

Good evening.

Let's call the meeting, Athletic Complex Building Committee meeting to order.

Say the Pledge. It's Wednesday, March 31st, 2021 at 6:09 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. McLiverty, here, sir. Mr. Able is absent. Mr. Bananto, absent. Ms. Gerckens, absent, Mr. Hyder, here. Mr. Mingle, absent. Mr. Netto, absent. Mr. O'Connell, absent.

Mr. Sill is excused.

Mr. Marcucio. He's here.

Mr. Olenoski, absent. Mr. DeFala, absent.

The record should reflect, we have three members present.

Anthony was ex officio, so what do we need for a quorum, four?

There's 11 members, so you need six.

We can proceed, we're not going to take any action.

Looks like Mr. Netto is going to come along. The record should reflect that Mr. Netto, are you in the meeting? Mr. Netto are you here? Mrs. Netto are you there, oh no.

Ms. Netto: Janine is here, John will be on in a minute.

Okay.

I see him coming in now, okay. Mr. Netto?

Mr. Netto: Yeah, sorry I'm late.

No problem. You're right on time. It's 5 o'clock somewhere. Don't worry. So Mr. Chair, there are four members present.

Mr. Marcucio: Did you get me, Keith?

Keith: Yes, sir. Okay. Mr. Secretary, can you bring up those pictures or no? So we're here to finalize the signage with Signs, Unlimited. I talked to him today, three drafts or mark ups of the signs we need. I want to go through them to make sure we have all the ones that we need. And if there's any more that we need or want, he can do them.

Mr. Chair, next item, public portion.

Mr. Chairman: Anyone from the public like to talk.

Tom Lionetti, I just wanted to personally thank Keith McLiverty today. I was at the field house, our new machines came in. We got a backpack and a stand-alone machine. Waiting for the disinfectant to come in. We'll be able to spray the lockers and kill any bacteria for this COVID. Keith worked on it for a while. I want to personally thank him. He did a great job.

Mr. Chairman: Thank you, Mr. Lionetti.

Motion to close the public portion.

Mr. Hyder: So moved.

Mr. Marcucio: Second.

Mr. Chair: Public portion is closed.

First item on agenda is to review the signage. This signage is where we named the different names of the field, of the facility, of the press box. I want to finalize these. Sign them of the ones Marc is going to show us. I want everyone to think about if there's anything missing. Second thing is a new sign, Mr. Sill brought up the concern that we have do's and don'ts. He thinks we should put a little sign that says, no dogs allowed, no animals allowed. Just those six words. So we can start the discussion with Marc.

Marc, if you can pull up the pictures that we have and go through these and either, agree yes, that's one we're making. If we're missing one, tell me which one we are missing.

When were they sent?

I emailed them to you as a Google file Friday.

I can email it to you again, hold on.

Dr. Conway: I can put them up Mr. Chairman if you'd like.

Mr. Chair: Yeah, go ahead.

Dr. Conway: I have them up now.

Mr. Marcucio: Keith, while we're waiting for that, we had little league tryouts over there a week ago Sunday, sign is down on the first base side of the baseball field. They cut the ties off or something. I don't know if they put it up. I know they were working over there yesterday and today. If they didn't, we have to put the sign back up.

Mr. Chair: That's the one that says do's and don'ts, Kenny.

Mr. Marcucio: Yeah.

Mr. Chair: Doc is putting up the sign that's the Red Clinch sign. Just to refresh everyone's memory, the understanding was all of the signs that we're going to talk about after this one we wanted them in this model. This wood, this script, this size fonts. Does everyone agree with that?

Yes.

Keith, didn't we make a list of all the signs and all the wordings and have a joint meeting for all of this?

Not the landmark signs. We just met. Remember we met with –

John: I remember when DeFala was in still charge, I thought he had a list of every sign and everyone everywhere.

Mr. Chair: Maybe. But Ed's the one that brought us these pictures one night at one of our meetings. Our meeting was already in place. He has them up at the yard. Dr. Conway had pictures. We talked about them. Now I want to get them done. And Espo is ready to do them. I want to make sure we capture the population.

John: I just don't want to miss anything, because I know the list was made but it was way back.

Mr. Chair: I'm just trying to lock it up and get these things done and up. If we missed one or two, that's why we are having this meeting tonight. Ed had these pictures. He took them in the yard. But these pictures are from Doc Conway. We'll go through them one at a time.

Do we agree that the format of the signs, we want them in the Red Clinch format, scripts, size, that whole thing?

I agree, yeah.

Mr. Chair: Bobbie.

Bobbie: The only think I have a concern with is the logo at the top above his name, that's a softball. Is there any way we have an arrowhead, an Indian head, something of that nature on some of them on the field?

Mr. Chair: Sure, we can put whatever logo we want. Doc, what would you want there, the D like in the center of the football field?

Dr. Conway: Yeah, the D is fine, whatever the Committee wants.

Mr. Chair: How about the D with the arrowhead?

Dr. Conway: Similar to what's on the center of the football field. We can keep the same design as the logo on the football field.

Yeah, it makes sense.

I like the uniform like that, yeah.

Okay. We're not going to recreate the Red Clinch one are we or are we just going to use that one?

I think that's already there on the walkway. Isn't that one already there on the walkway.

John: The walkway, I'm driving by it now.

Dr. Conway: No, I don't think so.

Wasn't there a sign on the walkway where the batting cage right before the field house, wasn't there a Red Clinch sign somewhere there.

No.

John: I don't see one here.

Mr. Chair: Doc, wasn't it mounted on the fence.

Dr. Conway: I don't recall.

Mr. Marcucio: There's nothing over there. None of the signs are up.

None of the signs that you have in your pictures are up. They're all in the shed at Public Works.

So Red Clinch's too.

Yes, sir.

Mr. Chair: So Robbie, same font, colors, then we'll put the different logo, the D with the arrowhead in.

That's a good idea.

So let's go through them. The first one is what do we do with this Pavilion. And do we do with it and where would we put it?

Mr. Marcucio: We'd have to put it near the concession stand.

Do we want it in the ground near the Red Clinch sign or mounted to the building?

Mr. Marcucio: I think mounted to the building, near the concession stand, if there's room there.

Mr. Chair: Is everyone okay with that?

Yeah.

Mr. Chair: So the Pavillion sign would be mounted to the building and then we would have it redone in the format of the Red Clinch.

Yes.

Next one, Doc. Leo F. Ryan Athletic Complex.

Mr. Marcucio: That's going to go up on the bank, near the Pavilion, right. Near the fieldhouse rather.

Is that where we want it?

Mr. Marcucio: That's where we said it would go in the meeting.

Mr. Chair: We agreed in the Red Clinch format, right.

Mr. Marcucio: Yeah, that would be fine.

Dr. Conway: This is in front of the fieldhouse right now.

Okay. That's on the flagpole.

Mr. Marcucio: Somebody took the flag down today. I guess they're going to put a new one.

Ed: I took it down this afternoon, it was torn. It wasn't proper to display. I'll put the new one up tomorrow.

Mr. Marcucio: Okay.

Dr. Conway: Thanks, Ed.

Mr. Chair: Like Mr. Marcucio said, the Leo F. Ryan Athletic Complex sign was going to go in that grass area by the fieldhouse because it would be pretty much in the middle of the baseball field, football field and the field house.

Mr. Marcucio: The whole complex, yeah.

Awesome.

Dr. Conway: I believe there is a Leo F. Ryan sign. If you want a picture of that exact lettering that matches the Clinch lettering when you're coming up by the library. Fairly new and probably done by Signs Unlimited. The exact same design as the Red Clinch.

Mr. Marcucio: This one has been there quite a while. The one that you see now is where Charlie Dicenso's. That driveway there was dedicated to Charlie.

It was a street sign like we have all the streets in Town.

Mr. Marcucio: That's right. It was a street sign.

Do you want to make the sign like the Red Clinch, or is that too much?

Mr. Marcucio: It's up to you guys. Where would we put it?

It would be right in that grass island area, go right to the visitor's left. There's a snapshack. There's like a grass island in there.

John: I'm here now. If you want to look at my camera you can tell me where to go.

Mr. Marcucio: It would actually be --

John: That's the concession stand.

Do we want to put the street sign in the parking lot, where the handicap parking is?

Mr. Marcucio: We can put that right on the corner there, where they go into the parking lot. They had all trees too, the little bushes, with the street sign on it facing towards the football field.

John: There's a lot of little areas for signs.

John, right where you're walking there's a little grass patch. That little grass patch. That might be a good spot for it.

John: I think the one where the pole is. That island. That's where he's talking about right there.

Yes. Where the garbage can is now.

John: If you put it there, it's kind of wide open.

Right in the middle of that in the patch.

Mr. Chair: We agree for a sign, Charlie Dicenso's, Charlie's Way.

Couldn't it be posted near the light pole.

Remember, Esposito is going to go out there and look at these. I'll put light pole mount. If he wants to change it he can come back to the Committee.

John: I guess I can get a screen shot here.

Mr. Chair: Doc, what's the other one? John, you look so happy. This is Cirillo. I remember a Cirillo sign had his nickname in the middle.

It had Midge in the middle. That was a white football. I don't know what happened to that one. That might have gone away I'm calling this the new press box. There was an older one there before this one was redone.

Mr. Marcucio: Are you planning to put this on the press box?

We were talking about a roof mount versus mounting it. If we mount it to the press box and it's red, it might get lost in the red press box.

John: What about on the dirt underneath it, it's kind of empty. Plus up high, it's going to block the view, if you put it lower, it's not in anybody's way, not touch the base.

Mr. Chair: Either way it's a sign like Kenny's and we'll have it mounted on the hill.

John: On the hill, yeah. Even if we put it top third of the hill there.

Then they can put some of those solar garden lights.

Dr. Conway: Thanks, great idea.

That Lou DeFilippo Football Field, that's on the scoreboard now, we're not going to redo that one?

Mr. Chair: I didn't think we were doing that one, what's the pleasure of the Committee.

It was on the scoreboard prior to the renovations.

Mr. Marcucio: Scoreboard or press box.

On the scoreboard.

Mr. Marcucio: You're talking about Lou DeFilippo.

Yeah.

Mr. Marcucio: They had that one on the scoreboard. I'm not sure about the new one. When it was dedicated, it was the old score board on the right side.

Right. The current one his name is on it.

Mr. Marcucio: It is.

Dr. Conway: The current one has it on it because I think we replicated the old one.

John: The baseball scoreboard is peeling all the stickers off of it.

Mr. Marcucio: It makes a loud noise when I walk by.

John: Why is it humming when it's not being used?

Dr. Conway: Which one is humming the football or the baseball?

John: The baseball. It's peeling and it always hums. I heard it when I was walking by.

Mr. Marcucio: Personally, I think we should keep Lou's sign on the press box also. He meant a lot to this Town.

Yeah, I agree.

Maybe not on the press box, but right where John said in front of the press box. I don't know if we can somehow connect the two signs. The Cirillo press box and the Lou DeFilippo Field.

John: There's enough room for two signs. It would look nice if you filled it in with something. It would actually kill an eye sore. It's the perfect spot for like whatever you are going to call this place.

Mr. Marcucio: They put out plants there. Are they going to come up this year or what?

John: These things are weights. I think the ones we're looking at is three or four feet above the ground. As long as the stuff in front of it doesn't grow up. You can put whatever you want behind it.

Mr. Chair: I think the bushes that were planted there are ground level. I don't think they're going to grow tall.

John: You can put two signs there. I think there's plenty of room. And it would look better than it does now.

Mr. Chair: They'd have to be bigger than the one we have for Red Clinch though. The football would have to be half the size of the one that's in this picture of the one we're looking at now.

John: We know the style we like, we know the colors, we know the font. What do you think is a good size there? Because he does it all the time.

Mr. Marcucio: The DeFilippo sign has to somehow be bigger than the Cirillo sign.

Right.

John: That's what he does. He'll probably design us something that looks good. But it's the perfect spot to put two signs. But it's the perfect spot to put two signs.

Mr. Chair: Mr. Marcucio, didn't the scoreboard have a name back in the day?

Mr. Marcucio: Lou's name.

I don't remember who's name it was on it. I'd have to go back and look at old pictures.

John: Abarella.

That's right, John. It was the Abarella scoreboard.

Mr. Marcucio: At that time, yeah. I'm not sure who paid for the scoreboard. The newer scoreboard from the old field, was actually donated by Coke. We didn't have to pay a penny for that.

Abarella. They bought that scoreboard. I was on the Committee back then.

The old scoreboard.

Yeah.

But the old, old, one. Not the most recent one that we have on the complex. I know the one from when I was in high school said Abarella on it.

Mr. Marcucio: I don't think they transferred it to the new one.

Yeah.

I think the only reason why the Abarella was on there was because they bought the scoreboard. I don't think you have to put one on another scoreboard.

Okay.

The Cirillo press box too. I think they paid for it.

Exactly right.

If you're going to put up all your signs up, that's all right with me.

John: I'd like to go through the minutes and see what was done at that last time we talked about this. I know we went through all of these signs at least which ones we were keeping.

Mr. Chair: We're doing it now.

John: Yeah, but I don't want to miss anything.

Mr. Chair: We're not. We're going to go through them, make our list and we'll double check.

John: Yeah. I'm over by the baseball scoreboard.

Mr. Marcucio: Whoever is talking is breaking up on my computer.

Doc, do you have the next sign.

Dr. Conway: That was it. I just said those five signs.

Mr. Marcucio: We only said those five.

Mr. Chair: So Cirillo is the one that's going to go. Then we'll put, Lou DeFilippo is the other one that's going to go on the hill. Can anyone think of any others?

John: Wasn't the visitor locker room named something too? Remember that sign that was over there?

Mr. Chair: I don't remember that one.

John: These things came out of the woodwork. I'm like, holy cow, that's named too. The old, old concession stand. Something was over by the old, old, concession stand. There was a sign up there and we didn't even know it was named anything until someone brought it up at that meeting.

Rob: Yeah, I remember that. I'm glad you're saying that, John. The smaller concession stand. There was a concession stand on the corner by the field. Then there was a garage. Then there was a smaller concession stand by the bathrooms in the back. That was the visitor locker room.

John: Right, the visitor locker room had some name on it, I think.

We can check on that one.

Was it the visitor's locker room, Rob or was it the snack stand?

Rob: I think the sign was inside the snack stand above the door.

John: We wouldn't have known, if someone didn't say because that was the visitor's locker room that was named, I know I wouldn't know.

Dennis was supposed to be on. I just texted him to see if he's coming because he would know it.

Mr. Marcucio: That visitor's locker room shouldn't have any name on it. It's one of the worst ones in the league for years. It was right next to you can see all the gas in there from the lawn mowers.

Yeah, I remember that.

Home field advantage, Kenny.

Mr. Marcucio: Yeah, I guess.

Marc: Can I ask a question, my curiosity is killing me here? So the field is Payden Field, right?

It's Payden Park.

Dr. Conway: It's Payden Park.

But it's also the Lou Ryan Complex. The Leon Ryan Complex.

Mr. Marcucio: That's sign we're going to have in the middle right near the field house.

Marc: What's dedicated to Red Clinch now?

The softball field.

Mr. Marcucio: The softball field.

Which is also the baseball field.

Mr. Marcucio: I thought we were going to put it somewhere on the fence though.

Yes.

Mr. Marcucio: Past the pitching cage there.

When you go from your house, on the left is my understanding.

Mr. Marcucio: We were going to put that one, attach it right to the fence.

But can we go back to Marc Garofalo's question. I want us to talk it all out. So it's the Leo Ryan Athletic Complex, the Payden what?

Payden Park, the Complex, the Baseball Field.

Mr. Marcucio: And it's the Lou DeFilippo Football Field.

And it's the Red Clinch Softball Field.

Mr. Marcucio: Red Clinch Softball.

Marc: To me that doesn't sound clear. So is it Payden Park or Payden Field?

Park.

Dr. Conway: Hey guys, Dennis is on the phone. So we can ask him any questions you need to.

Let's finish what Marc's saying.

Marc: I've not been involved. I was just curious.

Mr. Chair: No, no, no. Let's talk it through.

Marc: I thought it was the baseball field was named after the lady that paid for it.

Mr. Marcucio: It was named Payden Park, yeah. Before the new facility was put there, it was the Lou DeFilippo Football Field. It was the main complex, the whole thing. The softball field and the baseball field.

Marc: Ken, you're talking like I wasn't around. I know what it was. I'm just trying to understand like what is the Clinch thing?

Mr. Marcucio: They named the softball field after Clinch before we put the new field up.

Marc: I understand that. So is it Payden Park or Clinch Park?

Mr. Marcucio: It's Payden Park, right, Doc.

Dr. Conway: The name of the park, kind of just like the Leo F. Ryan Athletic Complex, and then you have Lou DeFilippo Field, you'd have Payden Park and then you have the Red Clinch Softball Field.

Marc: So it's the Ryan Complex, Payden Park, Clinch Field.

Dr. Conway: No, the softball field is the Red Clinch Softball Field. The Park itself for the baseball field, is Payden Park. The entire complex is Leo F. Ryan Athletic Complex. And then you have Lou DeFilippo Football Field.

Marc: But that field is when they throw the little balls. Not the ones that look like Easter eggs.

Dr. Conway: It's Payden Park.

Marc: So Payden Park and Clinch Field.

Dr. Conway: Payden Park and then within Payden Park is the Red Clinch Softball Field.

Marc: But what about when they're playing baseball.

Dr. Conway: The entire field is called Payden Park. So you're playing in Payden Park on the Red Clinch Softball Field.

Rob: Marc, the best way for me to clarify this is the Oakland A's playing Alameda County Stadium and the name of their field is Ricky Henderson Field. So it's a Ricky Henderson Field at Alameda County Stadium. So now this is going to be Red Clinch Field at Payden Park.

Marc: Rob, so is it part of Ryan Complex or not?

Rob: Yes.

Mr. Marcucio: It's all Ryan Complex is the main complex.

Rob: The whole thing is the Ryan Complex.

Mr. Marcucio: Ryan Complex it's the whole thing. Inside of Ryan Complex, you have the Lou DeFilippo Football Field. On the other side, you have Payden Park. Lou DeFilippo is inside Ryan, Red Clinch is inside Payden, but they're altogether in Ryan. Ryan is the main complex. Just like Norwich Field has Nolan and they built that off into different names also.

Rob: So it's Red Clinch Field at Payden Park at the Leo F. Ryan Athletic Complex.

Marc, are you suggesting another sign.

Marc: I'm not suggesting anything. I'm just trying to figure out if you can explain it with a straight face.

Dr. Conway: I think Mr. Hyder used a good example. And when you think about Leo F. Ryan Complex, that's a good example with the Lou DeFilippo Field as well.

Marc: Right. But it sounds like an unnatural where dangling participle where we're saying that it's part of this complex of this park of this field. I'm just clarifying.

Dennis: It will sound better. But when people are looking for the softball field, they'll never understand unless they live here. It will sound right, but everyone will be looking for a third field.

Mr. Marcucio: Yeah, I'm sure the High School did a Payden Park with the softball and baseball. They're not going to put Clinch.

Dr. Conway: Dennis would like to say something.

Dennis: You're never going to see Red Clinch Field on any schedule, I believe. It's always going to be Payden Park. Do you understand what I mean?

Mr. Marcucio: Yeah.

Dennis: We're only going to have a sign dedicated to Red. Again, he's not going to show up on anybody's schedule. You're not going to see Red Clinch's name anywhere on them. And that's just how it is. It's going to say Payden Park for every ball game, boys, girls on that field. We're going to have Red Clinch's sign facing left field, facing one way.

Marc: But if they're playing a softball game, it's not going to say Red Clinch Field, it's going to say Payden.

Dennis: You can say whatever you want. Red Clinch Field at Payden Park. For a softball game. It's probably going to be one time, right.

Dr. Conway: Like on the CIAC website Chairman, we could have whatever we want on the CIAC red signs as Dennis just said. So it could say the Red Clinch Softball field at Payden Park for all softball games.

Mr. Marcucio: That would be up to the Athletic Director to make sure that they know how we want it listed.

Dr. Conway: Correct.

Rob: Dennis, do you remember the name inside the visitor locker?

Dr. Conway: Dennis, do you remember the name inside the visitor locker room?

Dennis: I'm not familiar with a name inside our visitor's locker room. Do you have any names so we can clarify as to what that might be?

Mr. Marcucio: No, we don't.

Marc: That might be a pop warner thing.

Dennis: Not a Jimmy Mascolo. Well, maybe. He has a room at the little league field house. It's not him. Would we dedicate the visitor's locker room to somebody? I can't imagine if we ever did that.

Rob: It could have been named somebody at public works because that was used as an equipment room and a storage room as well.

Dennis: Public Works have their place. Again, concession stand was Silvio Mastrianni.

Dr. Conway: Yes, we have that sign actually.

Marc: It wasn't at a high school or a Parks and Rec thing. It was something outside of the high school.

Mr. Chair: So we have those signs. That's enough to get Espo doing the specs, and scaling them and drawing them and then coming back. I just want to get them done.

Yeah, I agree, yeah.

I want to get these going and we'll do the digging in the next couple of days.

That works.

Mr. Chair: What's everyone's thought on a little sign, white with black letters, maybe 8 to 10 inches long and it says no animals or no dogs on it close to where you walk into parts of the field or by the gate on the high school side. They're not reading these all the do's and don'ts. There's a lot of dogs going on the field. Put a little sign clipped to the fence that says, no dogs allowed.

I think it's a good idea to be honest with you.

It might read three or four words, they're not reading 20.

Do the picture with a dog through it.

All right. What's the take, everyone okay with him doing those little signs.

Yes.

We don't have a quorum. So we'll do those little signs say, no dogs allowed.

Good.

Dr. Conway, did we ever get those signs for the public during baseball and football and track practice.

Dr. Conway: They went up last Monday.

Marc, how do you want to do Executive Session. Town Clerk?

Dr. Conway: Chairman McLiverty, I don't recall, I know for the other Committee, we might have done these for both committees, we established the number for a quorum instead of a majority for a quorum given the size of the committee and the difficulty for everybody to always make meetings. I don't recall the process. I don't know if we did this for this Committee as well, we have five.

Johnny, Kenny, me, Hyder, Dennis. If we get Ronnie Doc, we're good. I thought we needed six.

Mr. Marcucio: If I get Ronnie Sill, want me to get him on. We need you for a quorum. He's hoping on now.

Okay. Marc, when Ronnie gets on, can you get us into Executive Session.

Marc: Yes. Are you going to vote on the signs?

Mr. Chair: We can wait for Ronnie and then vote, sure. Johnnie, we'll vote on these and if there's any others, we'll come back to the Committee.

I got you. I have one glaring question. I don't know if I should ask in Executive.

Executive session is litigation, pending litigation. So I would wait.

No, last time we did the signs and stuff, we needed the joint meeting because they got rid of our signs the last time. How come this isn't a joint meeting? I don't care. I don't want to have the other Committee come back and say, we don't like that.

Mr. Chair: Doc, help me. They weren't at the meeting when we did the signs on the Football Field, were they?

Dr. Conway: Certainly not for the football field. I think we've always been adamant that any sign that was up previously was going back up.

Yes, I agree.

Dr. Conway: I appreciate that, John.

We're just copying their signage. John, on our project, just copying the font and the size and the color.

Mr. Marcucio: Ron Sill is on.

John: I get it. I just want to clarify now. We just need to make sure that nothing is going to change.

Mr. Marcucio: I don't think it was a joint meeting when we had a meeting a long time ago about the signage.

Mr. Chair: We had the joint when we did the do's and don't signs. But not the signage for the Lou DeFilippo or Leo Ryan or Cirillo. But I know John's concern is that they're going to have something to say about it.

We have a Red Clinch sign, am I right?

Dr. Conway: Yes.

We're not getting a new Red Clinch sign.

No.

That's fairly new.

Dr. Conway: Correct.

Okay.

So Ronnie, we just did a quick review of the signs that we're going to have Esposito scale and do samples of. I'll go through them. Motion to proceed with the understanding that there may be additional signs that if we missed, we'll get to the minutes and we'll figure them out. We're adding no dogs allowed signs on each of the entrance ways around the track.

Can I have a motion to proceed with Sign's Unlimited for the following signs to be made in the same format, color scheme, font as the Red Clinch Sign. One, Mastrianna Pavilion. Two, The Leo Ryan Complex, Three, Charlie Dicenso's Way, Charlie's Way, Four, Cirillo Press Box, Five, Lou DeFilippo Field. And then to add small signs saying, no dogs allowed. On all of these, the Red Clinch font, color scheme and format would be the same except the Logo will be the D with the arrowhead replacing the logo that's on the Red Clinch sign.

Mr. Hyder: I'll make that in the form of a motion.

Mr. Marcucio: I'll second.

Mr. Chair: Any discussion. Sorry, Doc.

Dr. Conway: I'm not part of this vote, but I do just want to, I know we talked about it before, if we can just make sure that the wording for the Leo F. Ryan Complex the same on both signs. I know in the past, I don't know the history of what the original name was. I think we should go back and make sure if it's either Athletic Complex or Sports Complex, whichever one it's supposed to be. But it is in multiple places different ways. I'm not sure what the original dedication was. But I think it's worth it to find the original wording and stick with the original wording Athletic or Sports Complex.

Kenny probably knows this. I don't think it was ever a complex. It was Leo F. Ryan Field. It became a complex, but it was already named. Am I right, Ken? Leo F. Ryan Field.

Mr. Marcucio: Initially it was, but it became known as a complex as they put other names inside the complex itself.

If I'm not mistaken, they changed it to a complex after they named the football field after Coach Lou.

Mr. Marcucio: Yeah, right.

It probably had older signs. And then the newer ones said complex.

Mr. Marcucio: The football field was a DeFilippo field. And the whole complex was the Ryan complex.

Yeah.

But I think Dr. Conway is saying is it Athletic or Sports. We'll go back in the minutes and look.

Thank you.

With the understanding for that sign, any other questions. Discussions. All in favor. Any opposed. Motion carries.

Executive Session with Committee Members and invite Dr. Conway for discussion of for purposes of pending litigation with Turko. There'll be no action coming out of that, sir.

Marc: Time is 7 o'clock.

Mr. Hyder, you had a question.

Dr. Conway: I have Jack Dellapiano is on the call with us tonight. He's a 093 candidate who is doing an internship with the district this year. If the Committee is okay, he has been joining us in Executive Sessions for our Board of Ed meetings, but I perfectly understand given the discussion that's going to take place in Executive Session, if you decide otherwise.

Mr. Chair: I have no problem with it. It's good learning experience. We only deal with New Yorker's like this once in a lifetime, so.

Dr. Conway: I appreciate that, Mr. Chairman.

Is the Committee okay with him joining us?

Yes, absolutely.

Mr. Chair: So Doc.

Definitely, he should join.

Mr. Chair: Mr. Garofalo, how do you coordinate this sir?

Marc: I'm going to pause the recording right now and I am going to put the other members in the waiting room. Again, I believe the motion was that there is no action coming out of Executive Session. But when you're done with Executive Session, we'll put the tape on and note the time and adjourn the meeting.

Okay. Do you have the person on this as Dr. Conway's 093?

Marc: Yes, just hold on. I'm just going to pause. Go ahead it's 7:12 and the meeting is called back to regular session.
