. It was done later, about two weeks ago it was brought to my attention that quite a few families who specifically up at the high school cannot afford the uniforms, are not aware that and you know, some of these people are single moms, are single parents who have multiple kids and, you know, and they're only able to get them one shirt. Because of the way her finances are. It's kind of difficult for them. So, I think that we need to reevaluate the communications for these individuals specifically. But I know that we didn't want to broadcast it out to the community because then everybody under the sun is going to you know, quote unquote in need. But I do think that we need to somehow make our families aware even if that's putting something on the website or families who, I don't know, have Husky, maybe a communication out to them. I know we all receive free lunch as part of the, you know, our district but those who would have been part of the free lunch program prior to that.

Somehow if they are aware if there is a struggle, they're scared to come forward and they're embarrassed, they're not aware that that is there. So, I did tell the couple of families that mentioned this to me. That I would communicate that to our committee and advocate for them because you know there's obviously a conflict. It was brought to Rebecca's attention and now mine. So, I did just want to discuss that.

Mr. Marcucio: Do we have something in place to take care of these families that can't afford the uniforms, Doc?

Dr. Conway: Yes.

Mr. Marcucio: We were talking about putting a line item in the budget. Did we do that or no?

Dr. Conway: We could do that put it in the upcoming budget. We can put it in Alliance as opposed to the operating budget.

Mr. Marcucio: I think we should put in something.

Mr. Gildea: I agree. And Doc, how many families are we buying uniforms for estimate?

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Dr. Conway: By school, but it's a limited amount that have been identified as actual need. I'll defer to Rachel is here. Maybe she can share with the middle school the approximate number.

Ms. Caggiano: So, we, Tracie did approximately maybe 15 to 20 families with pant, shirt and we have supplies here, so if a kid comes to school, they use it for the day. And then we have it again and that's about 5 to 10 kids maybe a day who show up and say, I don't have it.

Ms. Nuzzo: Just a quick question of that. When they come to school and they're not in uniform, are we checking with the parents because sometimes kids might try to pull one over.

Tracie: Yes. But yes, we call home first and then we provide them.

Dr. Conway: Yes.

Mr. Marcucio: Rachel, were we against having the hoodies?

Ms. Caggiano: Yes. We prefer a crew neck. You know, I'm not against a sports kind of wear on game day. It is a lot of management and oversight for all. Like every morning it starts with discussing the uniforms with a couple of kids. And Erica's right. Where's your uniform? In my backpack. In my locker. It's like a cat and mouse a little bit and then we can get them into uniform.

Mr. Gildea: If I could just back up on one thing that Ken said and one thing that Rachel said. I do think there should be money budgeted for this. I also think that there should be some parameters. Some kind of written guidelines. Whatever we might use to decide. I do think there should be some kind of guidelines that our administrators have, budgeting. I'm not being disrespectful here, saying hey, we take care of some of the kids who need it. I think there's a more written process or procedure on how we take care of them or the money.

Ms. Caggiano: So like, at Derby Middle School, the students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch goes for 50 percent. So, if we were saying oh, we're potentially buying half. We're here to help with some of the burden but not necessarily all of it.

Mr. Gildea: Yeah.

Ms. Nuzzo: Do we know our surrounding Towns that have uniforms for families that can't say they can't afford it?

Tracie: Because it's year one, it's a little more challenging. Once we're in year two, we'll be able to do some kind of buy back. You know. Because it's year one, everything is fresh and new, and everybody buying them brand new, it's a little bit more challenging. But I don't know what Ansonia does for families who simply can't afford

them. But I do know they do have like tag sales where they can get discounted uniforms.

Ms. Caggiano: So, we have some parents come in like, especially with pants. You know at the Middle School we do, you can kind of grow a lot and get taller in Middle School really quick. We've had a bunch of families come in and say you don't have these. My son and daughter went to Emmett and had all of these khakis and drop us off multiple kind of pants for us to be able to have and we give them out to kids.

Ms. Nuzzo: Yeah. I dropped off new ones not long after it started. Because they had a growth spurt. And they were like brand new.

Ms. Tovar: Unless we can do a drive for the season.

Dr. Conway: We talked about that. Yeah.

Ms. Tovar: And get the communication out like all over the place. Like a month or two in advance so people can start going through their wardrobe. Put the date on the calendar. I think that would be really awesome.

Mr. Gildea: Okay.

Dr. Conway: Yeah, just drop them off and we would have staff sort through them, make sure everything is clean. And then put them in the appropriate size boxes to be able to then redistribute.

Ms. Caggiano: I like that idea, Kim. You know, maybe there's a lot of parents coming. So, obviously not this year, but maybe in the future we kind of do those drives associated with like parent/teacher conferences. So, all of the parents are coming and they're dropping them off in the bins. So, that's November right. So, headed into winter. And then it's like until the end of February to tie it over until spring. We wash them, we go through them and maybe swap them.

Ms. Tovar: A process that might even go a little bit further if we think about like if we drop off a couple of items maybe we can create a quote, coupon that you get five percent off t-shirts, you know.

Dr. Conway: I like that Kim. And we have that ability within our purchase portal to be able to give out those codes. To the parents tried it out just to try it we gave them a special code. They go in and they got a free item.

Ms. Tovar: That's very awesome.

Mr. Gildea: That's a good idea Kim. So, I'm going to follow-up today with regards to the financial piece because we're going to talk about a criteria. It's the same process at the middle school. It's the same process at Irving School, et cetera. We're going to talk

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about budgeting for the money. And we're going to talk about uniform drives potentially with incentives.

Ms. Tovar: Okay. Is there a website though so people who have that need you know, click here and fill out the form.

Ms. Nuzzo: I was on the website today because I made some more purchases myself. And I didn't click into it. I probably should have just to see what it was all about. But there is something that says used or something like that. Are those discounted items or is that not up and running?

Dr. Conway: We have them disabled at the moment. I printed out in preparation for or receiving items donating back to the district. We would then sort through them and then put the appropriate sizes that we have up on the website.

Mr. Gildea: All right. So, now back to the financial piece. Let's move back to the outer garments. It sounds like you guys would be comfortable with outer garments including hoodies or does your opinion change upon hearing Rachel and the administration say they're good with outer garments but would prefer that they're not going to be hoodies have an impact on where you were?

Ms. Tovar: My thought again, because I'm thinking financial aspects and what the kids have.

Mr. Marcucio: I don't think we should put anything in that wasn't there before we started this new policy. I mean, hoodies weren't allowed before, were they?

Dr. Conway: No.

Mr. Gildea: No.

Mr. Marcucio: I don't think we should be putting hoodies in if they weren't allowed before we did this dress code. And I would also be careful about using the term athletics, because there's a lot of kids that aren't athletes. Why can't we bring something else in. Now we're going to start changing the policy back to where it was initially because people are going to wanting to bring their own clothes in again. That's my opinion anyway.

Mr. Gildea: Thank you.

Ms. O'Hara: Just one thing, the majority of the time before we did the dress code, what did kids mostly buy hoodies for whatever team they were on. Now they can't wear them. You know what I mean. That's the only thing I thought about. Because that's the number one seller when it comes to like, now that I'm in the business, what do you call it, it's the number one seller for sports. So, I just don't want to see their stuff get wasted

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that they bought last year and the year before, kids in high school. That's just my opinion.

Mr. Gildea: Again, we can all agree or disagree and be respectful, but I mean people bought hoodies for the last 25 years and they couldn't wear them to school. I mean they buy them to wear them outside. They buy them to wear them at the games on Saturdays. I mean, no one's ever bought a hoodie to wear at school because we never allowed them.

Well, let's say this. We have a couple of options here. But we can make a motion to allow outer garments including hoodies to the policy committee and then they have to vote in it and then they may agree, they may not agree. Anybody here on the policy committee.

Ms. O'Hara: No, I'm not on it anymore. I'm on this one though.

Mr. Gildea: We could vote and send it there. Or we could ask administrators and outline when they could wear them, once a week. It's up to you guys. Whatever you want to do. So, we can make a motion to allow outside garments including hoodies.

Ms. Nuzzo: See, I can go both ways. I can see how you don't want the kids or you want the kids to wear their sports or team that they purchase. But I can also see where we have hoodies. So, I like the idea of what if it was every Friday. It can be your team apparel. Not like NFL teams, you know, just like your Derby team if you purchased something. At least that gives them one day if they want to wear their wrestling or their baseball or their cheerleading or track or soccer, whatever, softball.

Mr. Gildea: So, me, personally, I do feel like going back to hoodies, allow people to wear them every day, just weekends what we did. And all we're going to go is from people wearing jeans and hoodies to people wearing khakis and hoodies. I do like that approach better when maybe it's one day a week. But you guys can vote however you want. I just think allowing people to wear hoodies five days a week is kind of going into the dress code and weakens it truthfully.

Ms. Nuzzo: I can see that. I could. And I was all for the dress code and I still love it.

Dr. Conway: If you recall, it's the every day, going into a classroom and a student puts their hood on and somebody might tell them to take it off. They go into the classroom and put it on. Now another adult is having to stop what they're doing and having to tell a student, take your hoodie off. And they don't know that somebody in the hallway just told them to take it off. Our spending time writing referrals for kids are back to writing referrals for hoodies.

Ms. Tovar: Yeah, you're right.

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Ms. Nuzzo: It could also be where if it's a trial period where the kids continue to abuse it, then goes away. You know, give them a little bit of responsibility and see if they can follow the rules. And when they're allowed to wear something you know, like they prefer like their sports or team gear instead of just their Derby logo sweatshirt.

Ms. Tovar: That's too much back and forth with having to change the policy.

Mr. Gildea: I think what we are saying is that we're agreeable to have the administration to work on maybe one day a week thing or once every two-week thing. See where that might look like.

Ms. Tovar: We can do that.

Mr. Gildea: Are people good with that?

Ms. Tovar: Yes. We can start there.

Ms. O'Hara: I like that because it's like a dress-down Friday.

Mr. Gildea: Is that together what we're asking?

Dr. Conway: Yes, it is.

Ms. Tovar: I thank you for hearing me out on that. I try to advocate for people.

Mr. Gildea: So, I think our last item.

Ms. Nuzzo: I know it was mentioned earlier. I don't know if we kind of got away from it. But adding these no options. But I like the idea of adding no. No, leggings, no yoga pants, no jeans instead of what is allowed. Because it doesn't say I can't have this. It says I could have this. I like the no in there personally.

Ms. Tovar: I agree.

Mr. Gildea: Okay. It sounds like all four of us are good there. I wanted to go back to the list. Thank you. Physical education day attire. So, currently do we allow elementary school students up to sixth grade to wear sweatpants and t-shirts on gym days because they don't change.

Ms. Nuzzo: Yes.

Ms. O'Hara: Yes.

Mr. Gildea: Okay. So, six to nine, do we want to, we talked about it would be 6 through 12 offering Derby sweats, Derby T-shirt and on physical education days allowing people to wear that.

Ms. Nuzzo: Six through 12 when they have gym, they have it every day. So, they would be constantly changing. It's the elementary, I thought we agreed that you know, this is

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what they're playing in gym, it's not something that they can't. I know it was the elementary school kids, me personally, that would either prefer like sweatpants or shorts, uniform, like a gym uniform because I know that we allow the kids to wear whatever they want on their gym day. And no one does. And I always feel like he's not following the rules when he is. But I just wish it was a Derby t-shirt or like those sweat shorts or sweatpants.

Dr. Conway: Would you be okay if we were similar to the khaki pants where they could purchase on their own, the sweats. Either in gray, black, red or white. And then they would purchase those on their own. They can get those anywhere. They would have to be solid black, gray, white or red and then they would purchase off the website the T-shirt with the Derby logo on it.

Ms. Nuzzo: Yeah. I mean, that's me personally. If everyone likes and let the kids wear what they want on those days, I'm okay with that too. That's just what I prefer.

Ms. Tovar: I think I'm more open to yes, on the pants. And we can offer that T-shirt for gym days but not restrict them. But say, a solid, red, white, black or gray T-shirt.

Dr. Conway: You're going to have a transition program. Students make those.

Ms. Tovar: Yes.

Mr. Gildea: Okay.

Ms. O'Hara: Can I just say something. Have we ever reopened talking about where families go buy their own shirts, like they do for Ansonia, they can go down and have the patch on. Are we going to open that up again?

Mr. Gildea: Rebecca, I think that's a great point to bring up. We always said we would bring that back up. I'm going to get to that in one second. So, I think we're all saying the same thing on physical education attire the way it is now. We're all good with that.

Dr. Conway: They can wear whatever gym clothing they want. Or do we want to have them buy specific colors and then buy the T-shirt from us?

Ms. Tovar: I'm more towards the second option.

Ms. O'Hara: The second option.

Ms. Nuzzo: Yeah.

Dr. Conway: Okay.

Mr. Gildea: And let's go to Rebecca's point. The school system had some concern with uniform, but you feel we got to a spot where the parents prefer to patch it on themselves that they can't?

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Dr. Conway: What Ansonia does is the parent brings the shirt to City Stitchers. City Stitchers puts on the Ansonia patch. So, it's the same patch.

Ms. O'Hara: Actually, Ansonia's is embroidered. Derby's is a patch.

Ms. Nuzzo: What does it cost for a patch to be put on?

Ms. O'Hara: Five dollars.

Dr. Conway: Five dollars.

Ms. O'Hara: What City Stitchers does is they embroider Ansonia's on it. It's white embroidery only. And it's on whatever shirt the people bring in. Derby's is a specific patch that we order and the patch is just sown on.

Ms. Nuzzo: If we start allowing people to purchase their own shirts, they're all going to be a different red or grays. White and black are going to be the same.

Ms. O'Hara: See, Ansonia didn't really care. They just do variations of blue. They didn't call it towards more being a uniform more just like school spirit that everybody has something that has Ansonia on the shirt. We're more like a uniform. That's why they get to do something like that. Also, up at the high school at Ansonia High School, they have the kids put like regular acrylic patches on some of the Ansonia shirts too.

Ms. Nuzzo: While I understand financial aspects of it too. This is brand new for us. So, have it all uniform, I've heard from some people over time and Ansonia has had it for so many years that whether they just got lenient or it's a battle they're not willing to fight anymore. That's why they do it the way that they do.

Ms. O'Hara: Right. They want it more just so you have the Ansonia logo on the shirt. It's more like that just showing you have Ansonia on your shirt.

Ms. Nuzzo: Yeah, this is brand new. I agree with Kim on the Derby Team just for a day. We're going in for a uniform, then I personally like aspect of it.

Ms. O'Hara: That's why we did it like that so you can only buy it through the school.

Dr. Conway: Back on used items. Some of these concerns might go away just buy the back. We'll have inventory of used items for people to pick up.

Ms. Tovar: I agree. I think that will help families as well.

Ms. O'Hara: I think we got the jackets down, the fleece jackets down to \$28.

Ms. Tovar: I bought three of them today at 30.

Ms. O'Hara: We're trying to get it lower. We don't make much money on it.

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Mr. Gildea: Anything else on the dress code? Doc, can you just talk about a future item give an overview.

BUS PATROL

Dr. Conway: Yeah, I got a call from AllStar today. Going to talk with Steve about where we were with cameras on the outside of the buses. And he reached out to the company that's now doing it in Connecticut, Bus Patrol. And Derby actually has been approved should be one of the communities for no cost to the City. No cost to AllStar to put them on all buses. So, it cost us nothing. The company makes their money off of proceeds off of tickets, which are 260 bucks and statutorily and the contract would be with the City not with the Board of Ed statutorily even though we contract for the buses. The way the legislature was written when it was written.

But if this committee is okay, I just want to expedite moving it forward because I would want our full Board not to vote on it but to agree to move it to the Board of Alderman for consideration because the contract would be with the Board of Alderman and the City, not with the Board of Ed. But we contract the buses. So, I just want to make sure that everybody would be okay with it on our end and then we would schedule to go to the Board of Alderman meeting in March.

Mr. Gildea: Again, I know it's not on our agenda but we have a COW Meeting tomorrow. So, if someone wants to make a motion recommending that the Derby School System pursue the camera grant for buses then Doc will put that on the agenda tomorrow.

Dr. Conway: If everybody is okay, I'll ask if we can add it to the agenda for tomorrow.

Ms. Tovar: I'm not 100 percent sure, but I think it's route 34 or Roosevelt Drive that keeps coming up in question. Have we choose that the bus route so that family does not have to cross the street and the bus moves around to their side of the street.

Dr. Conway: I'm not sure, maybe you can reach out to me and give me the address and check on it.

Ms. Tovar: Okay. I'll try to figure that out and reach out to you and we can follow up on that.

Motion that the Student Health and Safety Committee recommend that the Derby School System pursue the camera grant for buses. Passed with a motion made by Ms. Kim Tovar and a second by Ms. Rebecca O'Hara.
