Mr. Herron states Nailers Way relocation project is out to bid. Northwood has vacated all operations out of OVMC campus. Raze International, under Original Propositions, is for the demolition the Chase Building on Market Street. There is a 10 days' notice that must be given to the WVDEP before work can begin. The project in total is estimated to be 90-100 days and in order to stay on schedule Mr. Herron is asking for two reads. Mr. Sklavounakis cites concerns about no written agreement with developer. Mr. Herron assures there needs to be before we can sell bonds. Bonds will provide safe guards for holders and the city. Mr. Herron states 19th St. property has been abated and demolition will begin soon.
